### **Fake notes found at RBI**

Counterfeit currency around Rs 32,000 was found at Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in Parliament Street here.

The notes had been reportedly found in September. But the bank lodged an FIR just three days ago. Police said 214 fake notes were found. The counterfeit currency was found in denominations from Rs 50 to Rs 1,000.

### **56 vehicles stolen in Noida in 15 days**

Motor cycles and cell phones have become great assets for criminals in western UP and Delhi.

In the last fortnight (December 1 to 15), bike-borne criminals have managed to steal 56 vehicles from different areas of Noida alone. As a matter of fact, these biker goons have been committing all kinds of crimes, including bank robberies, snatchings, murders and robberies at shops and houses.

On an average, hijacking four vehicles daily, the morale of these bikers' appears to be sky-high.

Among their targets are sectors and colonies which have car parking lots where they face no difficulty in driving away with stolen cars and scooters.

### **One more succumbs to H1N1 in Delhi**

The confirmed tally of influenza A (H1N1) in the Capital has gone up to 53, with the death of 49-year-old woman in the Moolchand Hospital yesterday. Besides, there were three suspected deaths due to the viral infection, said Delhi health authorities. The city had reported one death yesterday.

A 25-year-old woman had succumbed to the disease in the Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital.

With 215 new cases of the viral flu, including 97 children, the total number of people infected by the disease has reached 8,147, of which 4,765 are children. Apprehensions bothering the health authorities are that the cases might take a rise in January.

##### **Fake cops rob man in Borivli, arrested**

Two people have been arrested for masquerading as crime branch officials and kidnapping and robbing a 33-year-old Borivli resident. The accused, identified as Irfan Shaikh, 40, and Nasir Khan, 45, are residents of Mumbra.

An officer of the Kasturba Marg police station said the complainant, Virendra Ghedia, was talking over phone on Tuesday evening near the Sanjay Gandhi National Park when Shaikh and Khan robbed him.

Shaikh introduced himself as inspector Pawar from the Andheri crime branch and told Ghedia that they needed to question him, as he had taken money from some of the people. Ghedia denied having taken money, but before he could understand anything, one of them took away his bike and forced him into a car.

They robbed from him Rs700 cash and his cellphone and abandoned him near Oberoi mall in Goregaon (East).

##### **Day-long bandh in Yavatmal today demanding separate Vidarbha**

A day-long bandh would be held in Yavatmal in support of the demand of separate Vidarbha. Former member of parliament Jambuwantao Dhote said a day-long band would be held on December 19 demanding separate Vidarbha.

The bandh would, however, not affect the essential services including health services.

Dhote said that he had preliminary discussions with the local leaders of BJP, NCP, RPI and Vidarbha statehood protagonists and they have extended their whole hearted support to the demand.

### Traffic diversions in Perambur, Ayanavaram

Traffic police have announced certain changes in the vehicular movement from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. between December 19 and 31 in view of the construction of a rail overbridge in Perambur.

#### **Violence hits Anantapur again**

The movement for unified Andhra Pradesh took a violent turn after police disrupted the indefinite hunger strike camps of various leaders in the city on Friday.

Protesting the action of the police, the agitators set fire to furniture in the Railway Kalyanamandapam. The furniture and the electrical wiring were reduced to ashes. Fire-fighting personnel rushed to the spot and brought the flames under control. Police dispersed the agitators. BSNL cables kept outside a godown on Gooty road were also set ablaze. The flames were brought under control by the fire personnel.

The police also disrupted the indefinite fast by Dharmavaram MLA Venkatarama Reddy. Elsewhere in the region, fasting TDP MLA Ch. Prabhakar in Eluru and ex-MLA N. Varadarajulu Reddy in Proddatur were also forcibly removed. In Vijayawada, there were stray incidents of violence.

#### **Five huge can bombs found in Jamui village**

Jamui police recovered five can bombs on Friday from a village under the Laxmipur police station in Jamui district. The area is considered to be a Maoist stronghold. Jamui SP Rakesh Kumar Rathi said one of the recovered can bombs weighed 50 kg while the other four weighed 14 kg each.

"The bombs were presumably meant to target a police patrolling party," said ADG (headquarters) U S Dutt.

The Jamui SP, who led the raiding party on getting confidential information that extremists had collected some explosives, surrounded the hideouts of the suspected Maoists at village Thada Mor under the Laxmipur police station. The Maoists, however, managed to escape leaving behind the explosives and five detonators.

Police sources said a can bomb weighing 50 kg, if exploded, can blast a big city. The purpose behind collecting such a huge quantity of powerful explosives by the extremists is being investigated.

#### Swine flu claims two, 8 docs test positive

Swine flu continued to wreak havoc on Friday claiming two more lives in the state. Not just commoners, eight doctors in Civil and Shardaben hospitals in the city were reportedly diagnosed with swine flu while nine new cases were diagnosed across state. Hospital authorities refused to comment on the issue.

With this, the total swine flu cases in the state have gone up to 440 with 62 succumbing to the deadly infection. Two persons, Kanti Valmiya, 25 in Civil Hospital and Ramnath Gupta, 760 in LG Hospital died of swine flu according to health authorities. Sources in the health department say that with sudden rise in swine flu cases, awareness in schools and public functions has become a must. State government is drawing up a plan for this purpose. Winter is a crucial time when swine flu cases are expected to escalate.

**Five CRPF men hurt in grenade attack**

Five CRPF personnel were injured in a grenade attack by militants in Sopore township of Baramulla district yesterday.

Militants tossed a grenade towards the CRPF picket outside the State Bank of India in the main chowk of Sopore, 52 km from here, around 11.50 am. The grenade exploded with a bang and injured five jawans. A civilian, Fayaz Ahmad Teli, was also injured in the attack.

All injured were rushed to hospital, where the condition of one of the jawans was stated to be critical.

Immediately after the grenade attack, the militants fired a few rounds in the air while fleeing. The CRPF personnel retaliated, but none was hurt in the brief firing. CRPF reinforcements and the police cordoned off the area and conducted a through search operation, but no arrests were made.

### **10 killed in suicide attack in northwest Pak**

A suicide car bomber detonated his explosives near a mosque inside a police compound in northwestern Pakistan on Friday, killing 10 people in the latest attack by suspected Taliban militants waging war against the Pakistani government.

The Taliban have stepped up their campaign of violence since the military launched a major offensive in mid-October in the militant stronghold of South Waziristan in Pakistan's lawless tribal area near the Afghan border. Friday's attack was the second in two weeks against a mosque used by Pakistan's security forces.

Most of the 10 people killed in the attack in the Lower Dir region were police leaving the mosque after Friday prayers, said the area's police chief, Feroze Khan.

### **Nepal Maoists attack convoy of minister**

Tempers ran high in Nepal on Friday as the Maoists attacked a convoy of minister for energy Prakash Sharan Mahat who however escaped unhurt.

The minister's convoy was pelted with stones during his tour of Baglung district in western Nepal and police intervened to disperse the cadres, according to Nepali Congress sources. More than half a dozen of the attacking cadres were injured in the clash.
