Girl raises alarm, helps nab burglars in Saket

A 21-year-old girl helped police catch two burglars who were looting an empty flat at Saket in south Delhi on Sunday.

The police have arrested Jitender Kumar (20) and Punit (19) and seized the stolen goods. The police said the girl, who stays in SFS Flats at Saket, heard noises in her neighbour's house and knowing that the occupants were out of town, informed her uncle and then the police at 5 am on December 20. "A police team reached Saket and surrounded the flat. The team apprehended the criminals when they were leaving the flat after robbing it.

Home Safety Information

If you are concerned about residential burglaries in your neighborhood, you do not have to feel powerless to change the situation. Most residential burglars look for crimes of opportunity. They pick what appears to be an easy mark. There are many steps that you can take to keep your home and your neighborhood safe. The most important step is for you and your neighbors to work together.

How to prevent:

- Never allow people you do not know into your home, such as a door-to-door sales person, a person asking to use the phone or looking for a supposed neighbor.
- Always keep your doors and windows locked day and night.
- Never leave your garage door open.
- Don't have your valuables visible through windows.
- Keep ladders locked in the garage. Burglars can use them for access to otherwise inaccessible second story windows.
- Don't forget when going on vacation to hold or to have someone pick up your mail/newspapers.
- Don't hide a key outside for visiting friends and relatives.
- Don't advertise new gifts or purchases. Break up the cartons before leaving them at the curb.
- Call the police immediately when you see suspicious persons or activities
- Get to know the police officers in your area.
- If you live in an apartment complex let management know of any problems in the community.
- Start or join a Neighborhood Watch Program

'MNS workers' batter priest at Prabhadevi, three arrested

A few priests, sleeping near the Siddhivinayak Temple at Prabhadevi, were beaten up late on Monday night allegedly by MNS workers. Police have picked up three members of the party in connection with the case.

The three have been identified as Vishvanath Naik, 42; Laxman Patil, 42; and Kiran Kadivarekar, 26. MNS general secretary Atul Sarpotdar denied the involvement of his party members in the attack.

The incident took place between 12.30 am and 1 am, when five to seven people carrying sticks forcibly awoke 15 to 20 sadhus (most of them are above 50 years of age) sleeping near the wall behind Ravindra Natyamandir Hall and abused them. They were slapped, abused and beaten up with sticks. The attackers were speaking in Hindi and warned the sadhus not to come near the temple again.

Three held for fraud

The police yesterday arrested three of the 11 accused in a forgery case. Complainant Gurjant Singh, a resident of Moli Baidwan village, Sohana, alleged to the police that the accused had duped him of Rs 11.60 lakh.

The arrested accused have been identified as Kulwinder Singh, alias Kala, Lalu and Somnath, all residents of Banur. The three accused were produced in the court and sent to police remand for one day.

Gurjant Singh alleged that the accused had called him on his mobile phone two months back and said they had gold in large quantity. They told him that they were ready to sell the gold at the rate of Rs 11,000 per tola. The complainant said he reached near the bus stand at Chhat village along with Rs 3.60 lakh and handed over the money to the accused. on December 19, Gurjant Singh met the accused at the gurdwara in Chhat village and handed over Rs 8 lakh to Kala and his accomplices. After giving him a fake gold brick, the accused fled from the spot along with their accomplices who were waiting in a car.

Swine flu kills 9 in 48 hours

Swine flu claimed nine lives in two days in Gujarat as two more people succumbed to H1N1 with the total death toll climbing to 73.

On Monday, seven people had succumbed to swine flu. On Tuesday, the H1N1 virus claimed two more lives as Kaushal Gupta, 69, died in Sterling Hospital in Ahmedabad while Ramlal Mavadia, 76, succumbed in GG Civil Hospital in Jamnagar. At least three more people died on Tuesday due to suspected swine flu but their test results are yet to be ascertained.

The high number of deaths has sent alarm bells ringing as health officials urged private medical practitioners to follow renewed World Health Organisation (WHO) guidelines and administer Tamiflu to suspected swine flu patients in the initial days of symptoms to avoid

complications.

Three killed in suicide blast outside Press Club in Pak city

A suicide bomber blew himself up outside the Press Club in Peshawar on Tuesday killing at least three persons and injuring several others, including journalists, in the latest in a wave of terror attacks that have rocked Pakistan.

The bomber detonated his explosives when a policeman deployed at the gate of the Press Club tried to prevent him from entering the premises. The policeman was among the three persons who died in the blast, local media reported.

Journalists were among the several persons injured in the explosion, the latest in a series of bombings and suicide attacks in Peshawar that has killed hundreds of people.

Travel travails: After trains, snow grounds Europe jets

Mass flight cancellations heaped fresh misery on European travellers Tuesday, as the freezing weather that has caused at least 90 deaths brought chaos to Christmas holiday plans.

In a relief, cross-Channel Eurostar trains began running between London and continental Europe on Tuesday after four days of cancellations blamed on powdery snow left tens of thousands stranded just before Christmas.

However, severe winter weather caused chaos at airports across Europe with flights delayed or cancelled in Italy and Germany. Snow and ice caused problems on railways and roads. Forecasters predicted more snow and ice in the next 24 hours.

Eurostar trains were cancelled after 2,500 people were trapped for up to 16 hours on Saturday. A limited service resumed on Tuesday when a Eurostar train left London's St Pancras International station at 7.41am (0741 GMT) heading for Paris. An earlier train had set off in the other direction from Gare du Nord station in Paris with about 1,000 passengers still queuing for later trains.
