### **Ayodhya verdict keeps city on the edge**

The Ayodhya verdict couldn't have come at a worse time for Delhi Police. The force is already overstretched because of Commonwealth Games, haunted by the fear of a terrorist strike. And ahead of the festival season, with the city playing host to so many foreign guests, it's imperative to ensure that peace is maintained.

The cops, already in a state of alert, moved swiftly on Thursday. As a first step, the cops identified and issued a stern warning to potential trouble-makers in different parts of the city. A thick security blanket has been thrown around the capital with special focus on north-east, central, east and south Delhi. More than 60 companies, comprising of around 10,000 policemen, have been deployed in different parts of the capital. Additional security has been deployed at the RSS office in Jhandewalan and the BJP headquarters on Ashoka Road.

While there is so far no indication that trouble is brewing, the cops will be extra cautious on Friday as namaaz is offered. Special orders have gone out to the districts for maintaining extra vigil and guarding places of worship. Beat patrolling in all these areas has been intensified and PCR vans have been asked to frequently patrol the areas if they are not attending to calls.

### **City on alert; Prohibitory order for TV channels**

On the eve of the much-awaited verdict of the Ayodhya title suit by the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court, the Mumbai police issued a prohibitory order under Section 144 to DTH service operators, asking them not to telecast any footage or news item that may disturb communal harmony.

In the Mumbai order, Sheela Sail, deputy commissioner (enforcement) of Mumbai Police, asked the DTH operators to "ensure that no adverse, negative, inflammatory news item, commentary or the coverage or any speculation of the judgment regarding the Ayodhya issue before its pronounced or visual depicting the celebration or the protest after the judgment is pronounced in respect of Ayodhya case or the footage regarding the demolition of Babri masjid is telecast or relayed.

### **Schools, IT industry play it safe**

Hectic television coverage in the run-up to the Ayodhya verdict had its effect on several schools and offices on Thursday. The IT sector observed a semi-bandh about two hours ahead of the verdict.

Some offices took the cue from the high-security blanket that the state had been put under since Wednesday evening. The state's IT sector, weary of political disturbances and bandhs, played it safe too. IT biggies PWC, IBM and Wipro showed the way by shutting shop around 1.30pm. Soon, the others followed suit and smaller companies like Metalogic Systems closed for the day.

### **Cholera incidence second highest in Kolkata: Study**

A recent collaborative study on prevalence of cholera in cities of seven developing countries has found Kolkata with the second highest incidence of the disease. Epidemiologists say most diarrhoea cases in the city are triggered by cholera.

The study mapping improvised regions of the world concluded that Beira in Mozambique ranks first in the Cholera chart ahead of Kolkata and Jakarta in Indonesia. National Institute of Cholera and Enteric Diseases (NICED), Kolkata, was a partner in the study that was conducted with International Vaccine Institute, Seoul.

A good number of diarrhoea cases in Kolkata are due to cholera. Contaminated water, poor sanitation and hygiene are responsible for this problem.

### **Banks urged to strengthen security infrastructure**

Commissioner of Police T. Rajendran on Thursday called for strengthening security infrastructure in banks and ATMs. Laying emphasis on the creation of a Standard Operating Procedure for private agencies employed by banks for security and other purposes, he said periodic review of security arrangements was imperative.

We have called for the installation of surveillance cameras in all bank branches and ATMs... one camera should be fixed outside the bank. Of the 1,680 ATMs in Chennai district, only 1,326 have cameras. More than 1,300 ATMs have no security guard, Urging the deployment of trained security guards, the Commissioner said some ATMs had night watchmen who worked elsewhere during the day. Firm implementation of the 'Know Your Customer' norms would help curb fake accounts. He said the security requirements of the branch, ATM, locker, cash transportation and personnel should be borne in mind while drafting the SOP.

### **City remains calm, but bandobast to continue**

No untoward incidents were reported in the city following the Allahabad High Court verdict on the Ayodhya title suits on Thursday. However, the police will maintain bandobast for another 72 hours, police commissioner Meeran Chadha Borwankar said.

The police have taken precautionary measures to avert any untoward incidents, Borwankar said. However, refusing to divulge details, she said that the special branch headed by deputy commissioner of police Makarand Ranade had received vital information (about some trouble brewing up) but timely action had helped them control the situation.

