Tenant forges landlord's sign to buy house & Accent car

A retired engineer became the latest victim of the “magic pen” in Greater Noida. Lucknow-based Krishnapal Singh, who had rented out his flat in Greater Noida to an “MNC executive” found to his horror that his tenant had forged his signature to obtain loans for a flat and an Accent car before fleeing the city.

According to police, Singh gave his flat in Sector P-3 near Kasna on rent to Sanjay Gupta around one year ago. Singh was living with his family in Lucknow. But because he wanted the flat to be maintained well, he decided to give it out on rent. His contact in Greater Noida suggested he should consider renting it to Gupta. Gupta was willing to pay a ‘high’ rent and Singh was more than happy to have him as a tenant. For the next eight months, Singh received the rent on time.

Meanwhile, Gupta allegedly prepared fake documents and approached a bank in Alpha 1. Using the name Krishnapal Singh, he sought loan for an Accent car and a house. When Gupta stopped paying rent about four months ago, Singh got alarmed. Finally, he called Gupta in the first week of December and said he was coming to Greater Noida. Since then Gupta has been absconding and his mobile phone is switched off.

7 vehicles stolen in one night

The Noida police has busted a gang of vehicle thieves that stole as many as seven cars from different parts of the city on Friday night.

The police has registered reports for all incidents. The thieves drove away with Ajab Singh's new Bolero car from Sector25-A near Adob Crossing. Singh, a resident of Dankore, had come to Noida. While they stole Suman Kumar's Innova car from Sector-94. Kumar had come from Himachal Pradesh. In Sector-63, the thieves fled with the bikes of Manish Pathak and Ram Avtar.

After this, a tractor trolley belonging to Subender Mukerjee was stolen in Sector-10.

The thieves then went to Sector-15 and drove away with the scooters of Anil Kumar and Imran Khan from Sector-7.

Cyclone weakens, likely to cross TN coast

Cyclone Ward' has weakened into a deep depression and is expected to cross the Tamil Nadu coast between Kanyakumari and Nagapattinam early on Tuesday, said Meteorological Department officials. Only light showers are expected in Chennai.

The depression on Sunday evening was positioned at 9.0 degrees latitude and 83.0 degrees longitude, 400 km south-east of Nagapattinam and 400 km east of Pamban near Rameswaram.

Due to the effect of the system, isolated heavy to very heavy rain is likely over north coastal Tamil Nadu and Puducherry during the next 48 hours. Rainfall with scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated extremely heavy falls is also likely over south-coastal Tamil Nadu during the same period.

The sea condition is expected to be very rough along and off the south Tamil Nadu coast as well as the north Tamil Nadu and Puducherry coasts. Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea. From Saturday night, Nagapattinam district received heavy rains. Due to the cyclone, danger signal number three had been hoisted at the port.

GSK, HSBC arms halt ops in Andhra Pradesh

In a setback to Andhra Pradesh's image as an investment destination, multinational healthcare giant GlaxoSmithkline Consumer Healthcare (GSK) announced its decision to temporarily suspend operations at its Dowlaiswaram plant in East Godavari district from Friday due to unrest in the state.

The GSK announcement came even as Samaikhya Andhra protesters ran amok in HSBC's BPO centre in Vishakhapatnam.

There has been some damage to the centre with glass panes broken but fortunately there have been no injuries.

Companies like Japanese pharma Sumo Eisai Pharmaceutical and Healthcare were forced to call off events. Eisai's president and CEO Haruo Naito was to fly down with a team of top company officials to unveil the company's Eisai Knowledge Centre in Vizag in the weekend but the opening was cancelled.

Nasscom has taken up the issue of protection of assets of IT firms in the state with the government. AP has created a name for itself internationally. Andhra Pradesh is home to leading global and domestic IT and ITeS players like Google, Microsoft, Computer Associates, Infosys, Wipro, Mahindra Satyam in addition to a host of pharmaceutical and biotech biggies.

JAC to intensify agitation for integrated State

An effort to synergise the series of agitations in support of a 'united Andhra Pradesh,' carried

out by various political parties, students and trade unions, and trade circles began here on Sunday with the formation of a Joint Action Committee.

Though the meeting was attended by leaders of all three major parties, the dominance of Telugu Desam was distinct with the presence of two former ministers, an MP and two MLAs, while the Congress was represented by a nominated chairman and secretaries of district cells.

A brief altercation between the Congress and TDP members over the remarks made by a student against the UPA Chairperson marred the meeting.

Man robbed of Rs 15L in Veraval, three held, Junagarh- Gujarat

The servant of a man who was looted of Rs 15 lakh in a moving bus on Wednesday has been arrested for plotting the loot along with two accomplices.

Gold trader Kantilal Choksi and his servant Parag Dave had boarded a private travels' bus from Ahmedabad for Veraval on the night of December 9. When they arrived in Veraval, Choksi found his bag containing jewellery worth Rs 15 lakh missing and lodged a complaint.

During his interrogation, Dave admitted to having hatched the theft conspiracy along with Amit Patel from Rajkot and Gulabshah Fakir from Limdi. Police arrested Amit, who revealed that the booty was kept with Gulabshah, following which, a team was sent to Limdi, where Gulabshah was arrested and the jewellery was recovered.

The trio had plotted the robbery in Ahmedabad from where they had boarded the bus along with the victim. When the bus reached Junagadh on Wednesday morning, Patel and Fakir stole the bag and boarded off the bus.

Violence breaks out in Anantapur- AP

The swelling discontent on the Telangana decision took a violent turn in Rayalaseema region on Saturday with Samaikhya Andhra agitators setting a BSNL godown on the outskirts of Anantapur town on fire while several students were injured in police lathicharge at Sri Krishnadevaraya University (SKU).

The godown located close to the university bore the brunt as the students poured petrol and

set it ablaze. Optic fibre cables, wires and other material stored in the godown were destroyed as the flames leapt up to a height of 25 ft with the strong winds blowing across the area. Fire services personnel fought hard to bring down the fire, while the cops dispersed the mobs. The BSNL officials said the godown suffered a loss of about Rs 2 crore.

Tension gripped the Itikyalapalli police station area near the SKU campus when thousands of students staged a rasta roko demanding immediate release of three students who were arrested earlier. The students ransacked the police station, pelted stones on the cops and forcibly took away the three students from the police custody.

Earlier, the police laticarged the protesting students near the main gate of the campus when they blocked the Chennai-Anantapur road and rained stones on them. Police cleared the road after caning the students.

TDP calls for bandh in Chittoor district today. AP

MLA and TDP district in-charge N. Amaranadh Reddy participated in the relay hunger strike conducted by the party activists' district unit at old Janata Bazaar on Prakasam road on Sunday. Talking to media persons he demanded that the Ministers belonging to Rayalaseema area resign forthwith and fight for the integrated State. Further he gave a call for Chittoor district bandh on Monday and urged the people to cooperate and observe the bandh and make it successful.
