### **BJP bandh a partial success**

BJP's Delhi bandh to protest against price rise and increase in bus and Metro fares was a partial success.

While a few market places were closed down on Friday, schools, government offices, banks and other institutions across the metropolis went about work normally.

There was no disruption of traffic in the capital with the Metro trains, buses and private vehicles plying normally. No incidents of violence were reported, according to the police.

### **250 more CISF men for Noida metro security**

At least 250 CISF personnel along with additional Quick Reaction Teams will provide security to the newly-inaugurated Metro train link to Noida. The 13.1 km long Yamuna Bank-Noida line, inaugurated on Thursday, has been made fully operational on Friday.

Securitymen guarding the new stations on the route will be equipped with sophisticated weapons and rescue devices to tackle any terrorist attack or siege.

### **Security beefed up for trade fair**

In the wake of large crowd expected to visit the International Trade Promotion Fair starting today, the Delhi traffic police has made elaborate arrangements around Pragati Maidan.

In order to avoid the hassle of parking around Pragati Maidan, motorists should park vehicles at pre-designated sites and avail free shuttle service to and from Pragati Maidan. The service will run at regular intervals. The area around Pragati Maidan would be a 'no parking zone'.

No vehicles will be allowed to be parked or wait on Mathura Road, Tilak Marg, Bhagwan Dass Road, Purana Quila Road, Bhairon Road, Shershah Road, Ring Road and 'C' Hexagon. Vehicles parked on these roads would be towed away besides being prosecuted and fined. The traffic police has deployed cranes to tow away such improperly parked vehicles.

The traffic police has appealed to the public to use Metro and buses to visit the trade fair. The Delhi police has made elaborate security and crime prevention arrangements for the fair. Adequate anti-sabotage and anti-terrorist measures are being implemented at parking lots, entry gates and important pavilions. Observation towers are being put to prevent chain-snatching, pickpocketing, eve-teasing and molestation and also to keep watch on the activities of suspicious persons.

Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) will run special buses from various locations in Delhi and also neighbouring districts of other states like Ghaziabad, Faridabad, Gurgaon, Noida and Greater Noida. Temporary DTC terminals will function at Kasturba Gandhi Marg Radial Road at India Gate and Bhairon Road.

#### **Gang slits bank staffers' throats**

Five employees of United Bank of India's Karimpur branch in Nadia, awaiting a major transaction late on Thursday, were attacked by a gang of robbers who slit their throats but strangely did not take any money. Four of them bled to death including two staffers, a sweeper and a generator operator. The bank's deputy manager survived but is in critical condition.

Police believe it is the work of professional killers but they are yet to establish a motive for the attack. "All the cuts on the throat were no more than 3.5-inch deep, suggesting the assailants were experts at this," said an officer. The Maoists were initially suspected, but then investigation pointed to either a Bangladeshi gang or a band of locals. The motive, apparently, was to loot some loan documents.

#### **Security stepped up at defence establishments**

#### **Criminals lob bombs, loot cash and valuables**

In a daring operation, armed criminals exploded countrymade bombs and looted cash and

other valuables from four houses at Bhadaur village under Chainpur police outpost late on Thursday night in Siwan district.

Police said over a dozen armed criminals barged into the houses of Durga Giri, Manager Giri, Sunayana Giri and Mudda Giri, all located in a row, at Bhadaur village late on Thursday night. The criminals also exploded bombs to scare away the villagers and then collected cash, jewellery and other valuables worth Rs 2 lakh from there.

#### **Kidnapped girl rescued unharmed**

In a record setting investigation, Lucknow police worked out a kidnapping case within six hours of it being reported, rescued the 5-year-old victim, Shiza and arrested four youngsters aged about 20 years and their woman associate for the crime. The woman in question — Nagma — happened to be a friend of Shiza's mother, Shaheen. The kidnapers had demanded a ransom of Rs 35 lakh for safe release of the girl.

Despite the police action coming so swiftly, by the time the victim could be rescued, she had been shifted to Para Bazar village in the interiors of Sultanpur district some 170 km from the state capital. Investigators said that some more names have figured during the course of investigations and more arrests were likely in the case soon.

