72-hour Jhargram bandh begins on violent note

The 72-hour bandh called by the Maoist-backed Police Santrash Birodhi Janasadharaner Committee (PSBJC) in Jhargram sub-division of West Bengal's Paschim Medinipur district began on Thursday on a violent note with the outfit's supporters setting a pick-up van afire.

According to police sources, there was a fierce gun-battle between security forces and the Maoists at Bakshi village in the Kotwali area of Lalgarh region during the day in which one villager reportedly suffered a bullet injury.

The bandh was called in protest against alleged high-handedness of security forces on PSBJC supporters at a rally in front of the office of Jhargram's Sub-Divisional Officer.

Protestors torched the pick-up van at Sapdhara near Jhargram early in the day and left posters demanding withdrawal of Central security forces from the region as well as immediate release of all PSBJC leaders including Chhatradhar Mahato.

Traffic diversions on Old Madras Road

Unidentified men loot digital cameras showroom

Some unidentified persons entered a showroom of digital cameras on Karve road by breaking the shutter and fled with the 143 digital cameras worth Rs 10.50 lakh. The incident took place during the wee hours of Thursday.

A complaint in this regard has been lodged by Sanjay Jain (38) of old Khadki Bazar with Deccan Gymkhana police station. The complainant Jain is a distributor for Maharashtra of a Japan based company which manufactures digital cameras. He owns a show room named as Digi Click on Karve road.

NDA on high alert since 26/11 attack

Even as the Indian Military Academy authorities met the Uttarkhand police to review security measures in the wake of threats from Lashkar-e-Taiba, officials at the National Defence Academy (NDA), Khadakwasla, told DNA that they have been on high vigil since the 26/11 Mumbai terror attack and not owing to any 'specific inputs'.

A higher level of alert is expected at the NDA during the Passing out Parade of the graduating

cadets which is scheduled in the last week of November in the presence of the army chief, general Deepak Kapoor.

73 bags of explosives recovered

A joint team of Patna and Gaya police seized 73 bags of ammonium nitrate, each weighing about 50 kg, and Maoist literature from two places in Gaya town on Thursday. This comes close on the heels of the seizure of six tonnes of explosive materials and 40,000 cartridges from Patna and Bokaro by Patna police.

Officiating Gaya superintendent of police Sourav Kumar said experts were engaged in assessing the damage potential of the seized items. The explosives were packed in synthetic bags, generally used by fertiliser companies.

No arrest has been made in this connection yet, he said. While 44 bags of chemical powder were recovered from the Delha area on the northern outskirts of Gaya, another 29 bags were recovered from the Mufassil area in the eastern fringes of the town.

Nine more test positive for swine flu, 6 from PEC

Swine flu continues to spread at an alarming rate in the city with nine more people including six students of Punjab Engineering College testing positive for the H1N1 virus yesterday, the highest number of such cases being reported in a single day.

A day after a PEC student tested positive for H1N1, six more students from the same college and another student from DAV College, who had participated in the recently concluded PEC fest, developed flu symptoms and tested positive for the disease, said HC Gera, UT Nodal Officer for swine flu. However, he added all of them are stable and responding to treatment.

With the infection now spreading to other classes, the PEC authorities have decided to close the college for a week following instructions issued by UT health department officials.

22 SRTC employees hurt in cane-charge

Twenty-two employees of the State Road Transport Corporation (SRTC), including four women, were injured, three of them critically, when the police cane-charged them and lobbed tear gas shells to prevent them from surrounding the Civil Secretariat here yesterday.

As the prohibitory orders were already in place near the Civil Secretariat area, the police arrested 48 protesting SRTC employees and lodged them in city police station.

Elaborate security arrangements were in place as a large number of police personnel were deployed on roads leading to the Civil Secretariat to foil any attempt. However, the employees in small groups managed to reach Shalamar Chowk outside the secretariat.

2 engineers kidnapped in Manipur

At a time when Manipur's legal fraternity is fighting hard for the release of an advocate who went missing 18 days ago, two government engineers have been abducted for ransom, allegedly by an underground outfit.

On Thursday, local women of Kongpal Chanam Leikai and its surrounding areas demonstrated against the kidnapping of Manipur power department's executive engineer, Th Tomalchand, of Khurai area and section officer Leitanthem Mangi of Kongpal Chanam Leikai in Imphal East. Both were serving in Tamenglong district and are missing since the past one week. Family sources said an underground group that claimed to have abducted the duo has demanded a Rs 15-crore ransom from the power department against their release.

5 dead as suicide bomber targets ISI office in Pak's Peshawar

A suicide car-bomber destroyed an office of Pakistan's main intelligence agency in the north-western city of Peshawar on Friday, killing five people and wounding 20.

Militants have stepped up attacks on security forces including a commando-style raid and hostage-taking at the army's headquarters in Rawalpindi last month. The frontier city of

Peshawar has been targeted several times since the army began an offensive against the militants in the South Waziristan region on the Afghan border on Oct. 17.
