### Games lane restrictions to be lifted

Soon after the Commonwealth Games closing ceremony on Thursday, the traffic police plan to open all the restrictions on Games lanes except the route connecting the Commonwealth Games Village and the airport via Chanakyapuri which will be blocked till October 16.

The traffic police have already started opening the Games lanes on roads where movement of athletes is no longer seen. On Wednesday, for instance, the stretch from Rajghat to Delhi University was opened for all traffic after the rugby competitions ended a day earlier. The shooting events are also expected to conclude on Wednesday after which Games lanes restrictions on the route will be lifted.

The traffic police will also start allowing movement of commercial vehicles in the city during the day. Such vehicles were restricted on city roads for the duration of the Games to lessen the volume of traffic. Certain roads, especially those in the vicinity of the Games venues, have been made out of bounds for goods vehicles. From October 15, the movement of all categories of vehicles will resume as usual. The traffic police department is planning to enforce lane driving strictly and deploy more men on the roads after additional forces were given to it for the Games.

### 1 more dengue death in Gt Noida

In Dadri, where a large number of dengue patients are heading to hospitals, doctors have noticed a fast change in symptoms during the last fortnight. Skin, eyes and joints appear to be adversely affected. Initially, the symptoms had even confused the doctors, but tests have confirmed them as dengue cases. Besides, six persons have died of viral infection, dengue and malaria in the recent past.

### **Traffic diversion for Bathukamma fete**

Traffic will be stopped or diverted on some routes in the city from 4 to 10 p.m. on Friday in connection with the Saddula Batukamma festival.

### **Karbala Maidan**

At Karbala Maidan, vehicles coming from Ranigunj and proceeding towards Ambedkar statue will not be allowed towards Sailing Club. They will be diverted at Karbala Maidan towards Bansilalpet 'Y' junction (Bible House) towards Kavadi guda junction, lower Tank Bund, Katta Maisamma temple, Ambedkar statue and Liberty.

At Ambedkar statue: Traffic going from Ambedkar statue to Secunderabad would be allowed only on right half of the Tank Bund road up to Karbala Maidan.

### **Barricades**

Barricades would be put on Tank Bund road earmarking left half of the Tank Bund road for Bathukamma procession, the traffic police said.

At Bansilalpet 'Y' junction (Bible House): Traffic from Ghansmandi to Upper Tank Bund would not be allowed towards Karbala Maidan and would be diverted at Bansilalpet 'Y' junction (Bible House) towards Kavadiguda junction.

#### **Normalcy returns to Valley**

Normalcy returned to the Kashmir valley yesterday with the hardline faction of the Hurriyat Conference led by Syed Ali Geelani not giving a strike call even as restrictions continued in the Delina and Palhalan areas of Baramulla district.

Shops and business establishments were open and there was a heavy traffic on roads. Attendance in government offices, educational institutions, banks and private offices was normal. There were traffic jams in different areas of the city, including Lal Chowk, and near the Srinagar bypass, connecting the South and North Kashmir areas through Central Srinagar.

It was after two days' bandh that normal life was restored in the Valley. The last normal working day was on Monday which was followed by strict curfew restrictions on Tuesday to prevent the "Hyderpora Chalo" march of the Hurriyat Conference. A complete bandh was observed in the Valley yesterday.

With shoppers thronging markets and students, employees and workers attending educational institutions and going to their places of work, a heavy rush was witnessed in market places.

Pakistani police arrested a group of Islamist militants who were plotting to kill the Prime Minister and other top government officials.		
The conspiracy against Prime Minister Yousaf Raza Gilani was "almost complete," said Abid Qadri, a regional police chief. He said the militants were planning to attack Gilani when he traveled to his hometown of Multan, but gave no more details.		
Militants in Pakistan have frequently attacked government officials, security officers and political leaders as part of a campaign to destabilize the US-allied government and take over the state. Opposition leader Benazir Bhutto was killed in a gun-and-bomb attack near Islamabad in 2007.
