### **Bikers snatch Rs 10 lakh from advocate**

An advocate with the Karkardooma Court in east Delhi was robbed of Rs 10 lakh by two bike-borne men just outside his house in Farsh Bazaar police station area today afternoon.

According to the police, the incident was reported around 2 pm from Vishwas Nagar Colony.

The advocate, Chaman Lal Yadav, had gone to the Kar Kardooma branch of the Central Bank of India to deposit Rs 10 lakh. However, since he wanted to deposit the money in his wife's account, the bank asked him to get his pan card.

Yadav returned to his house to collect the pan card. However, as soon as he reached his house, two bike-borne men pushed him aside and ran away with the bag containing the money.

### **Visa racket busted, five Bangladeshis held**

With the arrest of five men, the Delhi police has claimed to have busted a visa racket being run by some Bangladeshi nationals. The gang used to provide fake visas to Indians and Bangladeshi nationals.

The gang prepared fake visas by using forged and tampered documents. They would charge Rs 20 to 25 lakh for their services.

The police acted on a complaint filed by the embassy of Ecuador that an organised gang was providing fake visas of Ecuador.

### **Thane auto drivers plan strike on July 12 & 13**

No autorickshaws will ply in Thane on July 12 and 13 as the unions have called for a two-day strike to demand a fare hike from the state government.

Nine auto unions in Thane--some of which are run by the NCP, Shiv Sena and MNS--have jointly called for a strike. Union leaders alleged that they had been 'cheated' by the government. Last week, the transport ministry fixed uniform tariff rates for both Mumbai and Thane autos, with the basic fare at Rs 11 and Rs 6.50 for every additional kilometre. While fares in Mumbai increased by two rupees, the tariff in Thane went up by just a rupee--from Rs 10 to Rs 11.

## **Builder shot dead in Thane**

A builder from Titwala Rajesh Jadhav (32) was shot dead on Thursday by a group of persons, district rural police said.

According to the police, five persons went to the office of the builder in the town by afternoon and first hit him with stone and later fired at him at point black range and killed him. The motive behind the killing was not known.

#### **CBI books 2 Canara Bank officials for Rs 10cr swindle**

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has filed a chargesheet against two officers of Canara Bank, five others and a private limited company at a Kolkata court for allegedly causing wrongful loss to the bank to the tune of Rs 9.83 crore.

Officials said that the chargesheet was filed under various sections of the IPC and the Prevention of Corruption Act. The case was registered by CBI on February 17, 2009.

#### **DVD piracy racket busted, four held**

The sophistication and scale of film piracy came to light on Thursday when police unearthed a state-of-the-art printing and duplication unit with machinery worth Rs 7 crore at

Royapettah. The racket, run from a shop close to the Zam Bazaar police station, brought out pirated DVDs of latest movies in Tamil, Telugu and Hindi.

Acting on a tip-off, the sleuths conducted raids at three offset printing centres at Dams Street in Chintadripet and Abdul Ali Khan Street and Chella Pillayar Koil Street. They arrested K Suresh (24), K Suresh (25), N Basheer (23) and L Balakrishnan (26).

With the arrests, it has been confirmed that many such small-scale units are functioning in the city. The racketeers get the master DVDs either from Puducherry or from abroad and make copies locally.

### **Burglars strike at two places**

Burglars struck at two places at Rajakilpakkam near Tambaram early on Wednesday morning. In the first incident, a group of armed men threatened an electrical contractor at knifepoint and took away cash and jewellery.

R. Muthukumar (28) of Rajaji Nagar, Rajakilpakkam, was a contractor of electrical and electronic goods. He had constructed a small thatched hut on the terrace of his house and was sleeping inside. Around 3 a.m. on Wednesday, a group of men knocked at the door. When he opened the door, they barged into the house and threatened him at knifepoint. They tied him up, opened an almirah inside the hut and took away Rs.1.6 lakh and gold jewellery weighing 25 sovereigns. Special crime teams have been formed to trace the assailants and the stolen property.

Similarly, burglars gained entry into the house of an advocate in neighbouring Thiru Vi. Ka. Street in Rajakilpakkam.

### Local train timings changed

The Pune division of the Central Railway has introduced certain changes in the timings of local trains and some of the long-distance trains leaving from Pune railway station. The change in timings were introduced from Thursday.

