Two men bend, duped of money

Think before you bend! Two people were robbed of money and valuables after some crooks fooled them by drawing their attention to the money strewn on the ground.

In the two incidents reported from different parts of the Capital, the criminals robbed drivers of two businessmen of Rs 1,15,000 and some valuables using this modus operandi in New Delhi and south district area. Police lodged FIRs in both the cases.

The first incident was reported from the Hauz Khas area of south district yesterday.

Anurag Gupta, a businessman of UP, had come to attend a business meeting in the area. He left his briefcase containing Rs 25,000 and a passport and some other valuables in his car and told his driver Sarvesh to wait. However, when he returned, his briefcase was missing.

His driver said that when he was waiting for Anurag, a man told him that his money had fallen on the road. He got off to retrieve about 20 currency notes of Rs 10 denomination strewn around the car. When he was picking up the notes, he heard a thud from the rear of the car, but did not see anything.

Similar incident was reported from the Barakhamba Road area of New Delhi district yesterday evening.

The victim, Rakesh Duggal, a businessman of south Delhi, had come to Inderprakash building to meet someone when his laptop, Rs 90,000 and other valuables were stolen from his car. His driver told the police that he was alone in the car when a person signalled to him to look under the car.

When he looked, he found some notes were lying on the road. As he alighted from the car, some unknown persons stole the bag containing money, laptop and passport.

Servant hired two days ago steals Rs 30,000 from hotel

A servant and his two friends fled with Rs 30,000 from a hotel at Paharganj in central Delhi early on Thursday morning. The servant was hired on Tuesday and the hotel had not informed police before employing him.

The police said Rajan Kumal was hired by Thawani Palace through a reference. On Thursday, the help entered the hotel on the pretext of needing some keys. He was accompanied by two persons. The hotel staff allowed him to enter as he was known to them. Few minutes later, Kumal took the money lying in the cash counter. When the staff tried to stop him, his friends allegedly beat them up. A hunt is on to nab the trio.

Disabled man duped scores, held

The Parksite police recently arrested a physically challenged man and his accomplice for allegedly duping 31 people after promising to double their investment in six months.

The accused had opened Yash Marketing Private Limited, a well-furnished office at Vikhroli and floated an investment scheme on January 1. Within a week, the duo managed to collect Rs 15.5 lakh from victims in Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and Thane.

Investigators said the accused duo—Santosh Agavne (31) and Rajesh Jadav (42)—convinced the investors that they were going to invest the money in cattle business, dairy farms, agricultural development and schools and the profits earned through it would be used to pay the investors.

Their modus operandi was, if an investor deposited Rs 5,000, they promised him a return of Rs 100 in the first week. It increases every week by Rs 100. If the investment is more, then the returns are higher.

7 killed in stampede at Gangasagar

Seven Gangasagar pilgrims, including a three-year-old boy, were crushed to death in a stampede on a jetty in Kakdwip early Thursday morning. At least a dozen were injured. Most of the victims are elderly women from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Haryana.

Lack of proper crowd control measures is said to have caused the accident. Only a bamboo barricade stood between the crowd and the jetty. It crumbled when a few thousand pilgrims surged to board a boat at 4.10 am.

Oz virus may be spreading in Tamil Nadu

The 'mysterious fever' being reported from different parts of Tamil Nadu, including the capital Chennai, could be Ross River fever, caused by a virus of that name hitherto confined to Australia, scientists here suspect.

While the Chennai Corporation has sent details of clinical symptoms to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Atlanta, the Bioinformatics Centre of the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) attached to Presidency College has placed orders for diagnostic kits with Australian manufacturers.

Several people in Chennai, Tiruvallur, Dharmapuri, Madurai, Theni, Tirunelveli and some coastal areas have taken ill in the recent weeks with symptoms of chikungunya, including high grade fever and joint pain, but many of them tested negative for it. Scientists now say it could be Ross River fever. The virus, spread by the aedes mosquito, may have been brought by infected people who arrived from Australia.

Swelling of the face and severe inflammation of joints are tell-tale signs of Ross River fever, though sometimes it could be mistaken for chikungunya.

Two ultras, jawan killed

Two militants of the Hizbul Mujahideen, including a self-styled district commander, and a security forces jawan were killed and two others injured in an encounter in the Ahrabal area of Kulgam district today.

Bird flu confirmed, culling starts in Murshidabad, West Bengal

Murshidabad's Khargram block has come under the grip of bird flu. The Animal Disease Laboratory (ADL) in Bhopal has confirmed that two hens from the block died of the H5N1 (avian influenza) virus, commonly known as bird flu. District administration has started culling operation from Thursday night.

SDO (Kandi) Utpal Bhadra confirmed that serum samples of two birds from Nagar and Hazrabati villages, sent to the Bhopal laboratory, had tested positive.

The culling operations started in a 3-km radius of Nagar and Hazrabati villages from Thursday evening.
