Bikers rob shopkeepers of Rs 28 lakh at gunpoint

Two shopkeepers in the Adarsh Nagar area of north-west Delhi were allegedly robbed of Rs 28 lakh. Four men at gunpoint asked the shopkeepers to hand over all cash in their shop and mobile phones. After robbing the victims, the accused fled on two motorcycles.

Roshan Kansal, the patron of local Vyapar Mandal, said the incident took place around 3:15 pm. Krishan Jindal and his brother-in-law Dipak Garg were alone in their shop, Ambika Traders, when four persons, two of them having their faces partially covered, barged inside.

They allegedly took out pistols and asked them to hand over all cash. The victims parted with around Rs 28 lakh. To ensure that they could not call the police, they also took away their mobile phones.

A group of shopkeepers in the locality protested against the deteriorating law and order situation and said that thefts and robberies had become the order of the day. Only five days ago, gunmen had fired at a man in a robbery bid.

Contractor stabbed, robbed of Rs 4 lakh

Two bike-borne men allegedly stabbed and robbed a contractor carrying Rs 4 lakh in an industrial area under the Surajpur Kotwali area.

The victim was carrying the amount to distribute it among his workers. The accused allegedly hit the contractor's bike and asked him to part with the money. When he resisted, they stabbed him and fled with the money.

Con couple makes Rs 2 cr by selling a plot four times

The couple thought they had hit a gold mine but their realty trick landed them in real trouble.

A middle-age woman, along with her husband and associates, forged property documents, sold a plot to four different people—each transaction could have fetched the couple at least Rs 50 lakh—and then tried to take over the property by flexing muscles. However, "excess" by their own men gave the gang away; five of the members—Salim Kasam Shaikh, Abdul

Samad Sami Khan, Mohammed Razzak Khan, Nasibuddin Shaikh and Ajay Tiwari—have been arrested, while the police are looking for around 20 more people, including the conwoman Betty Fernandes and her husband Simon Fernandes, who have been absconding for a week. The arrested have been remanded in judicial custody till June 11. The police said though Betty was the main culprit, a politician was also allegedly involved.

Fire breaks out in paint manufacturing unit

Panic gripped Pattaravakkam near Ambattur Industrial Estate on Tuesday evening after thick smoke engulfed the area following a major fire in the production unit of a paint company.

According to police, the fire broke out around 7 p.m. and short circuit is suspected to be the cause.

However, no casualty was reported. At least 20 fire tenders from different fire stations were rushed to the area to put out the blaze.

Few workers were inside the factory when the fire broke out. The emergency alarm was sounded and they ran out of the premises. The incident brought the traffic in the area to a halt for sometime as vehicles were stopped one km from the factory.

Hyundai strike called off

After talks between the Hyundai Motors India Limited (HMIL) and trade unions in the presence of Labour Minister T.M. Anbarasan on Wednesday, the strike at Hyundai has been called off.

MoU signed

As per the MoU signed between HMIL and the unrecognised union, representing workers who were on strike, HMIL has agreed to review the 35 cases of dismissed employees on humanitarian grounds, said a release from Rajiv Mitra, Head, Corporate Communications, HMIL.

Review committee

The review would be conducted by a committee comprising HMIL officials, government officials and representatives of the workers. HMIL has also considered confirming the 20 dismissed employees who were reinstated.

Two H1N1 deaths in state in past 10 days

Barely two days into the monsoon and the deadly H1N1 has raised its head again. Karnataka has recorded two deaths already.

On Monday, a 58-year-old woman from Bangalore died at a private hospital here after being treated for H1N1 flu for almost a month. A 30-year-old man, admitted to hospital on June 1, died on Monday at a private hospital in Udupi.

H1N1 vaccines now available in stores

Finally, H1N1 flu vaccines will be widely available across Karnataka. State drug controller Dr B R Jag Shetty told on Wednesday: "It's been two days now that vaccines are available in the state. It's a multidose vaccine with ten dose vials each. Since it's usually purchased by doctors, it's directly supplied by wholesalers. Some retail pharmacies have also purchased these vaccines and selling them too. Tamiflu drugs are available in most Schedule X pharmacies in the state."

