Rs 5-lakh burglary in trader's house

Some unidentified men decamped with jewellery and cash over Rs 5 lakh from a house in the Bali Nagar locality of west Delhi.

According to the police, the incident was reported from house number G-20 last evening. The house is owned by one Gurjeet Singh.

The burglars broke open the door of the house and ransacked the cupboards when Singh had gone to Mehrauli Gurdwara with the family. Singh said that the burglars took away around 20 tolas of gold jewellery and about Rs 1.5 lakh.

Singh is in catering business and had got the jewellery made for his niece's marriage to be held on June 3 in Punjab. The family was to leave for the marriage yesterday itself.

Short-circuit in transformer led to mishap

The fire that broke out at Bombay Hospital was caused by a short circuit in the transformer of the main hospital building, a preliminary report of the fire department said on Tuesday.

The report prepared by an investigating staff and submitted to the fire department's HQ in Byculla on Tuesday pointed out that a defective electric circuit had caused the fire in the building's sub-station. The report will now be submitted to the civic administration.

The fire damaged electrical wiring, high tension-cables and circuit-breakers, said civic sources. It disrupted the hospital's power supply and the hospital had to depend on backup electricity and generators for more than 24 hours.

36-hr power cut, patients suffer

For over 36 hours, patients admitted to the city's largest private hospital—Bombay Hospital in New Marine Lines—and their relatives spent agonising moments in power failure. In the modern-day calamity of sorts, all surgeries scheduled in the last two days were postponed, high-end diagnostic tests couldn't be performed and patients had to make do with makeshift arrangements for water and electricity. In the usually chilly zones of the hospital, relatives were using books to fan their seriously ill patients.

Abducted kid's father handed over ATM card to kidnapper

Three-year-old Aman Gupta, who had been abducted on May 14, was released a week later after his father Pappu Gupta handed over his ATM card to business partner Rakesh Singh.

It was Singh who had allegedly abducted the boy to extract a big amount from Pappu, say police. Pappu had borrowed Rs 2 lakh from Singh two years ago but failed to return the money. Police are now trying to trace Singh. After abducting Aman, he had been calling Pappu and asking for a ransom of Rs 5 lakh. The latter, however, didn't have that much money with him.

Finally, on May 21, Singh agreed to release Aman after Pappu handed over his ATM card to him.

Contractors' protest on June 4 for bills

Contractors implementing irrigation projects, roads and other infrastructure works resolved to stage a dharna here on June 4 to register their protest over non-payment of bills and demand the release of Rs. 5,000 crore.

The Builders Association of India chairman A. Sudhakar Reddy told that about 1,200 contractors had pending bills amounting to Rs. 4,000 crore for irrigation works under Jalayagnam and Rs. 1,000 crore more for roads and infrastructure works.

Experts warn of vector-borne diseases during monsoon

The ensuing monsoon is set to bring in the much-needed relief from the sizzling weather but health experts are anticipating an outbreak of vector-borne diseases this year. Since the pre-monsoon showers, 10-12 malaria and diarrhoea cases are being reported on a daily basis in the Greater Hyderabad limits already.

Last year too, monsoon had snuffed out several lives due to the dengue epidemic and other viral fevers in the city. Doctors said that viral fevers including dengue, chikungunya and malaria are likely to increase as the cooler climate is conducive for the survival of the virus.

Patna petrol pump catches fire

Panic prevailed at Boring Road here on Tuesday afternoon as an oil tanker downloading petrol at Gasolene petrol outlet caught fire. Panic prevailed in the area as the flames leapt high with shops in the vicinity downing their shutters.

Petrol pump owner Amit Mukherjee said a spark from an adjoining transformer hit the oil tanker and it burst into flames. Tanker driver Tribhuwan Prasad Yadav said the vehicle contained about 6,000 litres of petrol as he had earlier downloaded over 6,000 litres in another underground storage of the petrol pump. A spark emanating from a motorcycle, whose owner started his bike after taking petrol, touched the pipe used in downloading petrol and soon the entire tanker caught fire, he added.

The flames were doused by the fire-fighting men. The petrol station was badly damaged. Even the oil tanker was completely gutted due to the fire.

Interstate gang of auto-lifters busted

With the arrest of three members of a gang, Mansa police claims to have busted an interstate gang of auto-lifters. Police have recovered 8 vehicles including 5 small trucks, 3 tractors and a motorcycle from the gang. The market cost of the stolen vehicles is said to be over Rs 30 lakh. Two members of the group are still at large.

Apart from this, the district police also claimed to have recovered 8 more vehicles including 6 cars from different areas in the last some days. The gang members used to sell the stolen vehicles after preparing and affixing fake registration certificates (RCs).

Woman duped of Rs 24.6 lakh

A Surat woman, who lost Rs 24.65 lakh in a multi-level marketing scheme, has alleged that she was duped by a man who promised her three times the investment in six months straight. She has filed a complaint of cheating with Satellite police station officials against the man.

An ardent follower of a religious sect, she would frequent Ahmedabad for this purpose. During her visits, she came in touch with Hrishikesh Bhavsar, a resident of Ankur crossroads, Naranpura, who promised her to treble her investment if she brings in required members of investors.

She found the scheme very lucrative and invested Rs 2.46 lakh in it. She used her social circle in Surat and Ahmedabad and approached several persons, and roped in 20 persons who joined the business chain by paying Rs 85,000 each. They were again asked to rope in new members

and some of them succeeded in that. In all, she paid to the company Rs 24.65 lakh between July 2009 and May 2010.

Cyclone 'Phet' to hit Gujarat

Gales blowing at a speed of 55 kmph and thunderstorm claimed two lives and injured seven in Rajkot district on Tuesday night, even as met department issued an alert for a cyclone storm, christened Phet, that may hit the state's coast in the next 48 hours.

The hot and sultry weather underwent a dramatic change in several parts of the state, including Ahmedabad, which also witnessed lightning.

A deep depression over Arabian sea which has intensified into a cyclone storm will be preceded by stormy weather in next 24 hours, according to the met department.

President's rule in Jharkhand

Jharkhand on Tuesday came under Central rule with President Pratibha Patil accepting a recommendation of the Union Cabinet after the Congress and the BJP gave up efforts to form an alternative government following the resignation of Chief Minister Shibu Soren.

The Assembly will be kept in suspended animation during President's rule, which has been imposed for a second time in two years.

The Congress and the BJP had both indicated their inability to form an alternative government in the State. The Soren government was reduced to a minority on May 24 when the BJP, with 18 MLAs and the JD(U) with two, withdrew support to it.

Militants blow up girls' school in northwest Pakistan

Pro-Taliban militants blew up a girls' primary school and a health centre in the restive Mohmand tribal region in northwest Pakistan on Tuesday, officials said.

The militants laid explosive materials around the girls' primary school and a rural health centre in Khushal Kale area of Mohmand Agency and blew them up.

Local residents said three explosions had rocked the area. There were no reports of casualties.

£5.5 million jewellery heist in France

A robbery by armed bandits who made off with 200kg gold jewellery worth £5.5 million has left French detectives baffled and quietly impressed.

Officers described the raid, in which a jewellery wholesaler and his family were held at gunpoint overnight, as a professional job carried out with military precision. In terms of forward planning, audacity and meticulous attention to detail, the robbery resembled the plot of the Hollywood film Ocean's Eleven.

Details of the robbery, which have just emerged, suggest the gang had been preparing the operation for some time. Just before midnight last Wednesday, the gang ambushed gold and jewel dealer Bruno Franchini (39), as he drove his Mercedes to his home in the fishing port of Cassis, near Marseille.
