Businessman, family drugged by help

A domestic help, employed two weeks ago, allegedly drugged four members of a businessman’s family and walked away with cash and valuables worth more than Rs 10 lakh from their house in the upmarket and guarded Civil Lines area on Friday morning.

Wall-clock manufacturer Anil Maheswari (51), his wife Urmila (46), their son Mannu (29) and his wife Tanish (26) were found unconscious inside their flat in Ganpati apartments at 6, Alipur Road, opposite transport minister Arvinder Singh Lovely’s residence. Their domestic help, Shambhu (19), who was not verified, was found missing. Another servant, Ranjay, on whose recommendation the Maheshwaris had employed Shambhu, is also reportedly missing. This has led police to suspect that the two might have worked out an elaborate plan.

Burglary bid at Noida bank

Some unidentified men struck at the Central Bank of India branch in sector 22 in the wee hours of Friday and broke its shutter but were unable to flee with the cash.

"The bank is located on the ground floor of the building, while tenants live on the first floor. The bank was closed when the burglars struck. In the morning, when the bank staff came, they found the shutter broken. However, things were intact inside the bank and the cash chamber was undisturbed," said V.C. Tripathi, deputy superintendent of police.

First dengue death in Delhi

The national capital reported the first dengue death of the season with a child succumbing to the disease at the AIIMS, even as civic authorities expressed concern over detection of mosquito breeding in various offices and Commonwealth Games venues.

The city has reported 26 cases of the disease, he said. The Municipal Corporation of Delhi has expressed concern over detection of mosquito breeding in different offices and sports venues including Games Village, MTNL Exchange in Hauz Khas, G B Pant Hospital, DMRC Project in Saket, IG Stadium and R K Khanna Stadium.

Two more swine flu deaths, toll touches 5

Two more H1N1 influenza deaths were reported in the city on Friday taking the toll due to the disease to five this season. A 45-year-old woman died at Safdarjung Hospital while the other death was reported from a private hospital in South Delhi.

There has been a sudden spurt in the number of swine flu deaths in the city after the rains. Experts say that people should take extra precaution to check the spread of the disease. People should maintain hygiene and stay away from crowded places.

Driver, kin clean out godown of Rs 29 lakh

A 45-year-old driver hatched a plot to burgle his employer's godown in Borivli (E). The accused, Jayprakash Pandey, also roped in his brother-in-law Sunil Upadhyaya (26) for the crime.

Together, they decamped with Rs 29 lakh in cash. However, Pandey is fast running out of luck now that the officials of the Kasturba Marg police have nabbed Upadhyaya. Cops have also recovered Rs 28.85 lakh from Upadhyaya's house and are hunting for Pandey.

Pandey had been working for Mahesh Gala, a manufacturer of animal products and the owner of the godown, for the last 10 years. He knew the exact location of the vault as well as the period during which the security around in vault would be slack.

H1N1, malaria claim two lives in Mumbai

One more death due to rain-related illness was reported in the city. A 24-year-old man from Naigaon, Dadar area, succumbed to suspected malaria on Wednesday, taking the toll of malaria deaths this month to 11. He was admitted to the hospital the same day and his condition deteriorated rapidly, said a health official.

In the past 24 hours, civic and private hospitals in the city have seen 289 cases of fever, 98 cases of gastroenteritis, two of leptospirosis, three cases of dengue fever and 128 cases of malaria.

H1N1 virus too claimed one life in the city taking the toll to 14. The patient, a 19-year-old girl, from Ghatkopar succumbed to the virus on Thursday. She was admitted to hospital on the July 15.

Rs 20 lakh cash looted from Barrackpore bank

More than Rs 20 lakh was looted in a daring robbery at a nationalised bank in Barrackpore, North 24-Parganas on Friday afternoon.

Police are conducting massive raids to nab the gang. "We are trying our best to find the robbers," said North 24-Parganas SP Rahul Srivastav. All police stations in Barrackpore subdivision have been alerted.

It was round 1.45 pm when the six armed robbers entered the Bank Of Baroda's Anandapuri branch. The bank was full of customers at the time. The gang entered the bank in the guise of customers. They stood in the queue in front of the cash deposit counter. Before long, they put on masks and whipped out guns.

