Naxal-hit states to form unified commands

Faced with a surge in Maoist violence, the four worst-hit states -- Chhattisgarh, Orissa, West Bengal and Jharkhand -- agreed to form unified commands for anti-Naxal operations.

The decision came at the meeting of chief ministers and representatives of Naxal-affected states as Prime Minister Manmohan Singh asked them to remain "united" and not let "inter-personal issues" come in the way of strategy to tackle the issue.

The Centre offered these four and three other Naxal-hit states which attended the deliberations -- Bihar, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh -- more helicopters, logistical support and financial assistance for the task aimed at stepping up the 'offensive' in a better way.

Currently, similar commands exist in insurgency-hit Jammu & Kashmir and Assam. The unified commands are basically created to ensure better synergy and coordination, command and control among different security forces operating in a region against a common threat.

Chlorine leak in Mumbai port area sparks panic

The leakage of chlorine gas at the Mumbai Port Trust (MbPT) warehouse at Hay Bunder near Sewri sent waves of panic among thousands of residents and port workers who woke up in the wee hours of Wednesday morning to breathlessness, nausea and coughing fits.

More than 120 people —including students of a nearby maritime college, labourers, port workers, and fire-fighters involved in rescue operations — were admitted to various city hospitals. Seventeen of those affected were in a critical condition at the time of going to press. The impact of the leak was so deadly that flora and fauna in the vicinity turned white, said officials.

Chlorine is a hazardous element. Sustained exposure to it at high concentrations can lead to corrosion of lung linings and skin.

Andheri jeweller shot at in showroom

Three unidentified persons shot at the manager of Mahesh Notandass Jewellers in Lokhandwala, Andheri (West), on Wednesday afternoon. Prashant Chhabria, 42, was hit in the abdomen. He was rushed to a nearby private hospital, and is believed to be out of danger.

According to the police, the men who shot Chhabria are reportedly from the underworld and the jeweller was receiving extortion calls since the past two to three months. This is the third incident of firing in the western suburbs in the last two months.

H1N1 panic grips city again

The H1N1 flu panic peaked during July and August last year. It's that time of the year again, it seems. With the virus gaining strength again, many flu cases are on a steady rise across the state.

At Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Chest Diseases (RGICD), of 41 suspected patients, four were tested positive for H1N1 flu in May. In June, of 83 suspected patients screened, eight were positive. This month, at least 30 patients have been screened and four are found to be H1N1 flu positive.

Terrorist held in Secunderabad

The Andhra Pradesh police on Wednesday arrested terror operative Viqaruddin Ahmed, who was on the run for more than two years after masterminding the killing of a home guard and a constable in the city.

On information that he was moving around in disguise, the police nabbed him when he came to a roadside shop to buy vegetables at Padmaraonagar in Secunderabad.

The police were on the lookout for Viqaruddin ever since he went underground immediately after the Mecca Masjid blast here in May 2007. He narrowly avoided arrest on December 3, 2008, after firing at two policemen. He is also believed to be behind the fatal attacks on policemen at Falaknuma on May 18, 2009 and May 14, 2010.

Bomb threats put cops on the edge

A threat call stating a powerful bomb would explode at Buddha Bhavan and Jal Vihar on Necklace Road put police on tenterhooks on Wednesday. With the city witnessing the arrest of criminal Viqaruddin and four others during the day, police did not want to take any chances and sprang into action.

Pistol-wielding miscreants rob youths of car

However, when the two hesitated to give the key, the accused fired shots near Preet's feet to terrorise them and fled the spot taking away the car towards Ramgarh. However, Preet immediately found his mobile nearby and informed his parents about the incident. The parents further informed the police that immediately reached the spot.
