Security drill at Delhi airport to review R-Day preparedness

In view of the upcoming Republic Day Parade in the Capital on January 26, security agencies carried out a security drill at Delhi airport on Monday to review its preparedness for any eventuality.

At 2-16 p.m., the Police Control Room received a phone call informing that an explosive-laden vehicle was on its way to the domestic airport. An alert was subsequently sounded by the Delhi Police, Delhi Fire Service, Central Industrial Security Force and other agencies stationed at the airport. The Special Weapons and Tactics Team under the Special Cell of the Delhi Police was also put in action.

Unclaimed sack triggers panic

An unclaimed sack lying near Ginger Rail Yatri Niwas at Ajmeri Gate here triggered panic in the area on Monday evening.

The sack was spotted by a passer-by, who then alerted the police. The area was immediately cordoned off. The bomb detection and disposal squads were summoned but no explosives were found.

Swine flu toll in Maharashtra reaches 300

A total of 300 people have so far died of swine flu in Maharashtra, health officials said, Till date, 18,94,529 people have been examined for the virus and 1,12,264 suspected patients have been administered Tamiflu.

The number of people who tested positive for the H1N1 influenza is 5,604, of whom 5,243 have been treated and discharged.

Altogether 159 persons, including 61 positive and 98 suspected cases, are still being treated at various hospitals in the state.

Fake note threat in naxal-hit dists

The fake currency menace is worrying the government. The RBI, in a letter to the government, has mentioned the districts where detection of forged notes by the RBI has been relatively high. It cautioned that these may be used for anti-national activities.

"Detection and seizure of counterfeits has been substantial in border districts. There is a perceived threat of the same in the naxal-affected districts," sources in the RBI maintained. Bangalore Urban, Hassan, Bagalkot, Kolar, Gulbarga, Uttara Kannada, Belgaum, Raichur, Bellary, Gadag, Mysore, Mandya, Tumkur, Chitradurga, Chamarajanagar and Hubli Dharwad, Dakshina Kannada, Chikmagalur and Shimoga are districts where the perceived threat exists.

Suspected LeT leader held in Hyderabad

The arrested man was allegedly involved in the twin blasts in Hyderabad in 2007, and in the explosions in Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Jaipur and Ahmedabad.

Hideout busted in Kishtwar

In the 20-year-long militancy, the state police for the first time recovered six anti-tank rifles and state-of-the-art sophisticated weaponry from a militant hideout in Kishtwar district yesterday.

The seizure has averted a major tragedy in the backdrop of the ensuing R-Day celebrations. Acting on specific information, a major search operation was launched in the Pyas area, 32 km from Kishtwar, at about 10.30 am. A huge quantity of weapons, including six anti-tank rifles having a length of 1.5-foot and weighing about 2.5 kg was recovered from the hideout.

Gearing up for Vidarbha bandh, Nagpur

Through an all-out shutdown on January 20, Vidarbha may be looking to part roads with Maharashtra, but the 'bandh' will also mean roads empty of almost all autorickshaws. These three-wheelers are considered lifeline of the city's public transport system because buses still do not reach everywhere.

They will join the strike but the autorickshaw union leaders are yet to decide about what to do with emergency cases. The members of the autorickshaw union have been instructed to take out their vehicles during strike. There will be meeting on Tuesday to decide what is to be done with emergency cases like people in need of urgent medical attention.

Most pvt businesses would remain shut, Vidhrbha Bandh

Most private business establishments, especially retail and wholesale shops, are expected to remain shut on Vidarbha bandh, just a couple of days away. Nag Vidarbha Chamber of Commerce (NVCC), the largest business association of the region, has extended support to

the bandh. NVCC covers over one lakh trading establishments in the region. The bandh is expected to receive maximum response in the business areas of east Nagpur, such as Itwari, Gandhibagh, Maskasath and so on. Nagpur Chamber of Commerce Limited (NCCL) has already supported the bandh.

Most wholesalers such as those dealing in foodgrains, edible oil, and grocery items have extended the support to the bandh. There have been also cases where businessmen shut down the establishments only to avoid trouble as it is an all party bandh. A number of showrooms in west Nagpur and other plush localities may also remain shut on the bandh day.

20 killed in US drone attack in Waziristan

A US drone strike targeting a militant compound killed at least 20 today in the tribal belt in North Waziristan's Taliban stronghold where Hakimullah Mehsud escaped a similar attack last week.

The drone fired two missiles during the strike in Shaktoi region that straddles North and South Waziristan, officials were quoted as saying by TV news channels.

Twenty bodies were pulled out of the rubble of the compound, which was destroyed, and the toll could rise further, officials said.

Three foreign fighters were among the dead, Geo News channel reported. This was the tenth drone strike in Waziristan this year.
