Builder's action sparks protests in Gurgaon

Residents of Ambience Lagoon Apartments in Gurgaon carried out a demonstration against their builder, M/s Ambience Developers and Infrastructure Pvt Ltd on Saturday for not allowing them to use the parking space outside their residential complex and for allegedly starting commercial construction in residential area.

The residents had recently filed an FIR against the builder for allegedly giving incorrect information about the total area on which their apartments have been constructed. The RWA had also served a legal notice to the builder alleging that the area for which the builder actually obtained a licence to build the housing complex was 18.98 acres, while the actual area it occupies is only 7.98 acres.

Navy foils piracy attempt

The Indian navy on Saturday foiled a piracy attempt on cargo vessel MV Sanderling Ace in the Gulf of Aden. The vessel had sent out a distress call after sighting seven persons aboard a white skiff (a small boat) approaching it at 20 knots. MV Sanderling Ace also raised an alarm on Ship Security Alert System.

A warship deployed by the Indian navy in the Gulf of Aden received a distress call from the vessel around 5.30 pm on Saturday. Upon receiving the call, the naval warship immediately launched helicopter Chetak to intercept the boat. Officials fired warning shots from the chopper, following which those aboard the skiff stopped proceeding towards the vessel.

A navy officer said pirates for the fear of being apprehended throw their weapons into the sea. Post 26/11, the navy has increased surveillance on the seas.

Gang of robbers busted in south Mumbai

A gang of six robbers who used to target jewellers, hawala operators and businessmen in recently.

The police are planning to invoke the stringent MCOCA on the gang. Acting on a tip off, senior inspector Arun Borude and his team laid a trap near Zaveri Bazaar and arrested the six robbers who were armed with revolvers, choppers, a rope and chilli powder. All the accused have at least six cases of robbery each registered against them.

Policemen open fire at gang, arrest six, rescue 12 women

In an early morning operation on Sunday, the Bangalore police shot at the alleged kidnappers of 12 women, who were working as bar tenders in a city hotel, and rescued them. Wasim, the younger brother of Nasru, who has been involved in the abduction of women in the past, and his accomplice Syed Pasha were shot at near Bagalur Circle on the outskirts of Bangalore. Another accused Hidayat suffered injuries on the head.

Acting swiftly on a complaint of abduction, the city police stopped the multi-utility vehicle in which the women were being taken away. Three persons, including Wasim, reportedly attacked the police with a sword and Koramangala police inspector G. Nagaraj was injured on his hand, while constables Harinath and Fakruddin received bruises on their faces. All the injured were taken to the Victoria Hospital.

However, this is different from what the employees have to say in the matter. They have decided to proceed on a 24-hours token strike even if the talks help reach a consensus.

The basic demand of the employees is the implementation of the sixth pay commission. The employees want revised pay scales from January 1, 2006. The employees are negotiating their 17-point demands with the government.

Fake emails promising fortune money continue to allure people

Despite growing number of scams related to lucky draws, death wills and schemes surfacing over last couple of years, people are still falling prey to such allurements. The promises of big prize money or inheriting property from some unknown people are enough to draw unsuspecting people into the scamsters' net. Another such case came to light recently when a citizen was duped of Rs 30,000 by unidentified men who claimed to represent UK-based Loomis Finace Int T.

A resident of Sama got a sms a month back stating "Congratulations. You have won! To redeem your prize money of one million Great British Pounds contact the company via email". Prasad mailed on the email address given in the sms and he got a reply that asked him to deposit Rs 30,000 in Indian Customs Services (ICS) at Indira Gandhi International Airport in Delhi.

Scotland Yard warns of 26/11-style attack on London

In the “bluntest” warning issued by the British police, Scotland Yard has said that businesses in the city of London could face a Mumbai-style terror attack early next year.

The detective said companies should anticipate a shooting and hostage-taking raid “involving a small number of gunmen with handguns and improvised explosive devices”.

The warning issued by the police has underlined an assessment that a terrorist cell may be preparing an attack on London early next year, it said. Patrick Mercer, Chairman of the Commons counter-terrorism sub-committee, said the threat was “very real”.
