#### Hoax call delays train

An anonymous call claiming that an explosive had been kept in a bag in Howrah-bound Poorva Express yesterday delayed the departure of the train by more than 1.30 hours. However, the call turned out to be a hoax. Poorva Express, scheduled to depart at 4.20 pm, was allowed to start at 5.50 pm from platform No. 16 of New Delhi railway station after train was searched thoroughly.

The call sent authorities into a tizzy at the station. Bomb disposal squads with sniffer dogs were pressed into service. “Two bags in the train, which had created the suspicion, were later claimed by a passenger,”

#### **Techie turns computer thief**

An unemployed computer professional allegedly took to stealing computers from Internet cafes in the city, but some seven months later his luck ran out after police nabbed him.

Interrogators could recover 44 of the 70 computers he stole.

Police said the arrested man Prashanth Kumar, who obtained a Master's degree in computers from a University in United Kingdom, adopted a novel modus operandi for his escapades. He would enter an Internet café as a customer, steal keys when staff is busy, get duplicates made and replace the original keys.

The replacement of keys after duplicates were made was to ensure that the owners do not change the locks. And after the theft, suspicions would centre around those who have access to keys. Prashanth, police claimed, would drive to the Internet café in a car, collect monitors, CPUs and printers till the vehicle is filled and return home. He would sell them later.

#### **Maoists torch station, bank in Bihar**

Activists of the Communist Party of India (Maoist) set ablaze a railway station and a bank in Bihar late on Monday night to enforce their 48-hour shutdown against the arrest of two of their comrades.

Around 100 rebels also attacked the Rohtas police station and a camp of the Special Auxiliary Police, only to be repulsed by the Gorkha battalion stationed there, DGP Neelmani said.

Railway officials said the Maoists torched the Ismailpur station in Gaya district, throwing services out of gear.

## **Debit Card cloned: Phase IX man duped of Rs 90,000, 1 booked**

In case of the Phase IX resident Ambuj Kumar Sharma being cheated of Rs 90,000 after his ATM card was cloned by an unknown person, a case of cheating has been registered at the Phase 11 Police Station.

The suspect had withdrawn the money from three different ATMs. The Station House Officer, Phase XI, Sukhwinder Singh, said on the complaint of Ambuj Kumar, the cases had been registered. "Since the suspect had covered his face, the police could not retrieve his picture."

The victim had told the police on May 22, when he had gone to HDFC, Phase III-B 2, a man was keeping an eye while he was operating the machine. On May 23, he swapped his card to make some purchase from DT Mall. At 11.52 pm he got an SMS that Rs 10,000 had been debited from his account.

Shailesh Desai, 21, a resident of Chanakyapuri sector III, was passing by the housing society on his bike at 10.45 pm on Monday when he rammed into a scooter driven by Mafabhai Bharwad, who stays in same scheme.

After a verbal duel, they fought over the accident as both were unwilling to pay damages. The news spread like wildfire in the area and people from both communities came on streets with lathis, iron pipes and sharp weapons and attacked each other. We cordoned off the area to prevent further spread of fighting. Cross-complaints have been registered by both the groups for rioting.

**Siege lifted, but little relief for Manipur**

The Naga Students Federation (NSF) has temporarily suspended its blockade of the National Highway 39, the lifeline of Manipur, with effect from 6 p.m. on Tuesday. However, it failed to bring any respite for the State, as the All-Naga Students Association Manipur (ANSAM)-sponsored blockade of the highway continued for the 65th day.

Following the NSF decision, the Dimpaur-Mao Gate (the entry point of Manipur on the Manipur-Nagaland border) portion of the highway is now free for vehicular movement. However, from the Mao Gate point, the ANSAM enforced blockade on the highway inside Manipur continues.

The NSF started its blockade from May 4 after a delegation of the student body from Nagaland was prevented from entering Manipur on May 3.

Both blockades were intensified after May 6, when two Naga students were killed at the Mao Gate during a protest against promulgation of prohibitory orders and deployment of the Manipur Commandos and Manipur Rifles to prevent National Socialist Council of Nagalim (Isak-Muivah) general secretary Thuingaleng Muivah from entering Manipur to visit his birthplace Somdal in Ukhrul district.

**Police arrest 178 in global credit card scam**

Spanish police said on Tuesday that they had broken up a vast international network that

produced fake credit cards, an operation that led to the arrests of 178 people in 12 countries.

Members of the gang used real credit card numbers to produce fake cards which they then used to withdraw money from cash machines and make payments. The network was also involved in “theft, swindling, sexual exploitation and money-laundering”. Its activities brought them “profits of more than 20 million euros”.

Seventy-six people were held in Spain as part of the operation, 30 in France, 16 in Romania, 16 in Germany, 12 in Ireland, eight in United States, seven in Italy, four in Hungary, three in Finland, two in Australia, two in Sweden and two in Greece.
