Woman, 5-yr-old son murdered at home

On a day when at least six people were murdered in the capital, an affluent neighbourhood in central Delhi woke up to police sirens and the shocking news that a 34-year-old housewife and her five-year-old son had been brutally stabbed to death in their home while the woman's husband was away attending a party with friends.

Pawan Nangia, a property dealer and owner of a store selling musical instruments, discovered the bodies when he returned to his J-Block home in West Patel Nagar around 2.30am on Friday.

With no cash or valuables missing, police said personal enmity may have led to the crime. The victims were identified as Anuradha and Charis.

9 hurt in fire at furniture unit

Nine persons were injured when a fire broke out in a furniture manufacturing unit in central Delhi yesterday afternoon.

The fire was triggered by LPG leakage. All the injured are workers of the unit. According to fire officials, the incident took place around 12.30 pm in Rangraze Gali of Hauz Qazi locality.

Five fire trucks were sent to douse the fire. The trucks took about half an hour to control the fire. Nine persons suffered injuries in the incident and were rushed to the Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Hospital. While seven were allowed to go after first aid, two have been admitted.

According to the police, leakage from gas cylinder could have caused the fire. The unit has been sealed while its owner is on the run.

Gang running fake lottery email scam busted

A gang of four, including a Nigerian national, who duped people, was nabbed by the cyber crime cell of the police on Wednesday. The accused used to send emails to the victims saying that they had won huge sums in a lottery. Sanjeevan Jyoti Bose, Sushant Kumar Sahu, Omchand Choudhary and Nigerian national Peter John Ekuvealor were booked for cheating and forgery under various sections of the Information Technology Act.

A complaint was lodged by a businessman who started receiving emails from

awarddepartmentoffice.uk@yahoo.co.uk from January, claiming that he had won \$ 1 million in a lottery draw announced by Microsoft Promotion, UK. The complainant was asked to forward his resume along with a copy of his bank passbook and PAN card.

Conman with gift of gab polishes off diamond rings

A conman with the gift of the gab lured a jeweller to a posh hotel in south Mumbai and tricked him into parting with three diamond rings, collectively worth Rs 16 lakh, on Thursday evening.

The accused, who introduced himself as Ajay Kumar (30), planned out the operation well in time and seemed to be so immensely confident that the jeweller never questioned his credentials and fell for his trick.

The act began on Tuesday, when Ajay went to the Dia Jewel store in CR2 Mall at Nariman Point, the police said. He checked a few rings and then told the salesman that he would come back in a couple of days with his "boss" who intended to buy the jewellery. As promised, he returned to the shop around 5.30 pm on Thursday but without his boss; instead he "finalised three diamond-studded white gold rings", the police said. Ajay told the staff at the store that his boss was staying at the Trident Hotel and requested them to come there to collect the money from where he quietly slipped off from the lobby after receiving the rings.

Clothes workshop gutted

A cloth-printing workshop in north Kolkata packed with an enormous stock of garments was gutted in a fire on Friday evening. Thirteen fire tenders rushed to the spot but it still took the personnel three hours to bring the flames under control.

Police said the flames were first noticed at the workshop at 18, South Sinthee Road around 7 pm. As the godown was full of inflammable articles, the fire spread within minutes and the flames could be seen shooting up in the air, creating panic among locals. Fire tenders were rushed from Kamarhati and Baranagar, but took a while to reach because of a huge traffic jam on BT Road.

By the time the fire engines arrived, the flames had engulfed the entire workshop spread over 4,000 sq ft. Initially, fire officials used water from a local pond as no other water was available.

Later, more tenders were pressed in action from other fire stations with jets. Though the fire had been controlled somewhat by 9 pm, the scarcity of water hampered operations. The workshop and godown is in a residential area, creating panic among local residents. Several multi-storey buildings stand close to the spot. As a preventive measure, CESC has stopped power supply in the entire area. The warehouse is yards away from Sinthee police station.

Gold chains worth 18 lakh recovered

The Cyberabad police on Friday recovered stolen gold chains worth Rs. 18 lakh after arresting 12 members of two chain snatching gangs.

