Robbers strike in south Delhi, kill ex-bureaucrat

Senior citizens again became victims of ruthless robberies in the capital when two adjacent houses in the upscale Kalkaji Extension area in southeast Delhi were targeted in violent back-to-back crimes that left an 86-year-old former bureaucrat dead and seriously injured a 75-year-old mother of a CEO. The five-member gang escaped with cash and jewellery worth no more than Rs 4.5 lakh in the early morning strike that lasted one-and-a-half hours.

The victims have been identified as Janak Raj Likhi, a retired deputy secretary in the information and broadcasting ministry who was found dead in his bed gagged and tied, and Vidya Gulabani, who has been admitted in the ICU of Holy Family hospital with injuries. Gulabani, who is blind, is the mother of the CEO of Uttam Toyota.

Petrol pumps to stay shut on Mondays

Petrol pumps in the Capital will remain shut on Mondays, starting from May 24, as dealers protest the increase in VAT on diesel from 12.5% to 20%. Pumps will also be closed on May 14 as a one-off protest closure. An off-day a week will mark their protest and help cut costs.

Bangladeshi held for 23 burglaries

The Delhi police has arrested a 22-year-old Bangladeshi national allegedly involved in around 23 cases of burglary, snatching and vehicle thefts.

Mohd Masoom was apprehended Tuesday from the Pragati Vihar Hostel area while trying to dispose of a stolen computer set in a shop, deputy commissioner of police (south) H.G.S. Dhaliwal said.

With his arrest, the police has claimed to have solved 23 cases of burglary, theft, snatching and vehicle thefts and recovered several stolen items like a flat-screen computer, gold chains, mobile phones, SIM cards, memory cards, knife and a motorcycle.

A fire that broke out at Dadar station on Wednesday evening caused major chaos among commuters. Although north-bound trains were diverted to the fast line as a precautionary

measure, citizens rushing home from work started panicking, even as SMSes were being sent by them to others to avoid trains.

The fire started around 5.30 pm in the fibre sheets of the landing of the middle foot-overbridge (FOB) at Dadar (W), just at the boundary wall of the station. The fire, they said, possibly occurred due to a short-circuit.

Maoist-backed bandh hits rural areas

Normal life was disrupted in pockets of the forested south-western part of West Bengal, commonly known as Jangalmahal, on Wednesday due to the bandh called by the Maoist-backed Police Santrash Birodhi Janasadharaner Committee (PSBJC) in protest against alleged atrocities perpetrated on villagers by CPI (M) supporters.

While the bandh had hardly any impact in the urban areas of the three districts of Paschim Medinipur, Bankura and Purulia, a complete shutdown was witnessed in Maoist-dominated areas like Salboni, Lalgarh and Jhargram in Paschim Medinipur district; Khatra, Sarenga and Bandwan areas of Bankura; and Purulia district.

Vehicles stayed off the roads; shops, schools and offices remained closed. There was no incident of violence reported. The PSBJC leadership had alleged on Tuesday that hundreds of armed CPI (M) cadres attacked several tribal villages over the past few days and ransacked houses and tortured people in their bid to capture the areas.

Car bomb kills 7 in Shiite area of Iraqi capital

Iraqi officials say seven people were killed and 25 wounded when a parked car exploded near a cafe in the Sadr City slum in eastern Baghdad.

Sadr City is the eastern Baghdad stronghold of anti-American cleric Muqtada al-Sadr and the scene of one of Iraq's most deadly bombings this year, when insurgents in April targeted worshippers gathered for Friday prayers.

103 die in Libya plane crash

A Libyan plane arriving from South Africa disintegrated on landing at Tripoli airport yesterday, killing 103 persons but leaving an eight-year-old boy as the sole miracle survivor.

An official in The Hague said 61 Dutch citizens were killed while Libyan Transport Minister Mohammed Ali Zidan listed "Libyans, Africans and Europeans" among the dead.

Pak national arrested at US Embassy in Chile with explosives

A Pakistani national, who was arrested at the American Embassy in the Chilean capital of Santiago with traces of explosives, has no link with the Times Square incident.

The individual identified as Muhammad Saif-ur-Rehman Khan, 28, whose visa was revoked a day before because of his apparent terrorist ties, has been handed over to Chilean authorities and the US has launched an investigation into the case.
