Big fire in Mundka scrap market

It took more than 15 hours for the firefighters to douse the massive blaze which broke out in a plastic scrap market in the Mundka area of north-west Delhi early on Sunday morning.

As per information, the fire spread engulfing an area over 1.5 km long, with firefighters suspecting that it was “deliberately” ignited by someone. No one was injured in the fire which broke out around 2.15 am on Phirni Road in Mundka. Over 30 fire engines were rushed to douse it.

“The fire was brought under control within seven hours,” said a fire official.

The incident came a day after a major fire destroyed 24 of the 25 warehouses that stored goods worth crores of rupees in the Tughlaqabad area of south Delhi.

According to fire officials, Sunday’s fire was reported from an open area where thousands of tons of scrap are stored.

Metro files complaint against fake job agency

With the Delhi Metro network expanding ahead of the Commonwealth Games, the DMRC is planning to increase its staff strength by creating over 3,000 new posts. With this, however, several placement agencies offering fraudulent jobs with the corporation have mushroomed across the city. DMRC is initiating strict action against such agencies.

It has come to light that several recruitment agencies are offering non-existent jobs and duping people after which a slew of preventive measures have been taken by DMRC. Following a recent advertisement in a Bulandshahr-based publication called Uttarakhand Rozgar Darshan by one such agency — DMRC Placement Services, which advertised for 2,050 posts in Delhi Metro — the corporation has lodged a complaint with Delhi Police for registration of FIR against it.

4 thrash driver, speed away with Rs 22 lakh car

Four unidentified persons beat up a man and sped away with the Rs 22-lakh car he was driving at Vile Parle East around 9.30 on Saturday night.

The chauffeur of the Toyota Ford Fortuner was on his way to the international airport to pick up his businessman employer when the incident occurred. Suresh Bhuwaria (35) was near the Airport Colony when he parked the vehicle by the side of the road and went to a nearby mobile shop to recharge his SIM card.

While Bhuwaria was returning from the mobile shop, two of the accused, standing in the shadow of the car, pushed him and started to beat him up. They snatched the car key from Bhuwaria and passed it on to two of their accomplices who were standing close to the vehicle's door. Bhuwaria shouted for help but no one came to his aid; even as the first two accused continued hitting him, the other two fled with the vehicle.

Rs 60L heist under cops' nose

It was a daylight robbery right under the cops' nose, literally. A gang of four men, wielding firearms and choppers, barged into a Kamathipura jewellery shop—located less than a 100 metre from the Nagpada police station's beat chowkie—threatened to kill the employees and fled on motorcycles with 4 kg gold valued at Rs 60 lakh.

The incident occurred around noon on Saturday near the Shuklaji Street police beat chowkie in Kamathipura. Babulal Purohit, a relative of the owner of Ramdev Jewellers, said, "Three employees were at the counter when a young man, posing as a customer, entered the shop and asked to see a gold chain. While examining the ornament, he also started checking out the inside of the store.

Meanwhile, two more persons entered the shop and pulled out revolvers and choppers. The fourth one stood guard outside. The robbers silenced the three employees by threatening them with dire consequences; then they pushed the staffers inside the toilet and bathroom and locked them up from outside.

Maoists warn of more Dantewada-type attacks

The CPI-Maoist yesterday warned of more Dantewada-type attacks on security forces if the Centre carried on with the anti-Maoist offensive even as it expressed sympathy for the

families of the 76 jawans killed and offered compensation.

In a letter faxed to media houses here, the banned organisation said it would carry out more attacks similar to Dantewada and asked the security forces not to take part in operations directed against it.

"Else the consequences will be bad for them," the letter warned.

The CPI-Maoist expressed sympathy for the aggrieved families of the deceased and said it was ready to compensate them.

"We also want people to come out and offer financial aid to them." The Maoists also asked people to support their fight and stop acting as 'informers' to the security forces.

Naxals blow up 4 govt buildings

Maoists blew up a school, a community hall and two health centres at Sarodag village in Bihar's Kaimur district on Saturday night.

This is the second incident in a week when Maoists have blown up schools in Kaimur. About one dozen schools and community buildings have been blown up by Maoists in Rohtas and Kaimur districts within a fortnight.

On Sunday morning, villagers found three leaflets — one was addressed to the police, the second one was meant for the schoolchildren and the third was for the villagers.

