### **Air India, Kingfisher cancel flights to London as ash woes continue**

Ash clouds caused fresh travel hiccups resulting in at least 10 flights from Mumbai to Heathrow and more than 50 flights from India being cancelled on Monday.

The airspace over London's Heathrow Airport and Schiphol airport in Amsterdam, another of Europe's biggest air travel hubs, closed this morning as a dense cloud of volcanic ash drifted from Iceland.

Air India's daily flights to London — AI 131 Mumbai-London, AI 111 Delhi-London — were cancelled, while AI 187 Amritsar-London-Toronto landed successfully in London as the airspace had opened up till then.

#### **Behala tense after attack on poll vehicle**

Tension prevailed on Behala's J K Pal Road on Monday after unidentified miscreants went on the rampage on a vehicle used in the poll campaign for sitting CPM councillor of Ward 118, Ajay Adhikari. CPM supporters also alleged that a part of the vehicle was set ablaze.

CPM supporters blocked J K Pal Road on Monday morning and demanded the immediate arrest of people involved in the rampage. They alleged that some Trinamool supporters damaged the vehicles at the dead of night. The particular jeep was parked on the road.

Supporters of Adhikari blocked the arterial road for half an hour. A police force reached the spot. The blockade was withdrawn after the cops persuaded them that they would do the needful to carry out a proper investigation into the alleged rampage.

### City on high alert, patrolling intensified

- Additional forces deployed ahead of Mecca Masjid blast anniversary
- Entire city police force kept on stand-to orders for three days from Monday
- Hussaini Alam Inspector suspended for failing to comply with instructions subsequent to the attack

Three days after terrorists shot dead a constable at Khilwat junction under the Hussaini Alam police station area, the higher-ups on Monday suspended local Inspector K. Sudarshan, for failing to comply with instructions subsequent to the attack.

Massive security arrangements were in place for the third anniversary of Mecca Masjid blast on Tuesday by drawing additional forces from districts. A high alert was sounded keeping the entire city police on stand-to orders for three days from Monday while patrolling was intensified with armed police contingents.

Armed policemen were deployed at vulnerable places following reports that some groups might stage demonstrations protesting failure of the government to nab persons responsible for the Mecca Masjid blast.

### Cyclone warning

A cyclonic storm is brewing in the Bay of Bengal and coastal Andhra Pradesh could bear its brunt by Wednesday, the weather office said yesterday. The Met department has detected a depression formed over southwest Bay of Bengal on Monday afternoon which lay about 930 km east-southeast of Chennai and 1,000 km southeast of Visakhapatnam.

The current condition and numerical weather prediction models suggest that the system is likely to intensify into a cyclonic storm and move towards Andhra Pradesh coast.

### **Now, Mohali woman cries online fraud**

A day after an incident of fraudulent withdrawal of Rs 23 lakh from a retired teacher's bank account was reported, yet another incident of cyber crime came to light on Monday.

This time, a resident of Mohali Phase-I, Meenu Wadhwa, has lodged a complaint alleging that on May 14 Rs 47,000 was transferred through online banking from her ICICI bank account to an account number 641401500172 registered in Mumbai.

Meenu said, "It seems the transaction was made on May 14, as she first received an SMS

stating the correct account number, user ID and current balance. Then she received another SMS stating that the customer service executive will reconfirm her account details shortly. On the same day, she received a call from someone, claiming to be an ICICI Bank executive (+2348090756467), confirming the account details."

The victim, in her complaint, stated that within an hour she got a call from ICICI Bank, confirming the transaction.

#### **44 killed as Maoists blow up bus in Dantewada**

Just over a month after the Maoists gunned down 76 CRPF personnel in Chintalnar, the red extremists struck again, blowing up a bus carrying around 50 people, including 18 special police officers (SPO), around 4:15pm on Monday near Sukma in Dantewada, Chhattisgarh. Only six people -- all seriously injured -- are learnt to be alive, with the rest, including women and children, killed. Among those admitted to hospital are four civilians and two SPO.

The Maoists triggered an improvised explosive device (IED) on a black-top road at Chingavaram between Dantewada and Sukma as the bus winded through a 40-km stretch of dense forest. The massive explosion, which left a 10-foot deep crater, took place within two days of Maoist spokesman Azad issuing a statement -- congratulating the Maoist 'army' for "wiping out 80 CRPF mercenaries" and promising more such attacks.

#### **Security forces ready to combat Maoist bandh**

Security forces in the state have been put on high alert following the 48-hour bandh called by the CPI(Maoist) in protest against Operation Green Hunt.

The two-day bandh will begin around Monday-Tuesday midnight and end on the intervening night of Wednesday-Thursday.

**The five states to be covered by the strike are Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal, Orissa and Chhattisgarh.**

To avoid any untoward incident, the railways has diverted six trains via Gomoh and cancelled another eight passing through a sensitive zone. Railway sources said important trains like Palamu Express were cancelled.

The trains diverted were Shaktipunj Express, Varanasi-Ranchi Express, Howrah-Jabalpur Express, Ranchi-Sambalpur Express and both Up and Down of the Tata-Jammu Tawi

Express.

### Thailand's Red Shirts offer truce

The Thai government said it would accept a ceasefire offer from a Red Shirt protest leader on Monday if their fighters return to their camp in central Bangkok, as street battles that have killed 37 people raged for a fifth day.

Earlier, a Thai government ultimatum passed for the estimated 5,000 protesters occupying a barricaded encampment in the city center by 3pm on Monday or face up to two years in prison.

The demand had little apparent effect, and unrest still flared in various parts of the downtown area outside the barricades, with troops firing live ammunition at protesters who were lighting tires to hide their positions. The thick smoke darkened the sky.

Some protesters commandeered a fuel tanker from a gasoline station and pushed it to the middle of the key Rama IV road that has become a battleground. The protesters tried to set it ablaze with a burning tire and fireworks, but were deterred by troops.

### London flights hit as ash returns

The second spiral of ash from the Icelandic volcano, Eyjafjallajokul, in less than a month has sent travel schedules haywire again, with the plumes expected to reach southeast UK and Netherlands. Air India and Kingfisher Airlines cancelled flights to London on Monday while around 1,000 flights to and from Europe were hit as the two major transit points -- UK's Heathrow and Amsterdam's Schiphol airport -- remained closed on Sunday and for a few hours on Monday.

Other Indian carriers and international airlines said they would not be cancelling flights immediately, and would monitor the situation for any change.
