**Nuclear installations put on alert**

Nuclear power centres in the country, particularly the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC) at Trombay, were put on alert on Monday following intelligence inputs that terrorists might target them.

Senior officials of the Home Ministry said the alert was issued after intelligence agencies analysed inputs relating to threat perception from terror groups to atomic power installations.

Nuclear installations enjoy multi-level security arrangements and are protected by a combination of different security agencies, paramilitary and armed forces. "We have alerted the BARC in particular though security audits for all vital installations are carried out in detail from time to time," the officials said.

The alert came a day after the arrest of a Pakistani at the Indira Gandhi International Airport on suspicion of being a spy. Several defence-related and sensitive documents were reportedly seized from his possession.

### **Narora security beefed up**

Following specific tip-off about a probable terror strike at atomic units in the country, a high alert was sounded for the Narora Atomic Power Station situated in Bulandshahr district in Uttar Pradesh, some 150, kilometres from the national capital.

A heavy security blanket was thrown around the power station and even internal movement of the staff was restricted to their own departments unless extremely important.

The alert was sounded after intelligence alerts of a probable terror strike were cross-confirmed on the basis of the documents recovered from the possession of Pakistan spy Sayyed Amir Ali, who was arrested at the Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA) at New Delhi on Saturday.

### **Swine Flu precautionary measures, Schools send back over 200 kids**

In what seems to be an aftermath of the increasing number of reported cases of swine flu among students, various city schools sent at least 200 children with cough and cold back to their homes yesterday.

According to UT education department officials, nearly 150 students were from Guru Harkishan Public School, 100 from SD School, Sector 32, 30 from St Xavier's and 10 from others.

The students were sent back after preliminary screening. Their parents were asked to take them to the doctor and keep them at home till they got well.

A fresh directive was issued, asking the school authorities to immediately suspend any school function, trip or similar activity till further notice. The schools were asked to ensure that teachers screened all children coming to school on a daily basis and send back those suffering from any symptom of flu.

#### Goods worth Rs 5.75 lakh stolen on Monday

In three separate incidents, goods worth Rs 5.75 lakh was stolen from various areas in the city. Out of three thefts, two took place during daytime.

According to Sola police station officials, a bungalow was burgled near Science City on Sunday. According to a complaint by Amrat Desai, a resident of Vastuvilla Bungalows, near Murlidhar Party Plot, Science City Road, somebody entered in the house after breaking lock on the main entrance between 1.30 pm and 3.30 pm on Sunday. The thieves stole gold jewellery and cash worth Rs 2.20 lakh.

In another incident, a bungalow in Sardarnagar was burgled between Saturday afternoon and Sunday night. According to a complaint by Sumit Shetty, a resident of Radheshyam Park Society, ITI Road, somebody broke into his house after opening a lock between 4 pm on Saturday and 8.30 pm on Sunday. According to Shetty's complaint, the thieves stole gold jewellery and cash worth Rs 2.01 lakh from his residence.

Goods worth Rs 1.54 lakh was stolen from a bungalow in Chiloda. According to a complaint with Naroda police station officials, Bhagwati Advani, a resident of Golden Bungalows, somebody stole gold jewellery and cash worth Rs 1.54 lakh from her residence between 10 am on Sunday and 8.30 pm on Monday after breaking the lock on the main door.

#### Rickshaw drivers threaten further strike

The Ahmedabad Autorickshaw Drivers' Association has threatened to go on a 72-hour strike if the government did not roll back CNG prices and hiked the minimum fare from existing Rs 7 to Rs 10 in a week's time.

Nearly 80 per cent of the autorickshaws in the city remained off roads on Monday to register their protest against the increase of Rs 2 in the CNG prices. Harihar Mishra, vice-president of the association, said that if the government failed to meet their demand in a week's time they would embark on a three-day strike. There were heated arguments between rickshaw drivers who were seen carrying passengers.

**Shoot-on-sight order in strife-torn Mizoram**

The Mizoram government on Monday issued a shoot-on-sight order at Bungthuam and neighbouring villages in the state's western parts, which have been on the boil following last week's murder of a Mizo youth allegedly by suspected Bru militants.

"The shoot-on-sight order has been issued to contain the ethnic strife at Bru-dominated villages in the Bungthuam area near the state's border with Tripura," Mizoram home minister R Lalzirliana said here.

Since Friday, about 400 houses, mostly belonging to the Brus (also known as Reangs), have been torched allegedly by the Mizos in protest against the murder of Zarzokima, 18, by rebels belonging to the Bru National Army. On Sunday, 43 thatched Bru huts were set ablaze at Sarali. Police said seven persons have so far been arrested.

### **Blast near Pak police station; 5 killed, several wounded**

A suicide bomber rammed his explosives-laden vehicle into a police station in Peshawar today, killing at least five persons and injuring 20 others in the latest in a wave of deadly terrorist attacks in northwest Pakistan.

The attacker targeted a police station at Badabher on the outskirts of the provincial capital at 7.45 a.m. A mosque and a house located near the police station were reduced to rubble by the powerful blast.

Five bodies were pulled out of the rubble. Witnesses and rescue service officials said 20 others were injured.
