### 2 burnt in godown fire

Two labourers were burnt to death while three others were injured when a fire broke out in a cardboard factory in the Shastri Nagar area of north Delhi yesterday morning.

According to fire officials, the fire call was received at 5.05 am and 11 firefighting engines doused the fire around 8.40 am.

The incident was reported from a cardboard making unit near Jalebi Chowk in Shastri Nagar. Eleven firefighting engines took about three hours to control the flames as the inflammable cardboards spread the very fast. Fire officials found two charred bodies in the godown of the building. Although the cause of fire is still a matter of dispute, a fire official informed that gas cylinder blast could be the likely reason.

### 4 held for passport racket

The central district police has arrested four persons, including a debt-ridden businessman and an exporter, for allegedly sending people by procuring visas on fake passports.

Ajay Kumar (38), Virendra (46), Sumit Kumar (44) and Chinmay Chauhan (44) were arrested near fire station in Prasad Nagar yesterday when they came there to deliver a fake passport with a visa.

#### **Traffic restrictions in city tomorrow**

*Diversions in connection with the proposed siege to Assembly by students' JAC*

Masab Tank, Telugu Thalli, Khairatabad, Basheerbagh and Narayanguda flyover bridges would be closed for traffic as part of the restrictions announced by city police in connection with the laying siege to Assembly on Saturday by students' Joint Action Committee of Osmania University.

**Lorries prohibited**

The restrictions would be in force from 5 a.m. on Saturday while entry of inter-State lorries is prohibited from 10 p.m. on Friday to 10 p.m. on Saturday, according to a press release. The following route would be open for inter-district RTC and private buses: Dilsukhnagar-Chaderghat-Nimboliadda-6 no. junction-Amberpet 'T' junction-Ramanthapur-Uppal crossroads-Habsiguda crossroads-Mettuguda-Sangeeth crossroads, YMC fly-over-CTO fly-over-P&T fly-over-Begumet fly-over-Panjagutta flyover-NFCL rotary-road no.1 & 12-Masab Tank crossroads-Mehidipatnam crossroads, Rethibowli ring road-Attapur bridge-Aramgarh crossroads-Mahabubnagar crossroads-L.B. Nagar ring road-Uppal crossroads.

Traffic going from Jubilee bus station, Secunderabad and Bowenpally to Charminar would be diverted at Paradise crossroads and Patny junction towards S.D. road-Sangeet crossroads-Rail Nilayam-Habsiguda-Uppal crossroads. Vehicles going from Kukatpally and Madhapur to Dilsukhnagar would be diverted at V.V. statue towards Raj Bhavan road- Rajiv Gandhi statue-Greenlands-Begumpet, P&T, CTO and YMCA fly-overs-Habsiguda- Uppal crossroads.

Traffic going from Madhapur, Jubilee Hills check-post and KBR park to Charminar would be diverted at NFCL rotary towards Taj Krishna, road No.12, Masab Tank, Mehidipatnam and ring road. Vehicles going from Mehidipatnam and Masab Tank to Ayodhya junction would be diverted at Masab Tank towards road no. 12, Taj Krishna hotel.

Traffic going from Charminar and Afzalgunj to Secunderabad would be diverted at Afzalgunj 'Y' junction towards MGBS, Chaderghat, Nalgonda crossroads, Malakpet T.V. tower, Dilsukhnagar, L.B. Nagar ring road and Uppal crossroads. Vehicles going from Amberpet to Madhapur via Abids would be diverted at Kachiguda traffic police station junction towards Chaderghat, M.G. bus station, Charminar, Bahadurpura and ring road.

Vehicles going from Osmania University to RTC crossroads would be diverted at NCC junction towards Shivam road. Those going from Ramnagar and Nallakunta to RTC crossroads would be diverted at VST towards Hindi Mahavidyalaya and Shankermutt. Vehicles going from Tarnaka to Abids and Charminar would be diverted towards Uppal crossroads, ring road and L.B. Nagar.

Traffic going from Kukatpally to Abids and Shamshabad would be diverted at Panjagutta junction towards Rajiv Gandhi statue (Monappa Island) and NFCL rotary respectively. Vehicles going from Dilsukhnagar to Madhapur via Abids would be diverted at Chaderghat towards Charminar, Bahadurpura and ring road. Those going from Secunderabad railway station and Rethifile bus station towards Charminar would be diverted at Chilkalguda crossroads towards Mettuguda, Habsiguda, Uppal crossroads and ring road.

