#### BJP calls 'Delhi bandh' on November 13

The BJP on Monday have a call for a 'Delhi bandh' on November 13 to protest the "skyrocketing prices" of essential commodities and the "abnormal hike" in bus fares in the city.

"We have decided to observe a Delhi bandh on November 13 to protest against the abnormal bus fare hike as well as skyrocketing prices of essential commodities," Delhi BJP president O P Kohli said.

He appealed to all the Resident Welfare Associations, businessmen and the common people to support the 'bandh' to oppose "anti-people" policies of the Delhi Government.

Delhi Government has become so insensitive towards the common people. The life of a common man has become so difficult in the city.

#### 30 fresh cases of dengue in Delhi, total 585

The dengue menace continued unabated in the national capital with 30 more cases being

reported on Monday, taking the total number of patients to 585 even as the civic authorities said a series of measures were being taken to prevent the spread of the disease.

Delhi has seen a surge in the number of dengue cases over the last fortnight when 20 to 23 cases per day on an average were registered. Two persons have died due to the disease so far this season.

### **24/7 emergency for dengue patients**

With 30 more diagnosed with dengue here yesterday, taking the tally to 585, emergency of the government and private hospitals in Delhi will operate round-the-clock for dengue patients.

This was decided during a meeting attended by senior officials of the Delhi health department, municipal corporation of Delhi (MCD) and medical superintendents of public and private hospitals.

To avoid crisis of blood platelets, the government will identify two hospitals in each district that would have licence for blood banks.

The principal health secretary said seven hospitals, including Guru Tegh Bahadur Hospital, Deen Dayal Upadhyay, Lok Nayak, G B Pant, Baba Saheb Ambedkar, Headgear, Rishi Valmiki, Sanjay Gandhi Memorial hospital, have the licence.

Sanjay Gandhi Memorial hospital, Baba Saheb Ambedkar hospital and Headgear Hospital would prepare and formulate the blood.

#### **2 'loan agents' held for duping firms of crores**

### **47 more Swine flu in Jaipur, 28 are kids**

Swine flu cases kept piling up on Monday as well, with the district administration in a tizzy, trying its best to contain the spread of the epidemic that seems to be affecting children the most.

On Monday, 52 more people tested positive for the H1N1 virus, of them 47 in Jaipur alone. Of the rest, three are from Jodhpur, and one each from Udaipur and Kota.

In Jaipur, again the highest number of those affected were children. With 28 kids testing positive on Monday, the number of children affected is nearly 130 in the city. Seven more schools have decided to close down.
