After water supply, Jats threaten to disrupt CWG

The Jat community that had earlier blocked the water supply to Delhi during a protest demanding reservation at state and central levels, yesterday upped the ante and threatened to disrupt the Commonwealth Games.

In an attempt to coerce the government into accepting their demands, the Jat leaders said that a strategy to disrupt the games would be finalised on July 28.

The national president of the Akhil Bhartiya Arakshan Sangharsh Samiti (ABJASS), Yeshpal Malik, today said that the deadline set for talks between Ministry of Social Justice and the Samiti was over on July 10.

Stating their demands, he said that the community of Jats should be included in the OBC list at the Central and State level, wherever not included.

The Jat protestors had dried most parts of Delhi by cutting off the crucial water supply to Sonia Vihar plant in Delhi from Ganganahar Muradnagar pipeline in Ghaziabad on June 13.

This pipeline supplies more than 500 cusec of water to Delhi which is about 40 per cent of the total water requirement of Delhi. It caters to about 50 lakh people in Central, East and South Delhi.

Communally sensitive areas to be mapped

The state government will soon map all communally-sensitive areas across Tamil Nadu. This decision was taken at the first meeting of the newly-formed State Level Integration Committee, chaired by deputy chief minister M K Stalin at the secretariat on Monday.

Preparing an action plan to maintain communal harmony is another major task on hand for the eight-member committee, formed as per a directive from the central government.

Stalin instructed each member of the committee to suggest ways and means to tackle communally sensitive issues, as and when they arose. It has to be a discreet exercise, as otherwise these preventive measures themselves could create a problem, it is felt.

Tamil Nadu has a long list of communally sensitive areas, though most of these have not reported any major disturbances over the past few years. Top on this list is Coimbatore, where serial blasts ripped apart the city, leaving 58 dead and more than 150 injured, just before former BJP president LK Advani was to attend an election meeting there in February 1998.

Other sensitive areas are Melapalayam and Tenkasi in Tirunelveli district, Kayalpattinam in Thoothukudi district, Nagore, Dindigul, Tiruchi city and parts of Chennai city like Ice House and Triplicane. While Melapalayam and Tenkasi had witnessed several murders and riots during late 90s, most other sensitive areas have had problems only during Vinayaka Chaturthi celebrations and processions. In the 1980s, Mandaikadu in Kanyakumari used to witness frequent clashes between Christians and Hindus.

Driver robbed of 1.6 lakh

Unidentified persons robbed a businessman's driver of Rs. 1.6 lakh after hurling chilli powder on him at Afzalgunj on Monday night. The trader had gone to meet a person after asking the driver to hand over Rs. 1.6 lakh to a merchant at Begum Bazar.

3-member gang held for duping banks

A Task Force team apprehended three persons—Mohammed Abdul Waheed, 35, a car broker, N Dushyanta Rao, 33, who was into finance business and B Srinivas, 41, an RTA agent—for fraudulently selling cars under hypothecation by creating forged clearance certificates. The Task Force team seized a Maruthi Zen and other documents from them.

The trio formed a gang and hatched a plan to dupe banks by forging bank letterheads which contain loan clearance certificate. Waheed used to locate car loan defaulters. He used to lure the car owners with a promise to return the EMIs paid by them, sell the car and clear the bank loan.

They cheated banks to the tune of Rs 25 lakh by selling cars to other customers. The trio were handed over to the Mahankali police along with seized vehicles for necessary action.

13 cases of dacoity solved

The Pune rural police on Monday claimed to have solved 13 cases of dacoity at petrol pumps, beer shops and attempts of looting ATMs and banks in the city and the district during the last one month, following the arrest of one suspect.

Four other suspects are still at large. The police have launched a massive manhunt to trace the suspects.

Investigations have revealed that the gang, of which Dudhani was a part, had attempted to break into a bank at Karla near Lonavla on July 5. On the same day, the gang had broken into a beer shop in Malavli and seven shops and a petrol pump in Pavananagar near Lonavla. The same gang was involved in breaking into the Morwadi branch of the Bank of Maharashtra in Pimpri, and the UCO bank ATM in Kharalwadi on July 3. The gang also had committed dacoity in the jurisdiction of Loni Kalbhor, Shikrapur and Loni Kand police stations in June.

UP cabinet minister critically injured in blast

An Uttar Pradesh cabinet minister Nand Gopal Nandi was critically injured in a blast outside his residence Muthi Ganj in Allahabad district on Monday.

Nand Gopal Nandi, the minister for institutional finance, has been admitted to the Jivan Jyoti Hospital.

