Europe-bound flights from India grounded

Flights to and from European countries will be severely disrupted because of drifting ash being spewed from a volcano in Iceland.

Air India has cancelled all its eight flights to North America, the United Kingdom and Europe scheduled for Saturday. Jet Airways has cancelled all its flights to the U.K. and North America via Brussels. Kingfisher too has cancelled its flights to the U.K.

NATS, the U.K.'s leading air navigation service provider, issued an advisory, asking airlines not to operate to the U.K. as the cloud of volcanic ash drifted further. Eurocontrol, Europe's inter-governmental air control agency, has also issued a similar advisory. Hundreds of thousands of travellers are stranded at European airports following large scale cancellations of flights operating to the U.K, Europe and North America via the trans-Atlantic route.

According to the Eurocontrol, the airspace in Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Ireland, Sweden and the U.K. has been "zero rated" and closed.

The NATS advisory says the restrictions will remain in place in U.K.-controlled airspace till Saturday. By all indications, week-end flights to and from European airports will remain largely cancelled

Theft is Mumbai's biggest crime

Crimes of passion and murder are on the ebb. Even instances of extortion and dacoity, which never failed to make headlines a decade ago, are fewer in number when compared to petty crime like pick-pocketing and chain-snatching.

An analysis of last year's crime pattern based on data from the Mumbai Police shows that theft, house break-ins and stolen motor vehicles top the list. Of a total of 30,957 cases registered with the Mumbai police, there were 6,055 complaints of theft, followed by 4,183 cases of stolen vehicles. Pick-pocketing and chain-snatching accounted for another 1,766 cases.

The city's crime graph, like its burgeoning population, is also rapidly rising: over the last decade the city has witnessed a 52% rise in crime.

Lawyers strike on, undertrials granted bail on personal bonds

The office-bearers of two associations sat on relay fast at Kanpur Bar Association Hall and later the 51 members of the newly constituted Sangharsh Samiti convened a meeting to discuss the situation and chalk out a strategy for their agitation, according to Indrapal Singh Bhadoria, president, KBA. It has been decided to send representation to the Chief Justice of India, Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court and to the chief minister.

Malaria continues to sting city, Mangalore

This coastal city's dubious distinction of being the malaria capital of the state received yet another affirmation at the general meeting of Mangalore City Corporation held here on Friday. The issue came to the fore when former leader of the opposition Harinath drew the attention of the council to reports of increasing cases of malaria during April, an incident, which he said was unusual and alarming even by the city's standards.

The malaria control cell of the civic body had received reports of 46 cases in this month from the campus of National Institute of Technology — Karnataka at Srinivasnagar near here. A visit to the campus, which is seeing a lot of construction activity confirmed the findings, The affected included students as well as labourers on the campus.

Suicide blast at Pakistan hospital kills 8

A suicide bomber attacked a hospital emergency room where Shiite Muslims were mourning a slain bank manager on Friday, killing eight people including a journalist and two policemen in Pakistan's main southwest city.

The explosion in Quetta underscored the poor security conditions in Pakistan, a US ally where sectarian violence remains a problem even as al-Qaida and Taliban militants pose a growing, and linked, threat. It wasn't the first time that Shiite mourners have been attacked at hospitals in Pakistan, evidence of a tactic in vogue for their Sunni extremist foes.

Ash cloud spreads, all of Europe grounded

Air travel chaos across the globe deepened on Friday as a vast, high-altitude plume of volcanic ash from Iceland spread further across northern and central Europe, forcing authorities to close airspace and ground planes to forestall potentially catastrophic damage to jet engines.

By Friday morning, most of Europe's major airports — key hubs for international travelers — were closed.

Thousands of flights had been canceled since the massive disruption began on Thursday, stranding or delaying millions of passengers from North America to Asia.

British aviation authorities have extended a ban on flights over England and Wales for six more hours into Saturday morning but say restrictions over Scotland and Northern Ireland are being lifted.

Eurocontrol, the European air traffic agency, said the travel disruptions that reverberated throughout the world on Thursday were even worse on Friday, with about 11,000 flights expected to operate in Europe instead of the usual 28,000. It said delays will continue well into Saturday as the massive yet invisible ash cloud moves slowly south and east.
