Fake drugs factory raided, 1 arrested

The special cell of the Delhi police has claimed to have busted an inter-state spurious drugs racket with the arrest of the kingpin Vikas Sharma, a resident of Ghaziabad.

The manufacturing unit was being run from the east Gokulpuri area. Large quantity of spurious drugs, packaging material and packing machine have been recovered from the unit.

According to the police, Vikas was manufacturing pain killers, Diclofenac and Vovran tablets of Novartis India Ltd Company. He used to manufacture spurious medicines under the guise of "chatpat golis" for children.

Man held for bomb scare

A 39-year-old man was arrested at Delhi airport on Tuesday for allegedly creating a hijack and bomb scare on a Mumbai-bound Jet Airways flight. He owns a jewellery shop in Gurgaon and was allegedly under the influence of liquor when he made the remarks.

The incident took place around 10-30 p.m. when a crew member overheard Naveen Kumar, who was travelling in a group of six, allegedly saying that he was carrying a bomb in his bag and would hijack the plane. The crew informed the pilot who in turn alerted the security staff of Jet Airways as well as the Central Industrial Security Force. The security personnel off loaded Naveen from the plane.

Five more persons died of swine flu on Wednesday even as 232 fresh cases were reported from across the country. Four persons died in Rajasthan while one died in Punjab, taking the overall casualties to 811.

Games work slows CP traffic

Frenzied construction work on subways and central verges and the restoration work on the Connaught Place facade seemed to have slowed down traffic in the area on Wednesday. With work having started on the subways in front of Regal Cinema and Shanker Market, the parking area on either side of the road was cordoned off leading to traffic congestion.

Ducting work for utilities also began in the Middle Circle leading to further chaos. Work on eight more subways will begin on December 25."

Traffic curbs for Muharram processions on December 28

The traffic police has announced specific road restrictions for the processions of Ashura for Muharram on December 28. The processions are scheduled to start from 3 pm from Zainabia Hall at Pakmodia Street and terminate at Rehamatabad Cemetery at Mazgaon.

Vehicular traffic will be diverted as follows:

North-bound traffic coming at Chakala Junction to proceed towards J J Junction via Mohammed Ali Road, will be diverted to P D'Mello Road via Carnac Bunder Bridge at Chakala Junction, half hour before the procession.

Traffic coming from Do Taki Junction towards J J Junction via Maullan Shaukat Ali Road will be diverted to Maulana Azad Road (South) and Duncan Road.

Traffic coming from Gol Deul along with Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Road will take right turn and move on Babu Khote Street.

Traffic coming at Pydhonie Junction from Abdul Rehman Street and Babu Khote Street will be diverted to Kalbadevi Road towards Vardhman Chowk.

All south-bound heavy goods vehicles and BEST Buses will be diverted to P D'Mello Road from Dadoji Kondeo Road Junction via Barrister Nath Pai Marg.

No vehicle will be allowed from Pydhonie Junction via Ibrahim Rehamtullah Road to Mohammed Ali Road. All heavy goods vehicles from Sofia Zuber Junction will be diverted to Nesbit Junction.

Two days a week, airport will be closed for 90 min

The Airports Authority of India (AAI) has decided to close the secondary runway for ten months, starting January 6, to raise the level of the runway with that of the extended portion across the Adyar river and to build a box-culvert-type bridge across the river. AAI will also extend the 2,035-metre secondary runway by 1,400 metres across the river as part of the expansion plan.

With the airport being able to use only one runway during the period, it will lead to a complete shutdown of the airport for one-and-a-half hours on Tuesdays and Saturdays for three months when maintenance work will take place on the main runway.

To undertake routine maintenance work, the main runway shall be closed on Tuesday and Saturday between 2.30pm and 4pm on January 9 and it will continue till March 2010.

Alert in city, cops warn against violence

Incensed with the Union government's apparent move to put the separate Telangana issue on the backburner, spontaneous protests broke out in various parts of the city late on Wednesday night with protesters damaging public property. Telangana tense, TRS calls for 48-hour shutdown. Alleging that the central government had betrayed the people of Telangana region, the Telangana Rashtra Samiti (TRS) Wednesday called for a 48-hour shutdown in the region and said all MPs and legislators irrespective of party affiliation would quit enmasse.

Chief minister K Rosaiah held an emergency meeting with director general of police (DGP) R R Girish Kumar and other senior officers to assess the situation. Police were told not to be lenient with anyone who tries to create law and order problems.

Prohibitory orders, including Section 144 of CrPC, were imposed in all Telangana districts. Hyderabad police commissioner B Prasada Rao issued orders imposing a ban on rallies and public meetings in the city from 6 am on Thursday to 6 am on Wednesday next.

Similar orders were issued by Cyberabad police commissioner S Prabhakar Reddy from Wednesday evening to January 1, 2010 morning.

High alert has been sounded in Telangana districts, specifically Hyderabad and Warangal regions.

4 more die of swine flu

Four more persons succumbed to swine flu here today, raising the death toll to 41. The number of H1N1 patients has risen to 293, with new cases being reported during the day. Of these, two patients are from Chandigarh, three from Haryana and one from HP.

Advisory:

How to be safe

- Use disposable tissues and cover the mouth and nose while coughing and sneezing. Dispose of the tissue carefully.
- There is always some virus on tabletops, telephones and computers. Try not to touch eyes, nose and mouth frequently.
- Washing and sanitising hands frequently is a very effective way of staying away from the infection. Alcohol-based gel or foam hand sanitisers are efficient in killing the virus.
- There is no restriction on food and drinks as swine flu is not a food-borne disease. It is transmitted by air-borne droplets from an infected person's sneeze or cough, or from germs on hands, or germ-laden surfaces.
- Wearing a well-fitted mask in public places is advisable. But only a mask can't save you from the disease.
- Drink loads of water and get enough sleep. Sleep deprivation is an unhealthy habit and could affect the immune system.
- Stay at least 3 ft away from people with respiratory infection.

If you already have it

- Confine yourself to a room and wear a mask.
- Keep yourself away from public places to avoid spreading the infection to others.
- Swine flu is most contagious in the initial five days. In the case of children, it can be contagious up to 10 days.

Maoists burn seven vehicles of a construction firm in Bihar

Armed Maoists set ablaze seven vehicles of a private road construction firm at Badiha village in Bihar's Rohtas district in the early hours yesterday.

Around 200 ultras stormed the office of S N P Infrastructure, confined its employees in a room and burnt the vehicles, the police said.

None of the employees were harmed during the operation, three road rollers, two pay loaders and a water tanker were among the vehicles burnt.

The private road construction firm was engaged in construction of a National Highway between Dehri-on-Sone and Tilauthu in Rohtas district. Patrolling was intensified after the incident and a combing operation launched.

Nepal Maoists end parliament siege

Nepal's Maoist party on Wednesday called off their siege to parliament, allowing the house to sit after six months. The former guerrillas also backed down on their dare to India to discuss the peace process instead of the ruling parties, saying their supremo Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda's statements to that effect Tuesday was only sarcasm.

The former guerrillas, who had kept the interim parliament virtually blockaded since the fall of their eight-month government in May, finally lifted the obstruction, saying they were changing tacks since a paralysed house gave ammunition to the ruling parties to try dissolve it in May, when the new constitution is due, and impose President's rule with the help of the Nepal Army.
