2 held with fake notes worth Rs 2.1 lakh

In one of the biggest hauls of counterfeit Indian currency in the country, the Chennai city police on Monday seized fake notes with a face value of Rs 2 lakh from two men hailing from West Bengal. They were trying to buy fruits from Zaam Bazaar market when they were caught. One more person who was with them escaped.

The Zaam Bazaar police on Monday afternoon nabbed Shajahan (35) and Shahin UI (38) from Malda district in West Bengal for possessing fake currency notes of Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 denomination. While there are doubts if the notes were smuggled across the Bangladesh border, it is yet to be ascertained if the notes are of foreign origin.

Increase in cases of viral fever, diarrhea

For most doctors, particularly paediatricians, the last three months of the year in the city usually mean more patients with fever.

The fever, cough and cold is usually accompanied by severe pain in the joints. Doctors say that the high grade fever lasts for about three days and joint pains for at least a week. The season also brings in stomach infection that causes severe stomach ache and loose stools.

Pediatricians across the city say they have seen a 30% increase in outpatient cases and an equally high number of cases admitted. Nearly 60% of the total admissions in hospitals are due to viral fever or diahorrea, say doctors. Hospitals are overflowing with patients.

Telangana row: Bus services hit

Thousands of people who travel between Chennai and parts of Andhra Pradesh were stuck as bus services by the State Express Transport Corporation, Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Villupuram) and the Andhra Pradesh State Transport Corporation (APSRTC) remained suspended for the fifth day on Monday.

The fear of damage to the buses in the wake of the Telangana turmoil was cited as the reason for the suspension of services.

The police resorted to lathi-charge to disperse them. However, as one group disappeared another team of BJP activists arrived. The 's Task Force police had to use force thrice to disperse them. Tension escalated as protestors while running away pelted stones at the police while supporters of the MP stood in a corner and raised pro-united Andhra Pradesh slogans.

Medic stir threatens to cripple health services in state

Health services are likely to collapse across Orissa on Friday as over 2,500 doctors from nearly 1,700 health organizations have threatened to go on a cease work. They are agitating under the banner of Orissa Medical Service Association (OMSA).

They have reiterated their demands for implementation of Dynamic Assured Career Progression (DACP), which is a defined promotion structure, and have also decided to repeat their caveat for a mass resignation to protest the government's apathy.

Call for bandh in valley today

While the Majlis-e-Mushawarat has called for a general strike in Kashmir today against the CBI report on the alleged rape and murder of two Shopian women, separatist organisations have extended support to the bandh call.

Two Hizb commanders killed in J&K

Security forces killed two 'commanders' of the Hizb-ul-Mujahideen in a fierce gunfight in Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir, the police said on Monday.

On a tipoff, a party of the police and the Army launched an operation on Friday night in the Chamal-Chilli area. An encounter took place when militants fired on the party.

The two slain militants were identified as Yasir Ahmed alias Mubasher and Mustaq Ahmed alias Tallah. Both were commanders of the Hizb-ul-Mujahideen, troops also recovered two AK rifles and other explosives from them.

Rs 9.42 lakh looted in broad daylight, Surat- Gujarat

In daring daylight loot, two employees of a textile mill were looted of Rs 9.42 lakh on Monday afternoon. Ironically, they were looted in front of BRC police chowki in Udhna.

Police said victims Jitendra Ramvat, a collection clerk and his colleague Mukesh Rajpurohit are employees of Sumit Silk Mill in Pandesara. They had withdrawn the money from Bank of Baroda, Udhna Udyog Nagar branch, meant for the salary of employees. The duo was on a bike and carrying the money in a leather bag.

As the victims were passing by BRC chowki, two persons came from behind on a bike and one of them jumped on the victims. They managed to snatch the bag away and sped away from the spot. According to the victims, the robbers fled towards Sachin on Udhna main road.

The mill is owned by Mahesh Somani. A search operation to nab the unidentified robbers has begun.

Law & Order**Two attacks kill 16 Afghan policemen**

At least 16 policemen were killed in two attacks by insurgents in Afghanistan on Monday. The first attack took place in Baghlan Markazi district of the northern province of Baghlan early Monday, when a group of insurgents began "firing at the checkpoint from all sides", Mohammad Akbar Barekzai, the provincial governor, said.

The checkpoint had been recently erected on the main highway linking Baghlan to

neighbouring Kunduz province to provide security for NATO convoys in the area, he said.

One militant was also killed and another was wounded in the pre-dawn raid, said Ahmad Jan, a senior police official in the province. He said the militants also captured a police Ranger vehicle and seized some weapons.
