#### Two held for robbing doctor in Nangloi

Two young men have been arrested for allegedly robbing a doctor of his car and laptop after firing at him in Nangloi here over the weekend.

Nikhil Marwah, a doctor, was on his way to Rohtak in Haryana on Saturday night and had stopped at a secluded spot to ease himself when three young men attacked him. One of them allegedly fired at Nikhil injuring him. The accused then drove away in his Lancer car. When the police received a call about the incident, they took the victim to Sanjay Gandhi Memorial Hospital.

Acting on a tip-off, the police laid a trap on Tuesday and arrested Jaswinder alias Monu who was driving the Lancer. His accomplice Shiv Dabas alias Shiva was arrested later at his instance.

#### 30 fresh dengue cases

With 30 fresh cases of dengue reported today, the total number of patients suffering from the

vector-borne disease in the national Capital has become 913.

The city has reported nearly 300 cases of dengue in the last eight days. With 30 fresh positive cases of dengue, the total number of patients has reached 913. There are 13 patients who contracted the disease outside Delhi.

According to the MCD, the city has reported two dengue deaths so far. On October 23, a 15-year-old boy succumbed to the disease at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), while a nine-year-old boy breathed his last at the Lok Nayak Jai Prakash (LNJP) Hospital on October 26.

#### **Fake mobile battery manufacturing unit raided near Bhiwandi, 6 arrested**

With the arrest of six persons the Thane police claimed to have burst a factory manufacturing fake batteries of mobiles of renown brands.

Giving this information here the additional commisioner of police (crime) Prashant Burde told reporters that from the arrested police recovered the accessories used to manufacture the batteries and also a large stock of batteries of various brands.

The value of the seized batteries is more than Rs1 crore. Acting on a tip-off that a large stock of fake batteries was being transported to Mumbai the staff of the crime branch kept a vigil at Kawla and intercepted a Tata Sumo.

A search of the vehicle revealed that in fact large stocks of fake batteries were loaded in the vehicle which was seized by the police. A close interrogation of the duo revealed that there was a factory at Dapoda near Bhiwandi where the fake batteries were being manufactured, police said. The police seized machineries used for the manufacture of the batteries besides the holograms of various mobile companies.

#### **Three held for forging documents for US visa**

The Gamdevi police arrested three persons, including a woman, on Tuesday afternoon for allegedly submitting bogus documents to the United States consulate in the city while applying for a three-month business visa.

Those arrested, Gagan Deep Pal, 21, Tarunpreet Randhawa, 31, and her brother-in-law Navindra Randhawa, 30, are all residents of Punjab. According to the police, during their interviews at the consulate, Gagan and Tarunpreet submitted bogus certificates stating that they were Wipro company employees.

Tarunpreet was applying for the visa and found that Gagan was also trying to get a visa. She arranged the bogus documents for him and was supposed to get Rs10 lakh.

### 3 HuJI, LeT linkmen held in Kolkata

Three Bangladeshi linkmen of Harkat-ul-Jihad-al-Islami (HuJI) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) who were allegedly involved in the attack on the STF office at Hyderabad and the Shramjivi Express in 2006, were arrested in the metropolis on 17<sup>th</sup> evening with a huge amount of fake currency.

Abdullah Baki, Mohammad Tahidur and Abdul Rahman were arrested by Special Task Force from Babughat after they arrived here by train from West Bengal's Murshidabad district.

The three were members of the Pakistan-based Sahid Billal group which provided support to LeT and HuJI. Fake currencies with a face value of 30 lakh in denominations of Rs 500 and Rs 1000 and maps were seized from them.

### 2 from Bengal held with fake currency worth Rs 30,000

The city police have unearthed another attempt to circulate counterfeit currency, this time with its origins in Pakistan. The notes have about 95% of security features (of the original) copied on them, making it difficult for even experts to identify fake from original.

Mambalam police on Tuesday seized 60 such notes, all in denomination of Rs 500, from two youngsters hailing from West Bengal. They had already made some purchases in the city using such fake notes.

It was an alert shopkeeper in T Nagar who helped police nab the two - Sarik-UI-Islam (20) and Kapil Sheik (20). Sarik was in his shop to purchase goods and had presented a Rs 500 note. Doubtful about its authenticity, the shopkeeper informed the Mambalam police. Sarik was picked up immediately

### Five robber gangs busted

Riding high on success wave, the Cyberabad police on Wednesday recovered 66 stolen two-wheelers, six tractors and 450 grams of gold jewellery, all worth Rs. 70 lakh by busting five gangs.

Among the arrested were three students from Alwal, who allegedly wanted to lead a lavish lifestyle by hook or crook. The arrested K. Vishnuvardhan was an Intermediate student while the other two P. Mahesh and G. Gangadhar, were pursuing degree courses.

Aged about 19 years, the three students from Macha Bollarum formed a gang. They used to

sell the stolen vehicles at dirt cheap rates to unsuspecting customers convincing that they would give the documents later.

The second gang comprising four members lifted 28 two-wheelers from different parts of the city. The gang leader Y. Shekhar used to spend all his money to play cards in reputed clubs. Having run into debts, he would prepare fake vehicle documents with the help of Vijay of Jagadgirigutta, presently absconding, sell the vehicles and spend his share of money thus secured in the clubs.

#### 4 bombs found in Muzaffarpur field

Four countrymade bombs were found in a paddy field of Dhiranpatti locality under Bela police station of Muzaffarpur town on Wednesday. Muzaffarpur district superintendent of police Sunil Kumar said it was because of pressure from police that a gang of dacoits, which was roaming in the neighbouring area to commit a crime, was forced to leave behind its bombs and flee.

The criminals, who were natives of adjoining areas, placed the bombs in the field and covered them with soil so that they could be used later on. Police are looking for a few youngsters, who are said to have formed a gang recently.

The bombs, incidentally, were made with explosives stuffed in used zarda cans. The explosion made by these bombs could have been fatal had they fallen directly on any human being, police said. But, normally, such bombs are used only to scare people away.

#### **Thieves break into garment shop, decamp with cash**

Thieves broke into a garment shop and decamped with cash and other articles in Sector 22. In another incident a house was burgled in Sector 23.

Rajiv Vikram Seth, owner of Wool-o-Wool in Sector 22, reported to the police alleging that Rs 78,000 and garments worth about Rs 15,000 were stolen from his shop last night.

The police called the forensic experts to examine the crime scene, however, they reportedly failed to pick up any fingerprint from there. The police quizzed his employees but failed to make any headway into the case.

In another incident, Ravi Kant of Sector 23-D, reported that someone had stolen two laptops, two digital cameras, Rs 40,000 and Pounds Sterling worth 1700 from his residence during the intervening night of November 17 and 18. A case has been registered.

#### **Four more down with H1N1**

With the number of positive swine flu cases showing increase among children, especially in the age group of 5-14, the UT Health Department has arranged stock of paediatric dosage of antiviral drug - Oseltamivir (Tamiflu).

So far, over 480 cases of swine flu had come to city hospitals, of which 111 were tested positive, including four fresh cases for H1N1 reported yesterday. Of the positive cases, over 40 were students, including school children and college-going youth

**Militant threat to poison Pak water sources**

Pakistani Taliban have threatened to contaminate water sources and reservoirs with poisonous

materials to pressure the army to stop military operations against them in South Waziristan tribal region.

The cantonment boards of Rawalpindi and Chaklala received the threat from the banned Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan. A letter, faxed to the Directorate of Military Lands and Cantonments in Rawalpindi on Tuesday, said the Taliban had procured 200 litres of poisonous materials that would be used to contaminate water.
