Rs 1.55 crore snatched from jeweller at gunpoint

In a daring daylight robbery yesterday morning, four armed motorcyclists snatched two bags containing Rs 1.55 crore from an elderly jeweller right outside his house while he was waiting for his car, in the Ashok Vihar area of north-west Delhi.

According to information, Puran Chand Goel (62), along with his daughter-in-law, was waiting for his car outside his C-2/31, Phase-II, Ashok Vihar, residence when the incident took place around 9.45 am.

Puran Chand was going to HDFC Bank in Patel Nagar to deposit Rs 1.55 crore when the incident took place. A case has been registered and efforts are on to nab the goons. Goel owns two jewellery. Goel owns two jewellery shops in Ashok Vihar's Central Market and Sadar Bazar and the robbed money was yesterday's collection.

Housewife held for loan fraud Debamoy

With the arrest of a 25-year-old housewife from Belghoria in North 24-Parganas on Wednesday, police claim to have busted a gang that cheated people by promising easy loans. Mausumi Saha was identified from a bank's CCTV footage where she had gone to encash cheques collected from an unsuspecting real estate developer from Baguiati.

Mausumi was on the lookout for a job to supplement her husband's meagre earnings. She responded to an advertisement, seeking executives' for a financial institution. Her bosses' told her that she would have to visit customers to collect blank cheques and copies of identity documents like drivers' licences and PAN cards and encash the cheques from banks. She was paid Rs 200 per day.

Mausumi visited at least 20 loan-seekers in the last few months. Members of the gang would copy the signatures from the identity documents onto the blank cheques and would collect cash from banks. Police suspect that FIRs have been lodged at many police stations across the state.

Police security withdrawn from Jewish centres in city

The police have tightened security in the city following recent intelligence inputs that Taliban-trained terrorists have sneaked into Mumbai, Kolkata and Delhi to target vital installations. However, the security at the Ohel David synagogue (Lal Deval) in Pune Camp and Chabad House at Koregaon Park have been withdrawn.

A tight security was being maintained at the two Jewish centres from mid-October following an alert by central intelligence agencies that the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) was planning to target Jewish religious places in Pune. The governments of Maharashtra, Gujarat, Delhi and West Bengal were put on high alert then.

No policemen were seen at the synagogue and Chabad House when this reporter went visiting there. However, the entrances to both places were barricaded.

14 more test positive for swine flu

With the winter chill now in the air, swine flu cases in the city have recorded a sudden increase in the past one week. Doctors warned that H1N1 infections could see a rise as the virus spreads faster during winter.

According to the UT Health Department, 14 fresh cases were tested positive for swine flu yesterday while in the past one week, six cases have been reported every day. There has been a sharp increase from three and four cases reported in November. With these fresh cases, the total number of positive cases has gone up to 242.

Swine flu deaths: State on high alert

A sharp rise in swine flu cases in December has prompted the Gujarat government to

intensify medical checks at Ahmedabad airport and road and rail entry points of the state.

With December seeing 16 swine flu deaths in Gujarat already, taking the total death toll to 62, state health minister Jay Narayan Vyas said. Of the 62, 59 persons from Gujarat have died of H1N1 while three were residents of Rajasthan, who had come for treatment.

Swine flu continues to spread, one more dies

Swine flu claimed one more life on Tuesday while 60 people in the state were tested positive for the disease during the day. The disease has so far claimed 102 lives and 2,421 people have so far been tested positive for the disease across the state.

The state government has already implemented the Epidemic Act following the daily increasing numbers of swine flu patients. However, none of the district collectors had announced any major decision under the newly granted discretionary powers.

The districts of Jaipur, Jodhpur and Nagaur have been on the prime list of concern due to the large number of casualties reported from the three districts

Red alert: Maoists seize Kathmandu

Maoists on Wednesday announced the seizure of the Nepalese capital Kathmandu declaring it an autonomous region, after storming into heavily guarded Durbar Square, in a development that could trigger a new political confrontation.

Waving red flags, 5000 militant cadres forced their way into the Durbar Square city centre where their chief Prachanda declared Kathmandu valley as the Newa Autonomous State. The Maoists, who have already announced formation of parallel governments in nine districts and paid little heed to warnings by the Nepali Congress, to desist from such tactics as it may lead to “biggest political and social confrontation”.
