6 robbers posing as cops held

With the arrest of six men, the south district police has busted a gang of highway robbers who committed robberies by impersonating policemen and sales tax officers.

Robbed property worth Rs 12 lakh, two police uniforms, arms and a Maruti van used in crime have been recovered from their possession.

DCP (south) HGS Dhaliwal said Rajesh (48), the gang leader, Jagbir (42), Rajender (35), Rafique (30), Mohd Khalid (22), Rajji Ahmad (19) and the receiver of stolen property Bajrangi Yadav (40) were arrested from south Delhi's Mahipalpur yesterday.

They wore police uniforms and intercepted trucks during night. They threatened the drivers and sometimes beat them up before fleeing with their truck.

Eight held for swiping out crores

The Powai police on Monday claimed to have busted a major credit card racket with the arrests of eight persons, including a direct sales agent of a firm that offered services to a private bank.

The agent allegedly provided the racketeers with information of the cards of NRIs and business people, especially those who used their cards sparingly, like once in six months.

The racketeers allegedly first committed the fraud in 2008, when they used four credit cards of four NRIs to steal Rs 1.2 crore. Investigators suspect that the eight later used another five to seven cards. They were arrested on May 27 after one of the banks, the Powai branch of Axis Bank, grew suspicious.

Diarrhoea spreads across Chennai

Cyclone Laila did not batter the city, but the rains that came with it have triggered a significant rise in cases of acute diarrhoeal disorders (ADD) across the city. At least 790 persons, including 160 from mofussil areas, have been admitted to the Chennai Corporation-run Communicable Diseases Hospital (CDH) in Tondiarpet in the last seven days and one death has been reported.

The cases started trickling in since May 23, days after Laila moved closer to the city's coastline. But Sunday last was the worst, with a record number of people with ADD symptoms thronging CDH. The records show at least 133 cases were from the city (a majority from Chintadripet) and another 21 from mofussil areas in Tiruvallur and Kancheepuram districts. Private hospitals also reported a large number of ADD cases in the last few days.

Jharkhand heading for President's rule

Jharkhand appears to be heading for a spell of President's rule. Governor M.O.H. Farooq sent a report to the Centre on Monday, highlighting the political instability and lack of interest among parties to form an alternative government.

With Chief Minister and Jharkhand Mukti Morcha leader Shibu Soren resigning on Sunday night — his government was reduced to a minority after the Bharatiya Janata Party withdrew support to it — the State faces political instability yet again. Mr. Soren quit as he was not able to muster the sufficient number ahead of a trust vote in the Assembly.

Strong 6.4-magnitude quake strikes Andaman Islands:

A strong 6.4-magnitude earthquake hit off Andaman Islands early Tuesday, seismologists said, but no widespread tsunami was expected.

The quake struck at a depth of 127 kilometres (80 miles), said the US Geological Survey (USGS), with the epicentre 120 kilometres from Port Blair on the Andaman Islands, which are located in the Bay of Bengal.

The Hawaii-based Pacific Tsunami Warning Center said there was a very small possibility of a local tsunami near the centre but no threat of a destructive widespread tsunami. Myanmar lies to the north of the Andaman Islands and Indonesia to the south.

72-hr bandh paralyses normal life in Upper Assam

Normal life was paralyzed in six districts of Upper Assam following a 72-hour bandh called by the All Tai Ahom Students' Union.

The bandh, which began at 5 am today, has been called in protest against inclusion of Ahom-dominated areas in tribal council areas of different communities like Deori, Thengal Kachari and Sonowal Kacharis, where council polls are scheduled on June six.

The affected districts are Jorhat, Sibsagar, Golaghat, Dibrugarh, Tinsukia and Lakhimpur.

All educational institutions, financial services and private offices remained closed while attendance in government offices was thin. Road traffic was disrupted due to blockades at different places on NH-37, though rail traffic was not affected as trains were running as per schedule.

Operations at the Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Limited were also affected as employees were unable to reach the plants in different places of upper Assam. There has been no report of any untoward incidents from any part of the state.

Gunmen attack hospital in Lahore, kill 12

At least 12 people were killed and several others injured when a group of militants stormed a hospital in this eastern Pakistani city in an apparent bid to free a terrorist who was captured in an injured condition during an attack last week.

Four to six militants entered the emergency ward of the Jinnah Hospital shortly before midnight and fired indiscriminately, officials said. Javed Akram, chief executive of the hospital, said a dozen people were killed and several others injured in the attack.