Till date, 171 people have succumbed to the flu in Karnataka. If precautionary measures are not taken, more people could become victims. With the onset of monsoon and low

temperature, the virus spreads faster.

Shutdown from 7am to 6pm today

There will be a power shutdown in some parts of the city during 7 am to 6 pm on Thursday to enable the Maharashtra State Electricity Transmission Company Limited (MSETCL) and the Maharashtra State Electricity Distribution Company Limited (MSEDCL) to undertake urgent repair and maintenance work in view of the impending monsoon.

A statement issued by the MSEDCL here on Wednesday said that consumers needing details about the shutdown can contact the toll free call centre number 18002333435 or mobile 9960677021 to 025 or 9960677049 for areas under the Rasta Peth circle and 9960677351 for areas in the Ganeshkhind circle.

The MSETCL will undertake repair works at the 132 KV Mundhwa sub-station, hence supply to major supply lines like 22 KV Ahmednagar road RC1/2, Bhairoba Henley, Alankar, Waterworks, Pingalevasti, Keshavnagar, Mega Centre, Satellite tower and Kulkarni foundry will be shut during 8 am to 5 pm. Repair works at five sub-stations will affect power supply to Kakade mall, SNTD, Kirloskar Cummins, MES, Udyog Bhavan, Erandawane, Fergusson college road, Rajbhavan, Ashoknagar, Deccan Gymkhana, Shivajinagar, Kaspatrevasti, Rahatani and Hinjewadi areas during 7 am to 6 pm.

The MSETCL is also installing supply line towers from 132 KV Phursungi to 132 KV Mundhwa extra high voltage sub-stations, hence power supply to Pune station, Queens Garden, Inox, Nucleus mall, B J Medical college, Jehangir hospital, Solapur road, Command hospital, Bhavani Peth, M G road, Mundhwa, Camp, Ghorpadi, Modikhana, Circuit House, Golibar maidan, Hadapsar and Mundhwa will be shut during 8 am to 5 pm.

The MSEDCL is undertaking tree pruning and other maintenance work in Padmavati, Bund Garden and Parvati divisions, hence power supply will be shut in the following areas during 10 am to 5 pm.

Padmavati: Shankarshet road, Mira society, Kasewadi, Lohianagar, Timber market, Sonawane hospital, Ganesh Kala Kreed Rangmanch, PMC colony, Mukundnagar, TMV colony, Ganj Peth, Mitra Mandal, Parvati Darshan, Bibwewadi, Indiranagar lower and upper, Katraj-Kondhwa road, Market Yard, Muktangan area, Pune-Satara road, Kartaj.

Police crack Pratap Market theft case, 3 held

With the arrest of three youth and recovery of cash worth Rs seven lakh from their possession, the Aminabad police claimed to have worked out the theft case which took place at Vipin Sarees in Pratap market on the intervening night of Monday and Tuesday.

Ravi Yadav, who was earlier accused of the theft, was given a clean chit by the cops. In fact, it was the handiwork of Golu alias Rajan Yadav, Chhotu Kumar Rawat and Babloo Gupta, who worked as salesmen in the shop.

The police also recovered the stolen cash worth over Rs seven lakh from their possession. The miscreants told the police that after committing the crime, they reached the shop and managed to put blame on Ravi in order to save themselves. The police said the case was cracked through surveillance and the accused were nabbed on Hewett Road with money in their possession.

Four rob bank of Rs four lakh, kill constable

Explosion kills at least 39, injures 73 at wedding in Afghanistan

At least 39 people were killed and 73 wounded by a massive explosion at a wedding in the southern Afghan province of Kandahar on Wednesday, a senior official said.

The cause of the devastating blast was unclear, especially as insurgent attacks in the province, the heartland of the Taliban, are normally aimed at military or police targets and generally cause fewer casualties.

The toll was one of the highest in a single incident in recent months in war-torn Afghanistan.