Timings of four local trains to Lonavla and two to Talegaon have been changed. The Lonavla-Pune local (L 31) will arrive at Pune station at 12.50 am, instead of 12.40 am. The Pune-Lonavla local (L 4) will leave Pune station at 4.35 am, instead of 4.25 am. The Pune-Lonavla local (L 20) will leave Pune station at 3 pm, instead of 3.40 pm. The Pune-Lonavla local (L 28) will leave Pune station at 7.05 pm, instead of 7 pm. Besides this, the Talegaon-Pune local (T 5) will leave Pune station at 4.40 pm, instead of 4 pm and the Pune-Talegaon (T 6) local will leave Pune station at 3.40 pm, instead of 3 pm.

Among the long-distance trains, the Solapur-Pune Passenger train will arrive at Daund at 4.55 pm, instead of 4.35 pm. It will reach Pune at 7.05 pm, instead of 6.55 pm. The Pune-Solapur Passenger will leave Pune at 10.50 pm and will reach Solapur at 07.20 am, instead of 06.40 am. The Gorakhpur-Pune Express will reach Pune at 4.05 am, instead of 4.20 am.

Halts at Kashti have been introduced for Manmad-Pune Passenger, Nanded-Daund Passenger and Nizamabad-Pune Passenger from July 1.

**Reds enforced Bihar bandh on 38 days in 6 mths**

A Maoists-sponsored bandh is no longer a news in Bihar in that it has become a regular feature with as many as 19 bandhs called by the Reds in the state this year alone. These exclude the 48-hour bandh called by them from June 29 midnight against "anti-people policies of the Central government".

The reasons for earlier bandhs included alleged violation of human rights by security personnel, arrest of comrades and, of course, Operation Green Hunt.

According to figures compiled by the Bihar police HQ, the state during the past six months saw bandhs called by the Maoists on 38 days. In terms of hours \_\_ the Maoists usually give call for 24, 48 or 72 hours, they enforced bandh for 912 hours from January to June this year.

#### 15-yr-old held for manipulating ATMs

A 15-year-old boy landed in a police lock-up in Moradabad on Wednesday afternoon for manipulating the ATMs to withdraw huge sums of money. Monu alias Sohrit (name changed), a school dropout from Ghaziabad, had allegedly withdrawn lakhs of rupees through criminal means and was arrested on the basis of video footages of security cameras installed inside some ATM booths.

As per the Moradabad district police chief - deputy inspector general (DIG) Badri Prasad, Sohrit used to operate the ATM of a particular banking organisation immediately after the last user had withdrawn his card from the machine slot. By doing some manipulations, he used to cancel last transaction option, re-enter the particular account and withdraw cash.

### Amid curfew, clashes continue in Kashmir

Even as Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah asked his Ministers to visit various areas to restore peace, life in the Kashmir Valley remained affected for the fifth day on Thursday with curfew in force and eruption of clashes.

With roads wearing a deserted look and uneasy calm prevailing, life remained hit for the fifth day in Sopore and for the third day in Anantnag and Baramulla, besides adjoining areas.

Despite restrictions enforced by the police and the Central Reserve Police Force, people took to the streets in Sopore, Sangam, Bijbehara, Malak Nag and Anchidora and staged demonstrations in protest against the killing of 11 youths by the CRPF and the police in the past 11 days.

In Srinagar, severe restrictions were in force for the third day. All shops, educational institutions, banks, petrol pumps, business establishments and government offices remained shut on Thursday. Private operators ran skeletal transport service in the civil lines.

Protests erupted at Kawdara, Natipora, Chattabal, Parimpora, Bemina and Maisuma in the city, with scores of people staging demonstrations.

### **35 killed, 175 injured in 3 suicide blasts at Pak shrine**

Three suicide bombers struck in quick succession at a famous Sufi shrine here tonight, killing 35 people and injuring 175 others, officials said.

One attacker blew himself up at the crowded entrance to the shrine and the second in the basement, where people perform ablutions before entering the complex.

The third bomber detonated his explosive vest in a part of the shrine adjoining a busy market. Thirty-five people were killed and 175 injured in the blasts, Lahore Commissioner Khusro Pervez said. Twenty-five of the injured were in a serious condition.