Through the leaflets, Maoists urged the police to stop Operation Green Hunt. “Join us and serve the poor and downtrodden,” the Maoists “advised” the police.

The Maoists also warned that Ranchi SSP Praveen Kumar Singh and Ranchi SP (rural) Michael Raj S will be punished in a ‘jan adalat’. The ultras claimed that these officers had killed two of their members, Ashok and Suman, in a fake encounter.

The Maoists also said, “Schools are being blown up under compulsion because police use them as their camps during anti-Maoist operations.”\

False alarm creates panic at Patna Junction

A false alarm about recovery of bomb from the washing yard at Patna Junction created panic among railway employees and passengers there on Sunday morning.

The Patna GRP, which swung into action immediately, were greatly relieved to find a bundle of threads lying on the tracks, said superintendent of railway police (SRP), Patna, J S Rana.

Meanwhile, the GRP personnel investigating the shootout incident in the Danapur-Howrah Express identified the real culprits — Shambu Sao and Manoj Teku. While Sao belongs to Barh, Teku is a native of Lakhisarai district. Though they are evading arrest, the police are on the job to nab them soon, the SRP said, adding security has been beefed up on all night trains passing through Patna Junction.

Road blocked, bridge blown up in Orissa district

Maoists blew up a bridge and blocked an important road in Orissa's Koraput district, paralysing traffic in many areas in the naxal-hit region.

Snatching cases at Zirakpur on the rise

In the wake of sudden surge observed in the snatching cases, especially amongst the women, residents of Zirakpur are perturbed over the issue from the past few weeks. More than five snatching incidents have been reported in the past two days. However, no case has been registered by the local police. The proximity of Zirakpur town with Chandigarh and Haryana makes it convenient for the snatchers to run away in the neighbouring places in no time.

A majority of snatching incidents have taken place during afternoon and late evening hours when it is difficult to identify snatchers. Snatchers grab the victims from the back and snatch their chains, earrings and other ornaments and escape from the scene within seconds. They target women who pass through deserted areas.

32 fresh cases of gastroenteritis reported

The tricity continues to be in the grip of gastroenteritis and diarrhoea, with 32 fresh cases being reported at various government hospitals. The total number of cases reported in the city's government hospitals in the past three days crossed the 130 mark. This number could be much higher as several patients were seeking treatment from private hospitals and clinics, said a UT health official.

Eighteen patients, including two adults, reported today at the Government Multi-Specialty Hospital (GMSH), Sector 16, one at the PGI emergency and 15, including three children, at the Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH), Sector 32. This seems to have become a daily pattern.

Defiant employees extend stir till April 19, Complete lockout from today

Rejecting the government's offer for talks on ending the agitation, striking government employees have extended their strike till April 19. The employees have also decided to lock out the Civil Secretariat and other government offices, including hospitals, from today.

Earlier, the employees had planned a "secretariat chalo" march on April 12, but after the arrest of some senior leaders, they have now decided a lockout from today.

The strike began on April 3, which prompted the government to invoke the Essential Services Maintenance Act (ESMA) on the employees on April 5. Then the employees also extended their strike up to April 13.

Besides the payment of Sixth Pay Commission arrears, the employees are demanding the enhancement of retirement age from 58 to 60 years and house rent allowance (HRA) on a par

with central government employees.

The employees have also alleged that the police is harassing their families and special squads have been constituted to keep an eye on the attendance of the employees in all departments and offices.

Employees' Strike: Join duty today or face sack, Health Dept warns ad hoc staff

With health services bearing the brunt of the week- long strike of government employees, the state health department has become the first to crack the whip on the strikers. It has warned the employees to either join duties immediately or face termination. The department has started issuing notices to ad hoc/contractual or consolidated (non- permanent with fixed pay, but not fixed tenure) employees in Govt Medical College, Jammu, and SMGS Hospital, Jammu, to either report for duty by today or face termination.

Bomb scare on Jet Airways flight, Varanasi

The flight was cleared for departure to Khajurao after extensive checking of the aircraft.

A Jet Airways spokesperson said the flight was delayed due to questioning of "certain guests" on security concerns by the airport authorities as well as security agencies.

Thailand in turmoil after 19 die in bloody clashes

Thailand was reeling on Sunday from its worst political violence in nearly two decades after clashes between the army and anti-government demonstrators left 19 people dead and over 800 injured.