The first gang led by Jeiky Singh, who came out after serving a jail term of six months in chain snatching cases, snatched chains from 12 women in the areas of Alwal zone in the past five months, the Commissioner, S. Prabhakar Reddy said. . The second gang committed 49 snatchings in the past two years. All the accused were below 26 and resorted to snatching to meet their lavish lifestyle.

Swine flu caution for pregnant women

The ongoing flu season has made pregnant women prone to a host of life threatening diseases.

Obstetrics and gynaecologists are advising expecting mothers to be cautious. They are to avert exposure to three ailments-dengue, chikungunya and swine flu- which have the potential to spread rapidly and infect large numbers during monsoons.

While doctors maintain that dengue and chikungunya cases are 'sporadic' in Hyderabad, cases of pregnant women testing positive for swine flu have increased in the last one month.

On Thursday, authorities informed that yet another pregnant woman from twin cities has tested positive for swine flu and is admitted to Gandhi Hospital for treatment. In June, two pregnant women died after getting infected by swine flu.

Armed men hold woman at gunpoint; loot house

In a broad daylight house robbery, three armed men held a woman and her domestic help at gunpoint, plundered the house and decamped with cash and jewellery worth an estimated over Rs 5 lakh on Friday in the busy Tewaripur locality of Gorakhpur.

The incident sparked off fear among locals who found themselves equally vulnerable. Senior police officials, who visited the scene of crime immediately after the information came in, claim to have picked up some important clues that could lead the investigators to the perpetrators of the robbery soon.

Clashes in Kashmir as curfew is relaxed

For the fourth consecutive day, Srinagar and other parts of the Kashmir Valley reeled under curfew, even as Muslims all over the world celebrated Shab-e-Meraj, one of the holiest days in the Islamic calendar. Scores of people were injured in clashes at several places, including Hazratbal where the shrine was locked after brief clashes on Friday.

Police have arrested one of the alleged culprits who talked over telephone to fuel protests

Friday prayers could not be offered in many mosques, particularly the central Jamia Masjid here. However, curfew was relaxed in the Valley by late evening in view of the holy day.

At least two persons were injured during the relaxation when police opened fire on protesters in Srinagar downtown. In Baramulla, a youth was injured as police opened fire to quell a demonstration.

In many other areas in the Valley too, the situation continued to be tense, with people staging protests at every opportunity. Since the killing of four persons in police firing on Tuesday, Srinagar has been under curfew.

Huge arms haul in Kishtwar

In a joint operation, the Special Operations Group and Rashtriya Rifles on Friday recovered explosives weighing 176 kg from a Lashkar-e-Taiba hideout in Kishtwar district in the Jammu region. This included 75 kg of material packed in two bags, six IEDs, 75 gelatin sticks, 23 grenades and 12 bore rifles.

Militants on Friday launched three attacks on security forces in Sopore town in north Kashmir. Two policemen were injured.

Police sources told that the militants, believed to be aligned to the LeT, hurled three grenades at a police convoy on the outskirts of Sopore. This was followed by heavy firing, and the security personnel retaliated

Hoax sparks bomb scare in Panaji

A call about a bomb being planted in a restaurant near Panaji bus stand kept the police on their toes Friday night.

Sources said police received a call around 9pm saying that a bomb had been planted in Hotel Rego, at Patto. The police swung into action and the bomb disposal squad was pressed into service. The restaurant was evacuated and the premises intensively checked, so too were vehicles parked in front of the restaurant.

Police also tried to track down the caller. Several calls were made on the number which was registered on the caller ID machine. The caller would press the answering button but not speak.

To their surprise the caller phoned again and speaking in Hindi said that the bomb would go off at 11pm, triggering panic. The police cordoned off the area and on checking again found no evidence of a bomb, much to the relief of the police and the restaurant owner. DIG

Ravindra Yadav confirmed it was a hoax.

Suicide blast kills 56 in Pakistan

A suicide bomber on a motorbike killed at least 56 people, including women and children, in an attack in a volatile Pashtun region on the Afghan border on Friday.

senior government official in Pakistan's northwestern Mohmand region, where security forces have stepped up attacks on Taliban militants in recent weeks.
