### Lid off fuel adulteration, perfume rackets

The CBI has busted a fuel adulteration racket in the city and unearthed a scam in which fake perfume products were manufactured and supplied under well-known brand names. Hinting at the collusion of government officials, who were supposed to check such illegal practices, a CBI spokesperson said these crimes were organised economic scandals which were not possible without the involvement of these officials.

The units are in several places, including Vishnu Garden in Khyala, Bagh Kare Khan in Kishanganj, and Narsingh Garden in Khyala.

The total worth of seizure by the CBI runs into Rs 2 crore and the turnover of the business of the accused is about Rs 5 crore per year.

### Petrol pumps' strike today

All petrol pumps and CNG stations will be closed today after a strike call given by the Delhi NCR Diesel Petrol Pump Association in protest against the value added tax (VAT) imposed on diesel.

The VAT was imposed in the first week of May after the budget session of the Assembly was over. It had been announced by the Delhi finance minister, A. K. Walia.

There are 408 petrol pumps in Delhi, including 70 CNG stations. They will down their shutters from 6 am to the next day. If the government does not withdraw VAT, the association will close their pumps every Monday after May 24. If this does not work either, they may go on an indefinite strike, said acting president of the Diesel Petrol Pump Association, Ajay Bansal.

### Fire breaks out at mall under BMC scanner

A shopping complex in Oshiwara caught fire on Thursday morning. Incidentally, the three-storeyed Shangrila Hira Panna mall was under the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) scanner for violation of fire-safety rules.

The blaze, which started at 4.45 am, threatened to spread to the top floors, where several shop workers and employees were stranded on the terrace. But fire brigade personnel successfully rescued more than a dozen people, including an eight-year-old boy who was reportedly hiding there.

Thursday's fire capped over a dozen similar fires at malls or commercial centres in the last six months. Fire brigade officials have often complained that many of these establishments are virtual death traps. The last serious incident occurred at a Borivli (W) mall, where a fire brigade officer died in February this year.

### Three-day ATM strike this month

Brace for long queues at bank branches for three days as the Bengal Provincial Bank Employees' Association has decided to go for a three-day ATM strike later this month in Bengal.

It has called a shutdown on May 17, 28 and 29 demanding minimum wages notified by the Centre and eight-hours-a-day work for ATM contract employees. The ATMs of 14 PSU banks, including SBI, and five private sector banks are under the purview of the strike.

Some of the banks that will be affected are Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, PNB, Allahabad Bank, Central Bank, Union Bank, Bank of Maharashtra, United Bank of India, UCO Bank, Andhra Bank, Vijaya Bank, Bank of Rajasthan, Yes Bank, Federal Bank and Karur Vysya Bank. These banks have over 2,000 ATMs across the state and have over 4,000 contract employees.

### Traffic changes on Rajiv Gandhi Salai

The police have announced certain modifications in the vehicular movement between the Tidel Park junction and CSIR Road junction on Rajiv Gandhi Salai to ease traffic congestion.

Additional Commissioner of Police (Traffic) M. Ravi said the changes would be implemented on a trial basis and come into force from Friday. The changes would be in force only on week days.

According to a release, the traffic modification would be in force from 8.30 a.m. to 11 a.m. and between 5.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. As per the proposed changes, vehicles coming on Rajiv Gandhi Salai from Madhya Kailash junction and proceeding towards Taramani and Tidel Park would not be allowed to take a right turn into CSIR Road. They should go straight and take a 'U' turn at SRP Tools junction and take a left into CSIR Road.

Vehicles coming on CSIR Road and intending to proceed to Taramani will not be allowed to take a right turn at the Rajiv Gandhi Road-CSIR Road junction. They should take a left turn and proceed on Rajiv Gandhi Salai and take a 'U' turn at the Tidel Park junction and reach their destination.

#### **Fake currency gang busted**

#### **Rs 50L looted in train dacoity**

Armed goons looted passengers of 320 Giridih-Mughalsarai train between Phuljhar and Musmunda stations in Giridih district on Wednesday night. Cash and valuables worth Rs 50 lakh were looted and eight persons, including two railway staff, were injured in the incident.

Passengers said the train left Giridih station at around 11.20 pm and dacoits stopped it after 15 minutes at a place between Phuljhar and Musmunda stations under the Asansol railway division. The place is about 15 km from Giridih station. Passengers claimed some of the miscreants were already on board and others joined them when the train stopped. Numbering over 30, the goons went on a looting spree in all the compartments. The train had no police escort.

### **Car bomb kills 7 in Shiite area of Iraqi capital**

Iraqi officials say seven people were killed and 25 wounded when a parked car exploded near a cafe in the Sadr City slum in eastern Baghdad.
