### **Factory owner robbed of Rs 8 lakh**

An unidentified man robbed Rs 8 lakh from an “unlocked” flat in a south-west Delhi locality after forcing a factory owner’s wife to inhale sedatives.

The incident was reported from Naraina Vihar last night. The masked robber managed to enter flat of Dharminder Singh and forced his wife Jaswinder Kaur (48) to inhale sedative-laden handkerchief. The robber also slit the arm of Kaur after she tried to hold him by the collar in a drowsy state.

Singh has a factory in Noida, which manufactures spare parts for an electronics company, and three days ago, he had brought home Rs 8 lakh.

### **Money order racket busted**

With the arrest of three Nigerians, the CBI has claimed to have busted an international racket involving printing and circulating counterfeit money gram (money orders) running into millions of dollars used in the USA.

The gang had been forwarding consignments of such counterfeit money grams from India to the USA through various courier companies while concealing their identities and whereabouts.

According to CBI spokesman Harsh Bahl, counterfeit money gram money orders of face value US \$ 36,78,125 (Rs 17,65,50,000) have been intercepted by the US authorities.

### **Two petrol pumps looted in Gzb**

In separate incidents, two petrol pumps were looted by armed men in Ghaziabad, the police said on Monday.

Six armed men in a car barged into Shivam Petrol pump on the Meerut Road on Sunday night, filled the vehicle’s tank and then looted salesman’s cash and mobile.

The men also looted a customer at the pump of his valuables. The police compliant says that Rs 40,000 and two mobile phones were snatched at gunpoint from the pump.

In another incident, robbers looted cash and mobile phone from Sharma Petrol Pump on National Highway-24.

The criminals forcibly entered the cash room of the pump and took away all money along with the salesman’s mobile phone.

### **30 injured in Hyderabad hospital fire**

At least 30 people were injured after fire broke out in a private hospital here on Tuesday, a police officer said some more people could be trapped and efforts were on to rescue them.

The fire broke out at the Park Super Speciality Hospital in the busy Somajiguda area. The injured include patients, nurses and other hospital staff. The police officer said eight patients were rescued from the Intensive Care Unit.

The injured were shifted to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS) and Yashoda Hospital. The condition of four of the injured is stated to be critical.

#### **35 injured in Srinagar clashes**

At least 35 persons, including nine policemen and six CRPF men, were injured in clashes at different places in Srinagar yesterday. A shutdown was also observed in several areas of the city in protest against the death of a youth in yesterday's tear gas shelling by the police.

The youth, Wamiq Farooq, died at the SKIMS after he was hit by a tear gas shell in the Rajouri Kadal area of the downtown yesterday. Stray incidents of stone throwing occurred at Maisuma, Safakadal, Kawdara, Nowhatta and Rainawari in which six policemen were injured while showing utmost restraint while controlling the unruly mob, the police said.

### **BJP disrupt work at Koda project site, Jamshedpur**

BJP workers on Monday forcibly suspended the ongoing work at the site of the proposed shopping mall in the posh area in Bistupur.

**Woman bomber strikes pilgrims in Iraq, kills 54**

A female suicide bomber walking among Shia pilgrims in Baghdad detonated an explosives belt on Monday, killing at least 54 people and wounding more than 122.

The bombing was the first major strike this year against pilgrims making their way to the southern city of Karbala to mark a Shia holy day. It came as security official warned of a possible increase in attacks by insurgents using new tactics to bypass bomb-detection methods.

The bombing raises fears of an escalation of attacks as hundreds of thousands of Shias head by Friday to the southern holy city of Karbala to mark the end of 40 days of mourning following the anniversary of the death Imam Hussein, a revered Shia figure.

The bomber hid the explosives underneath an abaya — a black cloak worn from head to toe by women — as she joined a group of pilgrims on the outskirts of Baghdad’s Shia-dominated neighborhood of Shaab,
