Security alert after Jaish threat to blow up trains

The Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terror outfit may be planning to blow up trains bound to religious places in India, triggering a security alert at Dhanbad railway division, officials said Monday.

A general alert has been sounded at some railway divisions, including Dhanbad, about Jaish-e-Mohammed's threat to blow up trains bound to religious places.

K.S. Upadhaya, divisional railway manager of Dhanbad railway division, said: "We have alerted the security forces and also appeal to passengers to be cautious while travelling and not to touch unclaimed objects."

Trains like Baidnath Dham Intercity Express and Hatia-Jammu Tawi Express pass through Dhanbad.

The alert follows a threat letter last month to Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MP from Gorakhpur Yogi Aditya Nath and the head priest of Lucknow's Mankameshwar temple, Divya Giri. The letter sent through speed post was attributed to JeM, the terror outfit blamed for the 2001 parliament attack.

Night trains on certain routes suspended

In the wake of a two-day bandh call by the CPI (Maoist), the railways have further suspended running of trains at night on certain routes, besides initiating other safety measures.

Night movement of trains on the Kharagpur-Tata Nagar and Kharagpur-Adra sections were suspended till June 18, while on other routes of the South-Eastern Railway (SER), the speed has been restricted to 75 kmph at night. Several trains under the SER zone were also diverted.

In the case of Eastern Railway, the speed on various routes has been restricted to 50 kmph at night.

Armed robbery in house of Rohini trader

Three armed assailants entered a businessman's house in sector 11, Rohini, and made away with cash and jewellery worth Rs 8 lakh.

The incident comes two days after a robbery and a burglary was reported from sector 15. The incident was reported around 11.45am on Monday after assailants fled with cash and jewellery within half an hour.

Businessmen pose as CBI cops to con victims in Mumbai

Even the police were surprised when they unravelled an ingenious con job and found that it had been executed by — not some penniless youth — but by two extremely well-off businessmen and an employee of one of them. The three posed as sleuths from the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and extorted money from victims to ‘settle deals’.

Their game was, however, neatly wrapped up by the Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) after one of their victims decided to approach the real police.

The accused have been identified as Prasanna Mehta, a businessman, his employee Sashank Dinkar and Suryakanth Helkar, a retired Air Force captain who also owns five companies in Pune. They were arrested for demanding Rs15 lakh from the complainant, a software businessman. The trio has been remanded in police custody till June 19.

Clashes in Srinagar, Hurriyat leaders put under house arrest

At least 25 people, including 10 policemen, were injured on Monday in clashes between stone pelting youths protesting against the killing of teenager and police in several parts of the city even as several Hurriyat leaders were put under house arrest ahead of their planned march.

Police fired tear gas shells and used batons on youths who pelted stones and bricks on them in Saidakadal, the native place of 17-year-old Tufail Ahmad Mattoo whose death in a clash between security forces and stone pelting protesters last week has sparked protests in the Valley, and other areas.

Clashes also occurred in Rainawari, Bemina, Kralpora and Tengpora areas, official sources said, adding 25 people including ten policemen were injured in the violence.

People also took out processions against the killing of Mattoo in Anantnag town of south Kashmir, Baramulla and Sopore towns of north Kashmir but the protesters dispersed peacefully.

Forces gun down 10 Maoists

Jharkhand police on Monday claimed to have gunned down 10 Maoists in an encounter at Gerai village in West Singhbhum district on Saturday. State director-general of police Neyaz Ahmed said although 10 CPI-Maoist cadres have been killed, their bodies were yet to be found.

The police claimed to have busted a training camp of the CPI-Maoists. However, the manner in which the operation was conducted has raised eyebrows. According to reports, at least 300 suspected Maoists, including some of their top leaders from Andhra and West Bengal, managed to escape.

Troops on way, Naga students ease Manipur blockade

Even as the Centre announced dispatch of paramilitary forces to break the two-month-old blockade of national highways in Manipur that has crippled life and created a humanitarian crisis, the Naga Students' Federation (NSF), after meeting PM Manmohan Singh on Monday, declared "temporary" suspension of the siege from 6 pm on Tuesday.

The blockades on NH-39 (Imphal-Dimapur) and NH-53 (Imphal-Silchar) have pushed Manipur on the verge of a breakdown, with stocks of essential commodities, including baby

food and life-saving drugs, drying up. Before the siege, around 300 to 400 trucks carrying essentials plied on the highways everyday.

Violence strikes Kenya again ahead of referendum

Kenyan leaders on Monday traded accusations over blasts that killed six people at a rally, as an all-too-familiar whiff of political violence engulfed the run-up to a key constitutional referendum.

Two blasts late Sunday at a gathering of supporters of the "No" campaign and an ensuing stampede left six people dead and dozens wounded, police said, in the worst such incident since 2007-2008 post-election chaos.
