Share broker held for Rs 12 lakh fraud

A 32-year-old share broker was nabbed by Ellisbridge police station officials from Mumbai on Thursday night in connection with a cheating case of Rs 12.37 lakh. Primary investigations have revealed that Mitesh Thakkar had used the same modus operandi to cheat at least three other people to siphon off Rs 26 lakh in last year.

Bhavna Parekh, a resident of Dalal Estate in Paldi, filed a complaint at Ellisbridge police station on April 6 against Thakkar, who lives in Simandhar Society in Vastrapur. She mentioned in the complaint that Thakkar had lured her to invest in the stock market, assuring her good returns. Parekh trusted his glib talk and handed him cheques worth Rs 4.37 lakh out of her savings.

Parekh came to know about the fraud after she discovered that the company which Thakkar was proposing to have an IPO was not at all listed. When Parekh and her family pursued the matter, he first told that his father was ill and on next day, he was gone. Three cheques of Rs 1,000 were altered by him. He had simply written 25, 27 and 28 ahead of the figures on the cheque and withdrew Rs 8 lakh from the account.

Inter-district Recruitment, Shutdown in Jammu region

A complete bandh was observed in the Jammu region on Friday in protest against the Inter-district Recruitment Bill with all markets, local transport, business establishments, most of the private schools and other educational institutions remaining closed.

However, the bandh passed peacefully and no untoward incident was reported from any part of the region. The bandh call was given by the BJP and supported by various political and social organisations, which were against the controversial Bill.

The functioning of government offices, already hit by the employees' strike, was affected adversely due to the bandh as attendance was very thin.

Even public transportation, including minibuses, also remained off the roads and passengers had to face a lot of problems.

Employees strike hits schools, hospitals in valley

As the strike of state government employees entered its fifth day yesterday, work in government offices was paralysed across the state.

The functioning of schools and hospitals was also adversely affected.

The offices in the Kashmir valley remained closed for the seventh day as a faction of the Employees Joint Action Committee (EJAC) had been on strike since Saturday last in support of their demands.

The demands include the payment of Sixth Pay Commission arrears, raising the retirement age and regularising the services of contractual employees. The week-long strike called by the Joint Consultative Committee (JCC), which is spearheading the agitation, was already extended by two days up to April 13. Its leader Khursheed Alam had welcomed the government's offer of talks, but, so far, there has been no headway in the ongoing strike, which has been adversely affecting the functioning in the government offices.

Qaida threatens to strike during soccer World Cup

Al-Qaida's North African branch has threatened to attack the World Cup Football finals in South Africa which start in June.

In addition to the US and British teams, the teams representing France, Germany and defending champions Italy are on the terror group's list of targets.

Al-Qaida in the Islamic Maghreb says it will use an undetectable explosive that will be able to circumvent security checkpoints.

South Africa had announced last October that its security forces had foiled an al-Qaida plot to carry out a terrorist attack during the 2010 World Cup.

Bomber shoots cop in Russia, blows herself up

A female suicide bomber killed herself after shooting dead a policeman on Friday in Russia's North Caucasus region, where the Kremlin is struggling to contain an Islamist insurgency.

Suicide bombers have killed more than 50 people and injured 100 in a series of attacks that began on March 29 when two young women blew themselves up on the Moscow metro.

Police said that the woman, wearing a suicide belt, opened fire at them, wounding one policeman who later died. When police returned fire she blew herself up with the explosive device strapped to her body.

Dressed in a long jeans skirt and black top, her body later lay badly mutilated in a pool of blood. The shoot-out took place in the village of Ekazhevo in Ingushetia, where senior rebel leader Said Buryatsky was killed in a battle with security forces in early March.
