Garlic trader cheats bank of Rs2 lakh in Mumbai

Shivaji Park police arrested a person on Sunday for allegedly duping the Bank of India to the tune of Rs2.23 lakh with a forged cheque of a private company.

The accused has been identified as Dilip Kumar Gupta. “The suspect conducts a garlic trade at Plaza Market in Dadar. He has been booked for forgery and cheating,” said an inspector from Shivaji Park police station. He said they recovered Rs45,000 from Gupta, who is in judicial custody till June 11. Gupta said that after realisation of the cheque, he had withdrawn Rs76,400 using his ATM card and Rs1,47,200 through cheques.

On May 19, Vithoba Sawant, branch manager of the Shivaji Park branch of Bank of India, wrote to the police stating that their account holder Gupta had allegedly forged a cheque (No508992) of M/s Machine and Mechanical Company on April 26. The cheque was for Rs2,25,700. Satish Sakhardande of the company had filed a complaint with the bank.

Two deaths later, H1N1 scare back to haunt Mumbai this monsoon

With the dreaded H1N1 virus beginning to rear its head once again this monsoon, civic health authorities do not want to leave anything to chance. After the recent deaths of two pregnant women at Sion hospital due to the virus, authorities are taking all necessary precautions to stop the spread.

Maharashtra has seen 497 deaths due to H1N1 so far, and on an average about 20 deaths every month.

Like any typical respiratory virus, the H1N1 virus has been in the air all along, is what experts feel. In Maharashtra, the H1N1 outbreak was at its peak during the monsoon last year — July-August. Thus, doctors are being extra cautious this monsoon.

According to police, the entire family was involved in the fraud. They allegedly promised job-seekers a staff position in Union Bank of India.

Explosives haul from Malda godown

In the biggest haul in recent times, Malda police, along with their Murshidabad counterparts, recovered 450 kg of explosives from a warehouse in Malda's Kaliachak late on Wednesday. Four persons were arrested in this connection.

Acting on a tip-off, a large force from Malda and Murshidabad police raided the warehouse of Chand Ratan Daga, 48, who apparently deals in grocery items. The raid started at 10.30 pm and continued for an hour. The joint police team recovered as many as 17 bags of explosives, including potassium nitrate, sulfur, iron, manganese and others.

Police crack BSNL recharge coupon scam

Police reportedly cracked the Rs 1.4-crore BSNL pre-paid recharge coupon scam and arrested two persons, including a telecom officer, on Thursday.

After a week-long probe, police arrested P Ramesh, a telecom officer who works at BSNL Bhavan, Lakdi-ka-pul, and U Vijay, who runs a BSNL franchise, Panchajanya Enterprises, in Secunderabad, from their homes here.

In 2009, Ramesh stole 26 CDs containing data of 1.3 lakh BSNL recharge numbers from BSNL stores in Adarsh Nagar. Store incharge K Lokanatha Rao failed to detect the theft as Ramesh replaced the original CDs with empty ones, deputy commissioner of police (DCP), Central Zone, Akun Sabharwal told the media.

After stealing the CDs, Ramesh along with Vijay had recharge cards printed at Bhagvathi Printers in Parel, Mumbai, using the numbers contained in the CDs. After printing the recharge cards, the duo sold them through wholesalers and retailers in Hyderabad. The duo made Rs 1.04 crore from the sale of the cards in seven months between November, 2009 and May, 2010.

Mobile store manager caught for cyber theft

Others were identified as Arun Singh Bhadauria, mobile carrier and software engineer, Amit Kumar Srivastava, both a resident of Sarojininagar; and Ahivaran Pal, a resident of Bara Birwa under Alambagh police station area and posted at the warehouse in Alambagh.

Industry opposes Jammu bandh call

The Chamber of Commerce and Industries (CCI) has opposed a bandh call given by some

organisations against, what they alleged, a decision of the state government to impose tax during the annual Amarnath yatra.

According to a handout, an emergency meeting of the CCI was held here yesterday under the chairmanship of its general secretary, Satish Gupta, and a discussion was held on the bandh call given by some organisations. Those present at the meeting observed that there was no logic for the bandh when the state government had already issued SRO 242, dated June 8, 2010, to relax tax on vehicles for Amarnath and Mata Vaishno Devi pilgrims.

Meanwhile, the Ram Sena has also suspended its bandh call for June 12 after a meeting with the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu. According to a handout, the Divisional Commissioner assured to solve the issue of imposing tax on buses.

Bomb hoax at Police Public School

Police Public School authorities who were preparing for the school's first anniversary celebrations on Thursday, went into a tizzy following a telephone call by an anonymous person. He threatened them saying a bomb had been planted inside the school and would go off shortly.

However, the jurisdiction police confirmed it as hoax after conducting a thorough search with the assistance of police dogs. Nazarbad police inspector Jayaram claimed that the call was traced to a coin-operated telephone box located near the school and they are investigating.

Taliban rain death in Af-Pak

A suicide bomb ripped through a wedding party for a family with ties to police in the Taliban's heartland in Afghanistan, killing at least 40 people and wounding dozens more, officials said on Thursday. This came even as the top US commander in the Afghanistan war acknowledged that a crucial campaign to secure the region where the Taliban insurgency was born will take longer than planned.

The bomb blast late on Wednesday almost completely flattened the outer wall of a compound in the Arghandab district of Kandahar where male wedding guests had gathered for a meal. The windows and walls of the mud-brick dwellings were shattered and cracked. Women guests at the party were in another compound that was not hit by the explosion.

Bomb blast outside Pak Navy office in Karachi kills one

A bomb went off outside a Pakistan Navy office in the southern port city of Karachi, killing at least one person and injuring three others.

The bomb was hidden in a motorcycle that was in a parking area for two-wheelers outside the office at the Naval Colony in Baldia Town area.

The identity of the dead and injured could not immediately be ascertained. Police said two suspects were arrested soon after the blast.