#### **Furniture store gutted**

Furniture, mattresses and other articles worth several lakhs of rupees were gutted in a fire that broke out at the Gem Furniture showroom on Madhya Marg in Sector 7 here yesterday afternoon. About 70 employees who were there managed to escape unhurt before the flames spread to the entire showroom. The fire started around 1:30 pm in the workshop located at the rear of the furniture store.

Though firemen manage to bring the blaze under control after fighting it for over three hours, it kept on smoldering even eight hours after it started. Though the employees of the showroom claimed the fire was caused by a spark from a shop adjacent to theirs, where ironsmiths were cutting a girder using gas welding and other equipment, the owner of Gem Furniture, Suresh Bhatia, ruled this out, saying the shop in question was situated at a distance.

Fire department officials said they were not sure about what had caused the fire. They said

the blaze spread in no time as the workshop was packed to its capacity with combustible materials, including thinner, sprit, varnish polish, upholstery, wood and petroleum-based foam stuffed in mattresses.

The fire could be have triggered by a short circuit as the makeshift structures housing the workshop had loose electricity wirings.

### **4 more down with swine flu**

With four more people including two doctors from Government Medical College & Hospital, Sector 32 and two students of St Anne's Convent School, Sector 32, testing positive for the H1N1 virus, the total number of confirmed swine flu cases in the city has gone up to 93.

With the infection now spreading to other classes, the St Anne's authorities have decided to close the school for a week following instructions issued by UT health department officials.

The other positive cases were reported from GMCH-32. Two female doctors from the hospital's medicine department developed flu symptoms and tested positive for the virus today.

### **SRTC staff threaten 'unusual protest'**

The agitating SRTC employees yesterday gave an ultimatum of November 16 to the state government for fulfilling their demands, failing which they would resort to an 'unusual protest', the details of which would be discussed later.

The command council of the SRTC employees, comprising representatives from all three regions of the state, held a meeting today and decided to give the government time till Monday. "It was decided to hold an unusual protest. We stand united and will continue to fight for justice," said Shakeel Ahmed Kuchay, chairman of the JKSRTC Workers Union.

Without giving details of the ‘unusual protest’, Kuchay said, “We won’t disclose the details of the protest. But it would be unusual. Like yesterday we surprised the authorities by reaching near the Civil Secretariat.”

It was also decided at the meeting that if the government failed to fulfil their demands, they would march towards New Delhi and hold a protest outside Parliament or Red Fort. “We have asked for a list of employees who are willing to march on foot to New Delhi,” Kuchay said.

#### **United States to seize mosques, skyscraper of Iran-linked group**

US federal prosecutors said on Thursday they were moving to seize four mosques and a 36-story New York skyscraper from a non-profit Muslim group suspected of having ties to the

Iranian government.

The Alavi Foundation has been providing numerous services such as "money laundering offenses" including the illegal funneling of funds to the Iranian government, according to the office of US Attorney for the Southern District of New York Preet Bharara.

Bharara filed a forfeiture action with a New York federal court to seize bank accounts owned by the group and a suspected front company, as well as the office tower and Islamic centers in the states of Maryland, Virginia, Texas and California.

### **Taliban target creator, blow up ISI jihad lab**

Mad that parts of the very institution that created it had now turned against the Taliban, Islamist suicide bombers on Friday completely destroyed the headquarters of the powerful Inter-Services Intelligence in Peshawar that was once the laboratory of jihad run by Pakistan army officers.

Taliban terrorists blew up an explosives-laden truck outside the three-story building on Khyber Road that leads to the gateway to Afghanistan and central Asia through which the ISI pushed in combatants, weapons and explosives for years to help its erstwhile ally, the Afghan Taliban to capture Kabul finally in 1996.

The dawn attack at 6.40am, the 19th in Peshawar in five months, razed the building to rubble. It was not clear how many security personnel were inside the building when the bomber struck on the road leading to the Khyber Pass just before the city's rush-hour.
