Shiv Sena vandalises multiplexes

The Maharashtra government's assurances of security fell flat on Tuesday as the Shiv Sena, smarting from its botched attempt at disrupting Congress general secretary Rahul Gandhi's visit, vandalised theatres in Mumbai, where advance booking for actor Shah Rukh Khan's film My Name Is Khan had opened.

Following his stand on the inclusion of Pakistani cricketers in the Indian Premier League, the Sena has made Mr. Khan the target of a virulent campaign, to the extent of calling him a traitor and asking him to leave for Pakistan.

The Sena's protests against the movie kicked off on Tuesday, four days ahead of its release. Sainiks targeted multiplexes at Mulund, Bhandup, Ghatkopar and Kanjur Marg. They went on the rampage smashing box office windows, throwing stones and disrupting the screenings of other movies.

By the end of the day, the Mumbai police had arrested 54 Sena workers for rioting. Over 100 preventive arrests were also made.

Fake cops who conned women, senior citizens held in Mira Road

Six conmen, who duped unsuspecting senior citizens and women by posing as cops, were recently arrested by the Kashimira police. The men have admitted to nearly 40 offences in Mumbai and Thane; 10 of the cases were in Mira-Bhayander. Most of the times, they targeted people who were out for a morning walk.

The modus operandi of these men was to keep their targets engrossed in conversation, while they flicked valuables.

The accused operated in groups of two or three at a time. One group of accused would try to frighten their target by pretending that a serious crime like a murder had occurred in the vicinity. They would ask women to remove their jewellery and tie them up in a handkerchief.

The second group of accused would try to lure their target by pretending that a rich man was distributing sarees as a son had been born to him after several years. Women were told to remove their ornaments to appear poor and be guaranteed a new saree. The ornaments were tied in a handkerchief. The gang members would then flick ornaments from the kerchief by the sleight of hand.

According to Adalaj police station officials, complainant Rammohan Tomar, a resident of Sabarmati, owns Gajendra Scrap Mill where they process used material and convert them into granules and other materials.

The workers living on the premises were asleep when they were attacked. Nobody is injured in the attack. They manhandled some workers and also threatened them of dire actions if they protested. Then they broke open the safe and took the money.

Second big snowstorm hits U.S. East Coast

The second major snowstorm in less than a week hit the US East Coast on Tuesday, with predictions of 14 inches (36 cm) or more stretching from Washington, DC, to New York City, forcing the United Nations to close and the US Congress to curtail legislative action.

Government offices in Washington will be closed on Wednesday -- the third straight day at a

cost of roughly \$100 million in lost productivity per day -- and the National Weather Service predicted the US capital could get upward of 14 inches (36 cm) by Wednesday night.

Forecasters also were predicting strong winds that could cause additional power outages. The Office of Personnel Management said federal agencies in the Washington area will be closed on Wednesday. US government emergency employees were expected to report for duty as scheduled but other workers were excused for the day.

Residents were still trying to dig out from record snowfall of 18 inches (46 cm) to 32 inches (81 cm) last weekend from Washington to southern New Jersey. Some tried to restock refrigerators and clear fallen trees before the new storm arrived.
