Dense fog disrupts flight operations at IGI

After remaining free from fog for almost five days, flight operations were affected this morning as dense fog enveloped the IGI airport here disrupting the schedules of over 35 domestic and international flights.

About 25 international and domestic flights were delayed by up to two to three hours while 10 domestic flights to Agartala, Mumbai, Bhubaneswar, Pune, Chennai, Leh, Amritsar, Lucknow and Coimbatore were cancelled due to the fog, airport sources said.

The airport had witnessed shallow fog during the day yesterday, but it did not disrupt the flight movements as visibility was manageable and there was no problem in landing and take-off till late evening.

Women commuters unsafe in Mumbai local trains: Crime graph

Women commuters appear to be unsafe travelling in suburban trains, considered lifeline of Mumbai, with incidents of chain snatching and bag lifting showing an upward curve in 2009 compared to previous year.

Incidents of molestation also did not see any downfall as 12 cases were reported in 2009. In the previous year too the number of such cases was the same.

The annual crime rate, compiled in 2009 by Government Railway Police, show that 452 chain snatching incidents were reported in the suburban railway route compared to 429 cases in 2008. In these cases, most victims were women.

A total of 201 bag lifting cases were reported in 2009 as against 151 in 2008, police said adding that bag snatching or bag cutting incidents were seven in 2009 while 5 such cases were reported its previous year.

In the backdrop of crime graph showing an upward trend, particularly against women, Government Railway Police Commissioner Tukaram Chavan assured they were doing their best to ensure safe journey for the commuters.

Hi-tech racket in net banking busted

Officials of the Crime Branch CID on Tuesday busted a racket that allegedly stole personal information from the computer of an industrialist and took away Rs.26 lakh from his net banking account.

According to sources in the agency, the industrialist, S. Salahudeen, lodged a complaint with the Additional Director General of Police (CBCID) Archana Ramasundaram on November 5 that Rs.26.55 lakh was fraudulently transferred from his account through net banking in July and August last year. The Cyber Crime Cell police registered a case under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code and Information Technology Act, 2008.

Investigation revealed that the money was withdrawn through 19 transactions from the account of Mr. Salahudeen. When the server log of the victim's bank was scrutinised, it came to light that the hackers used computer systems connected to networks managed by Internet Service Providers of Nigeria, Canada, Israel, Poland and United Kingdom.

Gang of highway robbers busted

Police busted a gang of robbers who used to terrorise truckers across highways in Gujarat on Wednesday. Six persons were arrested and robbed goods worth Rs 10 lakh were recovered. For Kheda local crime branch (LCB) officials, the prized catch was Dipak Patel, kingpin of the gang.

It was investigations into a complaint registered at the Mehamdavad police station in Kheda district on August 30, 2009 that led to his development. A truck driver and his helper had been tied up by some goons and truck loaded with Rs 10 lakh worth of goods had been robbed.

Their modus operandi was brutal and effective: Any truck going through a deserted stretch of highway would be overtaken with a vehicle and forced to stop. The driver and his assistant would be beaten and left bound and gagged by side of the highway while the truck and its goods would be stolen. Robbers would then sell the goods and then abandoned the truck.

Demand For ST Status: Ethnic divide widens as Paharis intensify stir

Ethnic divide has widened further in the twin border districts of Poonch and Rajouri as the Pahari-speaking people have intensified their agitation for getting Scheduled Tribe (ST) status and the Gujjars, on the other hand, have stoutly opposed the demand.

Gujjars and Bakerwals were granted the status in 1991. After suspending their agitation for about two years, the Pahari-speaking people have once again revived their stir in support of their demand and this time they have decided to launch a decisive battle.

University on terror radar, say authorities

There are fears of a terrorist attack on the Jammu University campus, say varsity officers while talking about the presence of nearly 50 cops on the premises. Breaking their silence on several contentious issues, including the reported setting up of a police station or post on the campus, lack of action in marks tampering case and against colleges helping mass copying, three senior university officers said here yesterday at a press conference that the police guard was being provided only as there was an apprehension of a terror attack.

The police guards had been deployed and the post would have around 50 personnel, including a DSP, an Inspector, constables and others, said Ganai. However, the guards would be under the control and supervision of the university authorities. The expenditure on the police post would be borne by the government and not by the university. Cops would be deployed on the campus on a deputation basis.

Dacoits strike at treasury in Limkheda, loot ammunition

Dacoits made an audacious robbery attempt by targeting the district treasury and police armoury at Limkheda in Dahod district. The gang escaped with cartridges of .303 rifles used by the police and injured a Home Guard and a Gram Rakshak Dal (GRD) jawan posted to guard the treasury room and the armoury.

The robbers struck at around 1 am on Wednesday at the block that has the treasury, armoury and the guard room near deputy superintendent of police's office in Limkheda. The same compound has other important offices like that of the mamlatdar, a court and a lockup.

The gang of 20 to 25 dacoits came in the compound and started pelting stones indiscriminately. A Home Guard and a GRD jawan sustained minor injuries in the attack. Seeing the mob, other security personnel, including two policemen on guard duty, one Home Guard and a GRD jawan escaped from the spot.

First ritual bath at Mahakumbh mela begins- Haridwar, Uttaranchal

To the resonating sound of Vedic hymns, conch shells, cymbals and temple bells, the first 'snan', or holy dip, of the Mahakumbh Mela at Haridwar began in the early hours of Jan 14, the day when India celebrated the Makara Sankranti.

Thousands of pilgrims from India, and across the world, dipped into the achingly chilly waters of the holy river Ganga at Brahma Kund, an embanked stretch of the river just below the Shiva temple at the Har ki Pauri in the heart of the temple town on Thursday.