Traffic going from Nampally railway station to Secunderabad would be diverted at Ek Minar crossroads towards Bazharghat, Masab Tank and road No12. Vehicles going from MGBS to Secunderabad would be diverted at Gowliguda junction towards Chaderghat, Nimboliadda and Amberpet 'T' junction. Vehicles going from Parsigutta and Padmaraonagar to Charminar and Madhapur would be diverted at Musheerabad crossroads towards Chilkalguda crossroads, Habsiguda junction, Uppal crossroads and ring road.

Vehicles going from Gachibowli and Tolichowki to Abids would be diverted at Ek Minar mosque towards Darusalam road. Traffic would not be allowed beyond Afzalgunj, Chaderghat, Kachiguda traffic police station 'Y' junction (Nimboliadda), Tourist hotel, Barkathpura crossroads, VST, Musheerabad crossroads, Tarnaka junction, Mettuguda, Chilkalguda crossroads, Ranigunj junction, Masab Tank and, Ek Minar mosque.

#### **Maoists kill 12 in brutal assault on Bihar village**

At least 12 villagers, including three women and one child, were killed in a brutal Maoist attack by nearly 150 heavily-armed rebels who stormed Phulwariya village in Bihar's Jamui district late on Wednesday night.

Police sources in Jamui on Thursday said there was a possibility that the Maoists had abducted some villagers during the course of the strike, which came hot on the heels of the Maoist attack on the Eastern Frontier Rifles camp in Midnapore district of West Bengal three days ago.

#### **Tight security at places visited by terror suspect Rana**

In the wake of the Pune blast, Gujarat police is keeping a close watch over all the places in the state which US terror suspect David Headley's accomplice had visited in November 2008.

Police was maintaining a vigil over the places where Headley's Canadian accomplice Tahawwur Hussain Rana and his wife Samraz Akhtarhad had visited. Following the nationwide alert after the Pune blast, security has been beefed up in Gujarat. A large cache of explosives was seized from Vapi and Surendranagar districts.

Rana, arrested by FBI along with Headley for involvement in the Lashkar-e-Taiba plot to carry out attacks in India, had stayed at a hotel here in 2008. He was accompanied by his wife during his visit to the city.

### Two Hizbul militants killed in Pulwama

Two militants of Hizbul Mujahideen were killed in an encounter with security forces after a nightlong siege around a village in Pulwama district of south Kashmir yesterday.

Those killed have been identified as Sajjad Ahmad Wani of Rajpora and Javed Ahmad Hajam of Ratnipora villages in the district. The house in which the militants were hiding was also damaged in the encounter, while the security forces recovered two AK rifles, five magazines, a wireless set, two hand grenades, one mobile phone and Indian currency worth Rs 3,716 from the site.

Acting on the receipt of specific information about the presence of the militants, the police and security forces cordoned off Shangerpora village in Pulwama district last evening. The encounter with hiding militants in the joint house of Ali Mohammad Ganai and Mohammad Akbar Ganai, started this morning that ended with the death of both the militants.

**23 prisoners escape in Chittorgarh jail-break**

In a daring jail-break in Rajasthan, 23 prisoners escaped from Chittorgarh District Jail on Thursday morning after overpowering two police guards and snatching their rifles.

As many as 12 of them escaped in a vehicle parked outside the main gate of the jail. Two of the escaped inmates are convicts while the rest are said to be undertrials facing mostly charges for the violation of the NDPS (Narcotic Drugs and Psychopathic Substances) Act in this opium belt.

**Maoists kill doc for being police informer**

Maoists killed a doctor and looted the house of a ration dealer at Kalapathar village in Chakulia block of East Singbhum district late on Wednesday night, around 25 km from the Bengal border. The duo has been accused of being police informers.

Panic spread after Chandra Mohan's body was found near the forest on Thursday morning, but no one dared to bring it back. Even police did not reach the spot. A villager said they were terrified after Monday's Silda camp attack in Bengal and Chandra Mohan's killing had aggravated their fear.

The borders of Koderma and Giridih bordering Bihar's Jamui district, incidentally, have been sealed following the killing of 11 men by the Maoists at Phulwaria village on Wednesday-Thursday night.

**41 killed in Pak twin blasts**

At least 41 people were killed and more than 60 injured in twin-suicide bomb attacks Pakistan's north-western tribal region of Khyber.

The first blast occurred near a mosque and compound of militants in a crowded market place of Tirah Valley in Khyber, an area famous for selling hashish. Twenty seven people were left dead and more than 40 were injured. Within hours of the first attack, another blast hit a cattle market in Darmela area of Khyber, killing 14 people and injuring more than 20. Initial reports suggested that the second blast took place in Orakzai tribal region as the two areas border one another.
