Robbers kill man after his car breaks down

In what appears to be a robbery bid on the busy Dhaula Kuan-Naraina road, a 45-year-old businessman was shot dead by unidentified assailants on Monday night, police said. Rajnish Arora was waiting for his brother near Brar Square after his car developed a snag.

He called his brother and asked him to come to the spot in another vehicle so that the car could be towed away.

When his brother reached the spot, he found Arora lying in a pool of blood and rushed him to a nearby hospital where doctors declared him brought dead.

Police said Arora suffered gunshot injuries in his stomach. It appears that the assailants tried to rob him and they might have shot him when he resisted. A country-made weapon was found at the spot. His mobile phone was missing but his wallet and the car was intact.

Train services disrupted after blast-like sound

Train services between Kharagpur and Jamshedpur were disrupted for two hours on Tuesday after the driver and guard of a goods train reported that they heard sound of a blast when the train was passing through the Maoist affected area in West Bengal's Paschim Medinipur district. However, no evidence of sabotage on the tracks was found.

Authorities were alarmed as the place where the blast-like sound was heard, is not too far from the site where the Jnaneswari Express was derailed on May 28, killing 150 people.

A thorough search of the tracks by security forces and the Railway's track maintenance staff was conducted, but nothing was found. Several passenger trains were detained and search operations were being conducted.

Train services in the region have been affected since the derailment of Jnaneswari Express as the running of passenger trains between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. in the Maoist affected has been suspended. While the night-running of passenger trains was to have resumed on Tuesday, it has been pushed back to June 26.

Six drugged & looted on Kalka Mail

The RPF at Burdwan station rescued six passengers, who were looted after being drugged through mango juice on the 2312 Down New Delhi-Howrah Kalka Mail, on Monday morning.

All six were admitted to Burdwan Medical College Hospital. The conditions of two are very serious. Most were still unconscious.

Though the scheduled time of the train at Burdwan station is 6 am, it arrived at 8.15 am. Fellow passengers had spotted the six lying on the floor and informed the RPF as soon as the

train chugged in. The victims were immediately taken to hospital in railway ambulances.

RPF personnel said all the passengers had been drugged after being trapped by a drug-and-loot gang at Mughalsarai station. The drug was apparently mixed with a popular mango drink.

Woman succumbs to swine flu

A 20-year-old woman Zoya Naaz, who tested positive for swine flu on June 14, died at Gandhi Hospital on Tuesday. The health officials also confirmed that two more persons have tested positive for swine flu. Doctors said that both the patients are stable and are recovering. Authorities maintain that swine flu cases in the State are 'sporadic' and there is no need to panic.

So far, since June, two persons, one at Visakhapatnam and the other in the State capital, have died after getting infected from swine flu. Doctors maintained that both the cases were brought at an 'extremely advanced stage' and despite best efforts, could not be saved.

Punjab farmers to hold protest rallies today

Agitated over erratic power supply and mounting electricity bills, farmers across Punjab will hold protests on Wednesday. To boycott the government's productivity bonus policy, as

recommended by the Sukhbir-Kalia committee, they also plan to burn electricity bills outside the offices of executive engineers.

Red terror now stalks Punjab

The Punjab Police has sought a special Central assistance of Rs 100 crore to build capacity to counter the 'growing' Maoist threat to the state. Unnerved by the increasing frequency of violent agitations, the state police has established a special intelligence wing to deal with Naxal-related issues and would now like to create special forces and equip them to deal with the emerging crisis.

Security agencies claim Maoists have entrenched themselves among several extreme-Left organisations which are taking on the state through a series of mass movements.

- Maoists entrenched in extreme-Left farmer organisations.
- They have established state and zonal committees.
- Malwa region comprising Ferozepur, Moga, Bathinda, Mansa and Sangrur districts worst affected.
- Nine "Maoists" arrested, two with weapons.

Rumours of terror attack triggers panic in Burail village

Rumours of a "terrorist attack" at Shalimar hotel located in the densely populated area of Burail village here triggered panic late last night with the residents claiming that they had seen armed youths riding on motorbikes coming from the hotel side.

A posse of armed personnel of the Chandigarh police, including its various wings and a CRPF team, reached the spot and cordoned off the area within minutes. The police have ruled out possibility of any terrorist attack after conducting the preliminary inquiries.

Shutdown in valley for 3rd day

A shutdown was observed across the Kashmir valley for the third consecutive day yesterday in protest against the death of a youth in police firing in the Noorbagh area of the city on Sunday.

Earlier, another youth of the area, who was injured in clashes on June 12, succumbed to his injuries in hospital after a week.

There were stray clashes in various parts of the city and elsewhere. While the government ordered an inquiry into the killing of the Noorbagh youth, Javed Ahmad Malla, allegedly in

firing by the CRPF, the APHC faction led by Syed Ali Shah Geelani had given a bandh call for today.

All shops and business establishments remained closed and traffic was off the roads. Strict restrictions were in force in the downtown area of Srinagar to prevent any untoward incidents.

43 militants killed in Pak's tribal region

At least 43 militants and four soldiers were killed in a clash in the Pakistani tribal region of

Orakzai near the Afghan border, a military spokesperson said Tuesday.

The confrontation started around 1 p.m. in the area of Upper Orakzai, the main base of the militants in the region, when a group comprising of 150 to 200 insurgents attacked a checkpost of the security forces.

According to the military version, the government forces responded to the attack immediately, resulting in the deaths of 43 attackers and four soldiers, and scores being injured on both sides.

Shutdown enforced to restore Nepal as Hindu state

Normal life in Nepal's western districts was disrupted today as a lesser known Hindu organisation enforced a two-day shut down in support of its demand to restore the country as a Hindu state.

Transport services, businesses, markets and educational institutions remained closed in western districts, including Dang, Salyan, Rukum, Rolpa and Pyuthan, for the past two days as Bishma Ekta Parishad enforced its shut down.

The group underlined its demand for restoring Nepal as a Hindu state.
