52-year-old succumbs to swine flu in Bhayandar

Swine flu, that had all but receded from short-term public memory, reared its ugly head again recently, claiming a victim in Bhayandar on Wednesday.

Sambhaji Panpatte, deputy commissioner of Mira-Bhayandar Municipal Corporation (MBMC), said the victim, Rekha Kirtikumar Shah, 52, was a resident of Bhayandar.

On the morning of June 16, Shah had woken up with a fever. By noon, she had become serious and was rushed to Hinduja Hospital in critical condition.

Even before doctors could figure out that her symptoms were those of swine flu, Rekha breathed her last on Wednesday night. In her death report doctors have said that she died from swine flu.

New security set-up for Kolkata Metro

With mounting fear of terrorist strikes and a perceived threat at major installations, the country's oldest metro railway service is gearing up with a major revamp of its security system.

An integrated security system will be put in place that will upgrade existing security systems and include new equipment including baggage scanners, night-vision devices, explosive detectors, bomb suppression blankets and bomb baskets.

While an additional 500 close circuit television cameras will be installed at the 21 metro stations, sophisticated software will monitor the feed from the cameras. The software is capable of analysing the data and indicating suspicious behaviour. New metal detectors, both door frame and hand held, will also be introduced.

Man duped of Rs 7.5 lakh

Vijay Goel, owner of a computer shop, lodged a complaint with the police that he was duped

of Rs 7.5 lakh last evening.

In his complaint, Goel alleged that some VC Aggarwal claiming to be a director at the Indian Oil Corporation, called him up on June 11. He said he was staying at Batra Hotel and wanted to buy 450 laptops for his company.

Goel sent his son Rohit to hand over 20 laptops to Aggarwal. Aggarwal gave a letter to Rohit on the Indian Oil Corporation letter pad in name of Gurmeet Singh DGM (retail sale), IOC, Chandigarh, directing him to make payment through a cheque as per the bill.

Aggarwal then called up Rohit and told him that the DGM of IOC, Chandigarh, was out of station and further asked him to collect the payment from Batra Hotel.

On reaching the hotel, Vijay Goel, along with his son Rohit, found Aggarwal's room locked. Aggarwal had switched off his mobile phone.

When Goel visited the IOC office, Chandigarh, he was told that there was no such demand. Goel alleged that he was robbed of 20 laptops worth Rs 7.5 lakh.

Crime branch nabs six for loot at Vatva GIDC

Six men, along with a buyer of a stolen goods, were arrested by city crime branch officials on Friday. The officials managed to recover 5,418 kilograms of aluminium parts and raw material, worth Rs 9.48 lakh, from a godown near Narol.

According to crime branch officials, a team led by inspector MD Chaudhary, got a tip-off that the stolen aluminium was going to be sold at a unit in Narol. A team then raided the unit and nabbed the receiver and then tracked down the robbers.

The robbers had stolen the goods from Sonu CNC Components from Vatva GIDC area on June 9 night. The officials arrested alleged gang leader, who is a resident of Ghodasar, along with five others, all between 22 to 25 years of age. Buyer, a resident of Shah-e-Alam and a scrap dealer, was also arrested.

GJM calls for indefinite strike

The Gorkha Janmukti Morcha (GJM) leadership on Friday called for an indefinite strike in the Darjeeling hills from Saturday.

The GJM said the decision was taken as the authorities concerned had failed to give an explanation for the baton-charge on party supporters in Kurseong on Wednesday.

The fresh spell of agitation was also “in protest against the high-handedness of the police in the name of arresting those responsible for the murder of Madan Tamang,” GJM assistant general secretary Benoy Tamang said.

Akhil Bharatiya Gorkha League president Madan Tamang, a vociferous critic of the GJM, was fatally stabbed in broad daylight in the heart of Darjeeling town on May 21.

Additional CRPF forces arrive in Manipur

Eight companies of the CRPF, including one comprising women, have arrived here to help Manipur tackle the crisis stemming from the blockade enforced by Naga outfits.

This follows the announcement by Union Home Secretary G.K. Pillai that the two inter-State highways, which are the lifelines of Manipur, would be re-opened with the help of the Central forces. The CRPF personnel will escort vehicles carrying essentials on these highways.

The Centre had assured the State that 20 companies would be despatched to escort goods trucks, passenger buses and other vehicles plying on Highways 39 and 53.

Though the Naga Students' Federation (NSF), in response to calls by Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and Home Minister P. Chidambaram, had temporarily suspended the blockade — it had imposed on Manipur from May 3 — from Tuesday morning, no vehicle had been allowed on Highway 39 that passes through Nagaland.

Over 400 trucks and oil tankers reached Imphal on Friday from Assam escorted by the Manipur Rifles troopers.

However, oil pumps remained closed. Prices of available items have soared.

Executive engineer kidnapped and killed

An engineer of Assam irrigation department was allegedly kidnapped and killed here by his private driver, who had been demanding Rs 25 lakh in the name of ULFA.

Executive engineer Manik Baishya was kidnapped from Khanapara here yesterday evening in his official car. Police recovered his body and the abandoned vehicle near Assam Police Radio Organization at Jalukbari here.

Iraq car bombs kill six, wound 82

Two car bombs targeting a provincial councillor and a police officer north of Baghdad on Friday killed six people and wounded 82, many of them women or children.

The six dead came in a bombing in the town of Tuz Khurmatu and targeted the home of Niazar Nomaroglu, a Shiite Turkmen councillor in mainly Sunni Arab Salaheddin province, police Colonel Hussein al-Bayati said.

Women and children were among the 50 people wounded in the 3:45 pm (1245 GMT) bombing, which severely damaged several surrounding houses as well as Nomaroglu's home, Bayati said. It was unclear whether the councillor was among the casualties.