The police had taken preventive action against 1,361 criminals and trouble-makers. The action included detaining a person or releasing them on a good behaviour bond or warning them not to create trouble.

#### 2 NRIs duped of Rs 135 lakh

Rajinder Bhateja, a former branch manager of a famous Bank, Sector 9, Chandigarh, on the pretext of giving higher rate of interest to NRIs, cheated an account holder of Rs 50 lakh. The NRI woman, Chandani Gautam, who was staying abroad, came to know about the fraud when she checked her account statement on her return to India.

After investigating the complaint of the woman, a case under Sections 420, 409, 465, 467, 468 and 471 of the IPC was registered at the Matour police station. Parul Kishore, manager of ICICI Bank, Phase VII, in a complaint to the police, stated that the NRI woman had an account with their branch.

But the cheat lured the NRI to open her account with the Bank at a higher rate of interest. When the woman stated that she would transfer the funds on returning to India after a year, Bhateja opened an account in the name of Gautam on the basis of forged documents.

While the woman was away, Bhateja issued a cheque with forged signatures of Gautam and transferred the money into the bogus account with the Bank. The funds were transferred in May 11 last year.

In a similar case, the cheat duped another Kharar-based NRI of Rs 85 lakh by opening a bogus account in April. When the Kharar case was detected, Bhateja was expelled from the bank. Since then the expelled branch manager has gone into hiding.

### **Ayodhya Case Verdict: Jammu region remains peaceful**

As the Lucknow Bench of the Allahabad High Court delivered its verdict on the Ram Janambhoomi case yesterday afternoon, people maintained peace and communal harmony and no untoward incident was reported from anywhere in the Jammu region.

The city had already been turned into a fortress in view of the BJP's call for a Jammu bandh against the eight-point initiative of the Central government.

A large number of security personnel were deployed in the city.

Earlier, there were apprehensions of a breach of the peace at some prominent locations and adequate security arrangements were made at both Tawi bridges.

Special security arrangements were made outside all religious places, including the Raghunath Temple. The city wore a deserted look and only a few vehicles were plying. As the details of the verdict started appearing on national news channels in the evening, the security forces were also alerted.

However, the situation was peaceful in Jammu, Kathua, Samba, Rajouri and Poonch districts.

### **Curfew back in major Valley towns**

A day after a semblance of normal life, curfew restrictions were reimposed on all major towns of the Kashmir valley yesterday, except Pulwama and Shopian towns. The restrictions were reimposed as the APHC-Geelani, spearheading the ongoing agitation against the series of killings, had called for a shutdown yesterday.

### **Crude bomb explodes at Nyay Mandir in Nagpur**

Tension gripped the district court premises after a crude bomb went off on Thursday afternoon in a bar room. The bomb exploded right about the time the Ayodhya verdict was to be delivered, leaving the Old treasury bar room shaken with the loud bang that shattered windows and left a cloud of dust and smoke in the room. No one was hurt in the incident.

Though cops tried to play down the blast, labelling it as a 'sutli' (crude) bomb, the incident cannot be played down, since the court had been on terror watch since terrorists executed three blasts at a court in Uttar Pradesh in 2007. The crude bomb appears to have been attached under the table of advocate Ujjwala Nandeshwar, who had left the room with a junior at 2.30pm, about an hour before the blast. There were around 15-20 advocates in the room when the blast took place. The bomb, stuffed with gunpowder, was probably tied with strings and wrapped in a newspaper dated August 19.

#### **Nato copters intrude into Pakistan, kill 3 soldiers**

A Nato helicopter attacked a Pakistani border post near Afghanistan on Thursday, killing three troops, security officials in Pakistan said. Later, government officials said they were ordered to stop trucks carrying supplies for international forces from entering Afghanistan at a major border crossing.

he accusations and the fallout are likely to exacerbate tensions between Islamabad and Washington, which is struggling to beat back a resurgent Taliban movement in the 9-year-old Afghan war. Over the weekend, Nato choppers fired on targets in Pakistan, killing several alleged insurgents they had pursued over the border from Afghanistan.

Islamabad protested the intrusion into its territory that has inflamed already pervasive anti-American sentiments among Pakistanis.
