Traffic to be closed

The Traffic Police are planning to completely close the Mahatma Gandhi Road between Web's Junction and Trinity Circle for vehicular traffic for a couple of months from March 1 to facilitate the speedy completion of the Trinity Circle Metro Station work.

While they had announced the partial closure of the road towards Web's Junction from Trinity Circle a couple of weeks ago, the police are planning to completely close down the road till May to allow Bangalore Metro to speed up the work, said a senior police officer.

As a result, vehicles coming from Swami Vivekananda Road (from Ulsoor Police Station) towards M.G. Road have to take a right turn at Kamadhenu Junction and proceed on Ulsoor Road taking a left turn at Begum Mahal Junction to join Dickenson Road.

Vehicles from Airport Road, HOSMAT Hospital Road and Trinity Church Road should take a left turn at Begum Mahal Junction after passing Trinity Junction to reach Ulsoor Road and Dickenson Road.

Security further step-up at key establishments

The Pune police have further stepped up security in the area around German Bakery and Camp following inputs that these areas can be possible targets for future attacks.

Key establishments like the Osho International Meditation Centre and the Chhabad House are located in close proximity to the bakery where a powerful blast on last Saturday has killed 13 people so far.

Security has also been beefed up at Ohel David Synagogue at Ambedkar road, known as Lal Deval and a Jewish prayer centre at Rasta Peth. Besides patrolling between Lal Deval and Ambedkar statue on Moledina road and Parmar chowk in Camp has been increased. A striking force was stationed outside a mosque used by the Iranians at Imambara on Synagogue street.

The police have started a sensitisation drive in educational institutions briefing 43,411 students in the last three days, he stated. The police have also requested private parties to provide them with land for starting an independent police station at Koregaon Park.

Two more succumb, Pune blast toll 15

Two students succumbed on Sunday morning to their injuries sustained in the February 13 Pune terror blast, taking the toll to 15.

Electricity company staffers to go on strike tomorrow

Employees affiliated to over 20 unions in the Maharashtra State Electricity Distribution Company Ltd (MSEDCL), transmission company (MSETCL) and generation company (MSPGCL) will go on a day's strike on February 23, to protest against gradual privatisation of the power sector through the franchisee mode.

However, the administration on Sunday declared the strike 'illegal' and invoked the Essential Services Maintenance Act 1968 (Esma). It warned of strict action against the employees if they participated in the strike called by all major unions except the Maharashtra State Electricity Workers Federation affiliated to INTUC.

Jewellery worth Rs 7.12L stolen from Khadia derasar

A Jain derasar has filed a complaint with Khadia police against a priest's helper at the temple for theft of Rs 7.12 lakh. According to complaint filed by Vijay Shah, a resident of Ellisbridge and a trustee of Shreyansnath derasar in Shamla ni Pol, Khadia, the accused Jeetendra Singh Chauhan, a helper with a priest from Rajasthan, has stolen 33 kilograms of silver ornaments worth Rs 6.60 lakh and 44 grams of gold ornaments worth Rs 52,800 from the safe of the derasar.

According to trustees, the jewellery was used only for one big religious event on Phalguni Sudi Trij every year and was kept in the safe for rest of the time. The safe is never opened by other men. However, Chauhan somehow got hold of the key or made a duplicate one and stole the jewellery between February 28, 2009 and February 17, 2010.

Tight security for Budget session

While as the opposition parties are all prepared to grill the government on certain issues, the authorities have finalised all arrangements for the smooth conduct of the Budget session of the Assembly commencing from tomorrow.

Unprecedented security arrangements have made been for the session as a large number of cops have been deployed in Shalmar and adjoining localities.

Clashes in valley

Tension prevailed in parts of the Kashmir valley, including the Maisuma locality in Srinagar, and Baramulla district yesterday following the arrest of some youths who had pelted the police with stones.

In Baramulla, clashes between the police and local youths were reported from various parts. A large number of youths threw stones at security personnel while demanding the release of those detained in the last two days for protesting against alleged human rights violations in the valley.

Since early morning, the youths gathered at various places in the town and threw stones at the security forces, prompting them to fire rubber bullets and lob tear gas shells.

The police also resorted to a cane charge to disperse the violent mob. Four persons were injured in the clashes.

2 KLF terrorists held, Nabha- Punjab

In a major breakthrough, the Special Investigating Team (SIT) of the Patiala police, in coordination with the Intelligence Wing of Punjab, claimed to have arrested two terrorists of

the Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF) from Nabha. Stating that the terrorists were planning to strike at vital installations in Punjab, senior police officials confirmed that explosives and fire arms had also been seized from the arrested terrorists, identified as Jasbir Singh, alias Jassa, and Harjant Singh, alias DC. The main accused in the case Bakhshish Singh and Pargat Singh are, however, still absconding but raids are being conducted to arrest them.

Confiscated explosives include 40 gelatin sticks, an 8-kg crude bomb with detonator and fire arms, including one nine mm pistol with six cartridges and one .315-bore pistol with five cartridges. While confirming that the arrested duo were behind the planting of the bombs near the LPG Bottling Plant in Nabha, outside the Air Force Station Halwara and the Ambala Military area during the past one-and-a-half months, IG Patiala Zone Paramjit Singh Gill said the recovered explosives were of a very “high intensity” that could lead to devastation, if exploded. “The recovered crude bomb was capable of causing massive damage. The bombs planted in Nabha, Halwara and Ambala failed to explode due to technical reasons,” said Gill.

Security stepped up in vital places- Puducherry

In the wake of warning issued by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs of a possible terror attack in Puducherry, a large number of police personnel have been deployed in important places to prevent any incident.

Besides personnel from the territorial force and the India Reserve Battalion, two companies from the Tamil Nadu police were also positioned in important places including the Aurobindo Ashram, Manakula Vinayagar Temple, French Consulate, beach and the railway station.

50 new cars gutted in Mysore blaze

About 50 brand new cars standing in a stockyard on the city's outskirts were burnt in a raging blaze that spread like wildfire due to dry grass and a hot breeze, a fire brigade official said.

The fire took place late afternoon at Arasu Motors compound in Hebbal industrial area (6 km from the city) after a car caught fire and its flames leapt to other 45-50 cars parked in the courtyard.

Though no casualties or injuries were reported, the damage to the car dealer is estimated to be around Rs 3 crore (Rs 30 million). Most of the cars destroyed in the mishap were Tata Indica models. The cause of the fire is being investigated though initial reports suggest sparks from one of cars ignited the flames and spread to other cars. The wild grass in the yard accentuated the blaze.

Violence during curfew relaxation in Batala

A few shops were damaged when the curfew, imposed in the town on Saturday after violence over the publication of a picture of Jesus Christ in an allegedly objectionable manner, was relaxed for an hour on Sunday.
