Gunmen rob Rs 31 lakh from Malad bank in daytime

In a daring daylight robbery, four armed men barged into a Malad-based bank and decamped with Rs 31 lakh on Monday evening. Before this, the last big bank robbery in Mumbai was reported from Dadar in May 2009, when two armed men robbed Rs 28 lakh from a co-operative bank, close to Bhoiwada police station.

In Monday's incident, four unidentified robbers entered Model Co-operative Bank, located on Orlem Tank Road, Malad (west). The bank operates in two shifts. The robbers entered around 4.30 pm when the staffers' second shift had just begun.

GJM threatens to call fast-unto-death

Even as the indefinite strike called by it entered its third day in the Darjeeling hills on Monday, the leadership of the Gorkha Janamukti Morcha (GJM) decided to intensify its agitation and threatened to call a "fast-unto-death" in the three hill sub-divisions from June 27.

The GJM is demanding a judicial probe into the baton-charge on its supporters in Kurseong on June 16, transfer of the sub-divisional police officer there and removal of B.L. Meena from the post of administrator of the Darjeeling Gorkha Hill Council.

Normal life in the Darjeeling hills has been severely affected since the beginning of the strike on June 19. Police have provided vehicles for tourists to leave the hill-town.

It was 11 am and just another business day at the State Bank of India branch in bustling Lalbagh area. The staff of this comparatively small branch were busy catering to a small spurt in customers. But what was about to unfold was not just an in-the-face dacoity attempt, but a smooth professional effort to con the entire bank!

A gang of nine members entered the bank at intervals, and kept the staff and customers engaged, while one of them tried to loot the cash. But the alert cashier saved the bank of Rs 16 lakh. All this has been captured on the bank's CCTV network. The gang member was nabbed in the nick of time.

Successful with looting individuals with 'attention diversion' tactics outside banks, this gang may have got ambitious and decided to try and divert the attention of the bank staff too.

Dengue, chikungunya cases on the rise

Inclement weather over the past few weeks has triggered the spread of vector-borne diseases, particularly dengue and chikungunya.

According to the Bruhat Bangalore Mahanagara Palike, from January to May, 60 positive cases of dengue and 23 chikungunya cases were reported from across the city. However, the number has seen a slight increase after the onset of monsoon.

Confirming this, BBMP's Chief Health Officer L.T. Gayatri said 112 positive cases of dengue and 41 of chikungunya had been reported so far.

Two killed in bomb attack in Kadapa

Two persons were killed and another severely injured when unidentified persons hurled country-made bombs at a complex of government offices in Muddanur town in Kadapa district on Monday.

The masked men threw bombs apparently to kill TDP leader K Venkata Reddy, who had come to the police station located in the complex in connection with an attack case in which he was an accused.

While Reddy managed to escape by locking himself in a room in MPDO office, an attender in the MPDO office, Ankamma, and Reddy's aide Ramasubba Reddy died on the spot. Another attender, Munuswamy, suffered grievous injuries in the attack.

Maoists torch road firm's machines for 'levy'

Suspected Maoists raided the office of a private road construction firm and set afire several machines late on Friday night at Dulhin Bazaar locality, 70 km from here, under the Paliganj subdivision. The company is engaged in construction of Pali-Masaurhi road at an estimated cost of Rs 18 crore.

Firm's `munshi' Deepu told that Maoists, numbering 150 to 200, reached the company's store house near Jhalki Singh High School around 11 pm and forced the employees to open the door. They took out 1,500 litres of diesel from the store and poured it on two dumpers, two tractors, two other machines and one motorcycle and set them afire.

Night trains suspended in naxal-hit areas

Several trains running on Kharagpur-Rourkela and Kharagpur-Adra section continued to be diverted, re-scheduled or regulated as Indian Railways decided to persist on its decision to suspend of night-time movement of passenger and goods trains in Maoist-affected areas.

In view of security reasons, running of the passenger trains on Kharagpur-Rourkela and Kharagpur-Adra section would continue to remain suspended up to June 26 during the night hours from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., said an East Coast Railway statement here on Monday. It has been three weeks now since Indian Railways has suspended night time movement of trains. The decision was taken following last month's Gyaneshwari Train derailment which killed 150 persons in West Bengal. As per ECoR, the Howrah-Koraput-Howrah Express would run via Howrah-Kharagpur-Bhadrak-Angul-Sambalpur and vice versa instead of Howrah-Kharagpur-Tata-Jharsuguda-Sambalpur.

The 5639 Puri-Guwahati Weekly Express on Tuesday has been re-scheduled to leave Puri at 10 p.m. instead of 2.15 p.m.

Bandh in valley over youth's death

At least 33 persons were injured today in fresh clashes between protesters and the police in different parts of the Kashmir valley where a bandh was observed in protest against the killing of a youth, Javed Ahmad Malla, in CRPF firing yesterday.

The bandh call was given by both factions of the Hurriyat Conference, the JKLF and other social and religious organisations.

A curfew-like situation prevailed in several parts of the city. The areas included Khanyar, Nowhatta, Safakadal, MR Gunj, and Rainawari.

Meanwhile, the Government has asked the Kashmir Divisional Commissioner to enquire into the circumstances surrounding the death of Javid Ahmad Malla of Noorbagh, Srinagar. The enquiry has to be completed and submitted to the Government by June 28.