Blast triggered by remote

With the recovery of a remote control unit from the sight of the explosion late on Monday evening, forensic and explosive experts from Agra's Forensic Scientific Lab (FSL) probing the life threatening attack on cabinet minister Nand Kishore "Nandi", have logically concluded that the explosion was triggered by a remote control. This is perhaps the first known case ever in Uttar Pradesh where a remote control was used to detonate a blast in a criminal incident or a terror strike.

In India, remote controlled explosions have so far been reported from regions under the influence of Maoists and Punjab militants only.

Bike-borne duo rob woman of cash

In yet another incident of loot, two unidentified miscreants robbed a woman of cash worth Rs 40,000, which she had withdrawn from a bank, under Mohanlalganj police station on Monday.

With this incident, the number of loot cases added to over seven in the last one-and-a-half month. The police have not been able to solve any of the loot cases till date, putting a question mark on the law and order situation in the state capital.

Tight security for rath yatra in city, Surat

The police plan to ensure security for the five rath yatras of Lord Jagannath and also maintain law and order in the Surat city on Tuesday by deploying State Reserve Police (SRP), Lok Rakshak and Home Guard personnel besides local policemen. There is no plan to requisition additional forces from other centres.

As per the security arrangements, two SRP companies have been deployed along with 200 Lok Rakshaks and 200 Home Guard jawans in the city ahead of the rath yatra.

The focus of the security is on Ring Road, which is the route of Lord Jagannath rath yatra of ISKCON temple, Jahangirpura. No road has been blocked for the whole day. Only sections of Ring Road and Amroli Bridge will be closed for vehicular movement while the yatra is passing from the area.

Bandh hits life

Even as curfew restrictions were lifted from most areas of Kashmir since Sunday, followed by prohibitory orders in some areas, normal life remained affected across the Valley for the second consecutive day yesterday in response to the APHC (Geelani) bandh call.

However, restrictions remained in force in downtown localities on Monday to prevent any untoward incident, as the area had witnessed a series of protests during the recent days. The APHC chairman, Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, held public meetings in the area on Saturday in protest against the alleged human rights violations.

All shops and business establishments and educational institutions remained closed. Passenger transport was off the roads, while private transport and auto-rickshaws plied normally.

Maoists attack NMDC mine in Dantewada

Suspected armed cadres of the Communist Party of India (Maoist) attacked an iron ore mine operated by the National Mineral Development Corporation at Bacheli in Chhattisgarh's Dantewada district on Monday night.

According to intelligence sources, the attack began about 9.15 p.m. when about 40-45 armed persons set fire to two tipper trucks in the North Block of the NMDC's Akashnagar mine. While the drivers were set free, the gunmen engaged with Central Industrial Security Force personnel posted at the mines in an encounter that lasted at least an hour.

Over the last few years, Maoists have repeatedly struck at NMDC's mining operations.

In February 2006, they attacked a depot in Hiroli and made off with nearly 20 tonnes of mining explosive. Earlier this year, Maoist fighters destroyed a pipeline intended to supply iron ore slurry from the NMDC mines in Dantewada to an Essar iron ore plant in Andhra Pradesh.

Bombs, weapons seized at Edakkad

In extensive raids on Monday, the police seized lethal weapons, including country-made bombs and sharp-edged weapons, from the premises of buildings used by the Popular Front of India (PFI) and its political arm, the Social Democratic Party of India (SDPI), at Edakkad and Thalassery.

Ten powerful country-made weapons, 12 swords, two axes, two knives, one cycle chain and a few iron pipes were unearthed by the police. They seized a pair of gloves, campaign posters

and notebooks from the building. The raid which started at 9 a.m. following an anonymous tip-off continued till afternoon. Most of the weapons were recovered from a building near a mosque at Manappuram near the Muzhappilangad beach in the Edakkad police station limits.

Uganda bombings kill 74, Islamists suspected

Suspected Somali Islamists carried out two bomb attacks in the Ugandan capital that killed 74

people watching the World Cup final at a restaurant and a sports club, authorities said on Monday.

Suspicion fell on the al Shabaab rebel group, which claims links with al Qaeda, after the severed head of a suspected Somali suicide bomber was found at one of the blast sites.

The explosions ripped through two bars packed with soccer fans watching the final moments of World Cup final on television in an Ethiopian-themed restaurant and at a gathering in a Kampala rugby club on Sunday.

Al Shabaab militants in Somalia have threatened to attack Uganda for sending peacekeeping troops to the anarchic country to prop up the Western-backed government.
