Railways beef up security at stations in capital

The Delhi division of Indian Railways has been instructed by both the home and railway ministries to step up security at railway stations and on trains travelling to Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Bihar, and UP after a high-intensity bomb was found in a sleeper coach of Delhi-bound UP Sampark Kranti Express.

Special emphasis will be paid to the security of Rajdhani and Sampark Krantis as the Bhubaneswar Rajdhani was targeted, twice, by ultra-Left elements in the recent past.

The bomb in the UP Sampark Kranti Express was discovered at Mahoba railway station in UP and later defused, North Central Railway officials said on Thursday. "A high-intensity bomb was found in the S-2 coach of the UP Sampark Kranti train at Mahoba railway station on Wednesday night," UP principal secretary (home) Kunwar Fateh Bahadur and director-general of police Karamveer Singh said.

The incident comes days after Maoists threatened to target trains more often.

Faridabad pump manager shot at

A petrol pump manager was seriously injured when at least five masked assailants attacked him inside the petrol pump in an attempt to loot the establishment on Wednesday night. The incident was reported near the Bhabola village near Faridabad on NH-2 on the Delhi-Mathura Highway. The victim — Dinesh — was rushed to the Escorts Hospital.

Man stabbed, robbed of Rs 13 lakh

A 35-year-old man was beaten and stabbed in the leg when he tried to resist three robbers who snatched Rs 12.90 lakh from him in Greater Kailash Part-II around 1pm on Thursday.

The victim has been identified as Kishan Lal, an employee of one Karni Telecom Private Limited. The firm is an authorized dealer of Tata Indicom phones.

He was going to the GK-II branch of Corporation Bank when three men on motorcycle started following him.

He was few metres away from the bank when the robbers waylaid him. When he resisted, they hit him with a country-made pistol and stabbed him on the left leg.

Fire in factory

A factory manufacturing coir mattress in Sahibabad caught fire yesterday morning. Goods worth several lakhs were gutted. However, there was no loss of life. Some people sustained injuries due to commotion and panic.

Leakage in the cooking gas cylinder led to the blaze.

The incident was reported from Khanna Coir factory in Sahibabad industrial area around 8 am today. Eight fire-engines from Sahibabad, Ghaziabad and Noida were pressed into service. The firemen took over two hours to extinguish the blaze.

UK airspace closed; Air India postpones flights

Kingfisher Airlines and Jet Airways on Thursday cancelled their flights to London while Air India postponed its services to Toronto and London which were to take off tonight as airspace was closed over several North European airports due to drifting ash from a volcano in Iceland.

While Kingfisher cancelled all its flights to London from Mumbai and Delhi for today, Jet cancelled two flights from the two Indian metropolises and one from London to Delhi.

Three killed in Santa Cruz blaze

Three men were charred to death when a fire gutted an 'illegal' garment warehouse in the congested area of Khotwadi, Santa Cruz (W) in the wee hours of Thursday. The victims—Ramdev Dhala (22), Pappu Vaidya (22) and Ramesh Kavatra (20)—all in their youth, hailed from a middleclass family at Rajkot in Gujarat and had migrated to Mumbai a few years ago to learn the ropes of the family-run garment business. Officials and eye-witnesses say the fire started around 4 am.

The fire brigade arrived 20 minutes after the alert was sounded, but was unable to save the youth who were trapped on the first floor of the structure. Three men who also worked at the warehouse were sleeping on the ground floor, and were rescued by locals. But the cries of help from the victims trapped on the first floor haunt the rescuers.

Hideout busted in Kishtwar

The security forces last evening busted a hideout of militants in a jungle in Kishtwar district and recovered arms and ammunition.

The troops of the Rashtriya Rifles busted the hideout in the Tandar forest in Kishtwar district and recovered two UBGL launchers, 10 UBGL rounds, a Chinese grenade, one RPG round, one detonator, 20 rounds of AK rifle and one safety fuse. Sources claimed that Lashkar-e-Toiba's district commander Dawood Ahmed had been using the hideout before being shot dead last month.

Robbers shoot at youth, loot Rs 3.44L, Nagpur

Brazen miscreants fired two rounds at a 24-year-old youth and fled with Rs 3.44 lakh cash on Thursday afternoon in an incident that sent chills down the spine of people at Kalamna, one of the main commercial centres of the city.

Rajesh Bhujade, a temporary help with a grain merchant, was shot twice around 1.15 pm by the motorcycle-borne youths who sped off with the cash as the victim lay hurt. Bhujade had just withdrawn the cash from Punjab National Bank branch at Pardi Naka. He is a bachelor and normally does not handle huge amounts of cash.

The incident brought back memories of murder of Lakhotia brothers on Central Avenue. The robbers had fired on businessmen and took away huge amounts of cash from their office some years back. Kalamna police, along with crime branch, have swung into action. Police feel someone must have tipped-off the miscreants. Bhujade did not handle cash on a regular basis nor was regularly entrusted with banking transactions.

At least 24 people were killed and many wounded in three explosions at a new year water festival in the former Myanmar capital of Yangon on Thursday.

The government has not blamed any group or indicated the cause of the explosions. There were no immediate claims of responsibility.

The junta has in the past blamed bombings on anti-government dissident groups and separate ethnic rebels seeking autonomy in the country that has been under military rule since 1962.

Witnesses said they heard three loud explosions at a pavilion alongside Kandawgyi Lake. Hospital sources said 24 people had died.
