Gzb double murder solved

Police here have claimed to have solved the double murder case in which a 55-year-old woman, Sangeeta Mukherjee, and her three-year-old granddaughter, Manyata, were found killed at their residence in Pratap Nagar on Wednesday night. Police have detained three men allegedly involved in the case. Police said that "personal enmity" was the reason behind the murders.

The accused are being questioned, police said, adding the main suspect in the case is believed to be a resident of Masuri in Ghaziabad and is a close acquaintance of the Mukherjee family.

Howrah trader shot dead

A businessman was shot dead by a group of criminals in Howrah on Thursday. Tapan Samanta, 32, was the owner of a small jewellery shop at Shibpur's Dalapukur.

According to local residents, three youths arrived in front of Samanta's shop at 6pm. Soon, an altercation broke out between them and Samanta. After some time, the youths left the spot.

After two hours, the same group returned. They took called Samanta to Kedar Bhattacharya Lane, close to his shop. There, the youths shot him thrice from point blank range. Samanta died on the spot and the assailants fled on motorcycles. The commotion alerted locals, who found Samanta in a pool of blood. The incident happened near MLA Jagannath Bhattacharya's residence.

GJM sets deadline for fresh agitation

The Gorkha Janamukti Morcha (GJM) leadership has said it will intensify the agitation for a separate State if the next round of tripartite talks on its demand is not held by July 23.

It plans to call a 40-day bandh in the Darjeeling Hills from early next month.

In a show of strength, two days after a rally by the Democratic Front, consisting of regional parties opposed to it, the GJM organised a public meeting in Kalimpong on

Wednesday, addressed by its president Bimal Gurung.

Mr. Gurung outlined the agitation plans in the event of the Centre and the State government failing to convene the sixth round of talks “either on July 22 or July 23.”

Swine flu back in Kolkata, minister among 12 ill

Swine flu has hit Kolkata yet again, this time probably in a mutated form. Twelve patients have tested positive for the H1N1 virus in the last 11 days, including minister Nandagopal Bhattacharya. Three tested positive on Thursday itself.

Last year, swine flu struck in the height of summer. This time, it has come during (the delayed) monsoon. The worrying aspect this year is that the virus seems to have originated locally, unlike in 2009 when it was brought into the country by travellers from North America and South-East Asia.

Time for caution, not panic

Much as the health authorities would have wished otherwise, A(H1N1) is indeed here again. And, gearing up to meet this challenge, authorities have this catchline for the public, “It is the time for caution, not panic.”

The same precautions that were advised last time have to be followed again. As the WHO has advised, “the main route of transmission of the pandemic influenza virus seems to be similar to seasonal influenza, via droplets that are expelled by speaking, sneezing or coughing.”

Therefore one can prevent getting infected by taking the following measures: avoiding crowds, keeping your distance from people who show symptoms of influenza-like illness, such as coughing and sneezing; cleaning hands with soap and water regularly; avoiding touching the mouth, nose and eyes; and practising good health habits (including adequate sleep, eating nutritious food, and keeping physically active).

What is new this time around is the vaccine. With potent vaccines emerging in the market, including indigenous vaccines manufactured within the country, there is a great potential to control the infection.

Woman tests positive for swine flu

A 35-year-old woman from Gandhinagar has tested positive for swine flu, district health authorities on Thursday informed.

Doctors have informed that the positive woman is in home quarantine and stable.

Meanwhile, close associates of the swine flu positive woman are being identified, as precautionary measure.

Of the 12 samples sent to Institute of Preventive Medicine (IPM) for testing on Thursday, sample of only one suspected patient tested positive for swine flu, health officials said. So far, during this flu season close to 30 swine flu cases have been reported in the State capital.

Shutdown on Hurriyat call

Amid a complete shutdown across the Valley, protests and sit-ins were held at various places here even as prohibitory orders remained in force. Restrictions were also lifted from downtown areas this morning, which, however, did not change the deserted look of the city.

Soon after the restrictions were lifted, people in localities around Jamia Masjid staged peaceful sit-ins as part of the APHC-Mirwaiz “civil disobedience” programmes in protest against the recent killings and human rights violations. The bandh was also observed in response to the call by the hardline faction of the APHC led by Syed Ali Geelani against the human rights violations, demanding the release of those detained during the last one month.

The roads across the city wore a deserted look as bandh supporters enforced the restrictions on the movement of vehicles. Many private vehicles were seen returning to their destinations as the bandh supporters intermittently stopped them. Only the police and official vehicles were allowed to ply on city roads.

Shops, educational institutions, banks and government offices remained closed while a thin attendance was reported in some government offices.

Near normalcy was observed in some parts of the city on Wednesday, whereas life remained completely paralysed yesterday after some media channels showed the images of the restoration of normal life yesterday. Restrictions may be reimposed today to avoid any further trouble.

Two suicide attacks on Iran mosque kill more than 20

Two suicide bombings at a Shiite mosque in heavily Sunni southeast Iran killed more than 20 people, including worshippers and members of the elite Revolutionary Guards, state media reported.

The attack came as people celebrated the birthday of Imam Hussein, grandson of the Muslim Prophet Mohammed, a day also set apart each year to honour the Revolutionary Guards.

More than 100 people were wounded in the attacks, which came only minutes apart, at the Jamia mosque in the restive city of Zahedan, capital of southeastern Sistan-Baluchestan province.
