Three LTTE operatives held

Three suspected operatives of the LTTE were arrested and a cache of detonators was seized from their possession, four days after a member of the banned outfit was nabbed by the police.

The trio was arrested by the Tamil Nadu 'Q' branch during a raid at Tiruchirapalli. 4,900 ordinary detonators and 430 electric detonators were seized from them, an official release said here.

Siva, Selvam, Tamiz stayed illegally in Chennai, Erode and Tiruchirapalli, respectively, without registering themselves as Sri Lankan Tamils, it said, adding that strict vigil along the coastal areas prevented them from smuggling the detonators to Sri Lanka.

Shop looted, watches worth Rs 2 cr stolen

It turned to be a black Saturday for Pruthviraj, owner of a watch and pen showroom, when he came to open the shop at Richmond Circle at 10 am. He realized miscreants had looted the shop and made away with watches and pens worth over Rs 2 crore. Pruthviraj, hailing from Rajasthan, had set up the showroom 10 years ago. It had high-end watches and pens like Rado, Rolex, Piccasa, Longines, and so on.

According to police, on Friday night, the burglars broke open the locks of outer rolling shutter and closed it after entering inside.

Then they broke the central lock of the inner rolling shutter using crow bars. There were over 25 showcases in the shop, of which seven were broken. They took the watches and pens, throwing away the cases inside the shop.

DCP Central G Ramesh said that the shop had a CCTV, which was switched on only during the day.

Businessman arrested for loan fraud

The police yesterday arrested a Panchkula-based businessman on charges of duping a city resident of Rs 17 lakh by issuing him postdated cheques against a family loan taken from the latter.

Officials in the economic offences wing (EOW) of the Chandigarh police said the accused, identified as Sajveev Kumar of Sector 2 and owner of Shisha Hub in Sector 5, Panchkula, was arrested last night.

A case of cheating has been registered against him on a complaint lodged by Vijay Kumar Verma, superintendent in the Punjab Water Resources Management and Development Corporation.

Verma had alleged that he had given Rs 17 lakh to the accused as family loan at various intervals from 2006 to 2008. The accused had given him a Maruti Zen and a Hyundai Accent.

Later, recovery agents of a private bank came to Verma's house, saying that the instalments had not been paid and they wanted to take the cars in their possession.

He then took up the matter with the accused, who gave him over 24 postdated cheques for Rs 50,000 each. However, he was shocked to find that the accused had closed his account.

Srinagar on the boil as youth is killed in police firing

One person was killed and five were injured on Sunday when police fired on people protesting against the death of a youth on Saturday evening.

A curfew-like situation is evident in many parts of Srinagar as the authorities try to control the situation, which has turned volatile with three civilian deaths in 10 days. Tempers ran high as people assembled to bury Rafiq. The mourners took out a procession, shouting anti-India and pro-freedom slogans.

Javed Ahmad Mallah, 25, who was injured, died on way to the hospital. Another injured person is stated to be critical.

The incident caused the situation to deteriorate, with people taking to the streets to protest against the firing. Authorities immediately deployed the CRPF and the police in the affected areas.

Javed's death evoked widespread condemnation from all political parties. Calling the incident "a barbaric act," both factions of the Hurriyat Conference have asked the people to observe a bandh on Monday. The Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front, Jamiat-e-Ahla Hadees and Jamiat-e Islami have extended support to the strike call.

A(H1N1) claims three more lives

The Influenza A (H1N1) infection has claimed three more lives in the State, taking the total death toll during the second spell of the infection to 25. All three deaths were reported from Thiruvananthapuram

The deaths, confirmed as due to H1N1, are of Sreelakshmi (29), of Kazhakuttam, who died at the Medical College hospital here on June 18; Mini Rajesh (34) of Pallikkal who died on June 19 at Gokulam Medical College and Simi (22) of Edava, who had been pregnant and who died while under treatment at the Thiruvananthapuram MCH.

Thirty new cases of H1N1 were also confirmed in the State on Sunday.

These include 12 cases reported from Thiruvananthapuram, six from Kozhikode, two each from Kollam, Ernakulam, Thrissur and Wayanad, three cases from Malappuram and one case from Idukki.

Al-Qaida warns of new attacks deadlier than before

Al-Qaida's US-born spokesman warned President Barack Obama on Sunday that the militant group may launch new attacks that would kill more Americans than previous ones.

In a taunting, 24 minute message that dwelled on Obama's setbacks, including the loss of Massachusetts Senate seat to the Republicans, Adam Gadahn set out al-Qaida's conditions for

peace with the US, including cutting support for Israel and withdrawal of troops from Afghanistan.