Quite a few daring robberies have taken place in North 24-Parganas in the recent past, including the Rs 25 lakh bank robbery at Baguiati last year and another at Madhyamgram. In most cases, the robbers have been found to have connections with Bihar and Jharkhand.

In a daring burglary at Madambakkam in the city suburbs on Friday afternoon, a youth wearing a helmet barged into a house on the pretext of asking for an address saying that he was a from a courier serive, tied up the woman in the house and made away with Rs 5 lakh in cash and 25 sovereigns of gold.

A youth rang the door bell around 2.30 p.m. and enquired about an address, saying he was from a courier service. When she told him that she was unwell and that that she did not know the address, he requested her for a glass of water.

When she went inside the house he followed her and slapped her following which she fainted. He then gagged her and tied her hands from behind and made away with the money and the jewellery.

Four succumb to swine flu

The H1N1 influenza claimed four more lives since Wednesday, taking the death toll in the city to 268.

According to state health officials, Katur Mehboob Shaikh (58), a resident of Koynanagar in Satara district, died at the Nobel Hospital here at 11 am on Thursday. Shaikh had been suffering from diabetes and chronic kidney disease.

Ramesh Mhasudage (45), a resident of Dehuroad, died at Aditya Birla Memorial Hospital around 8.35 pm on the same day. Mhasudage was a patient of diabetes and hypertension.

Reshma Sheetal Akhade (28), a resident of Kalewadi, died at the YCM Hospital in Pimpri at 11 pm on Wednesday. Akhade, who was six-and-a-half months pregnant, developed symptoms of the swine flu on July 16.

Another victim, Rasika Jaydrath Gaikwad (40), a resident of Kondhwa, succumbed to swine flu at the Sassoon Hospital at 6.30 am on Friday.

Malaria claimed 4 lives in Pune dist since June

As many as four people succumbed to malaria in Pune district, two of them in the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) limits, between June and July this year. However, when contacted, the PMC health department was found to be unaware of the two casualties — one from Koregaon Park and another from Lohianagar.

Sikh ultras may target Delhi Games

In an alert that, if true, would test the preparedness of our security agencies, intelligence units of Punjab Police have warned that foreign-based Sikh militants were planning to return to the state to engage in sabotage activities with the help of their local conduits. And that the Commonwealth Games, being held in October, too, could be on their radar.

The office of the Punjab Additional Director General of Police (Intelligence) had, in a note on May 28, informed all commissioners and district police chiefs that Sikh militant leaders were under pressure from their Pakistani masters to carry out sabotage activities and those prominent militants could return to the state.

The note mentioned that militant activities, including bomb blasts, could happen before the Commonwealth Games and that Khalistant Zindabad Force head Ranjit Singh Neeta had successfully smuggled 15 kg of RDX into Punjab. The report said one part of the consignment, which had been later recovered from Ferozepur, had been delivered in Rajpura and that two other consignments were likely to be delivered in Nawanshahr and Balachaur and in Sirsa district of Haryana.

Rain hits train services in state

Train services on Barmer-Munabao rail section were disrupted after heavy rain inundated railway tracks at several places in rural areas of Barmer on Friday. The Northern Western Railway had to cancel Barmer-Munabao-Barmer passenger train. The India-Pakistan friendship train -- Thar Express -- has been rescheduled by 24 hours.

Incessant rain continued for the second day on Friday in most parts of Rajasthan, disrupting normal life even as the authorities remained on high alert to tackle flood-like situation in several areas, especially parts of Ganganagar, Hanumangarh and Barmer.

Plan to disrupt Amarnath yatra foiled

The Army on Friday foiled a plan by militants to target the ongoing Amarnath yatra when it recovered a large quantity of arms and ammunition near the Jammu-Srinagar highway in the Banihal area of Ramban district.

During a search in the general area of Aramnakh in Banihal, the Army recovered a gunny bag hidden in a hollow of a tree around 7.30 a.m..

Detonators, mines seized- The troops recovered 34 detonators, 12 anti-personnel mines, nine RC IED boxes, 36 IED circuits, five RPG charges, 36 metres of safety fuse, 15 metres of cordex wire, one UBGL grenade, one hand grenade and 36 pika rounds and one radio set.

The militants' motive appeared to be to plant these explosives and IEDs to disrupt the ongoing yatra and vehicular movement on the national highway to aggravate the ongoing political crisis in the State.

Two employees dupe Panaji store of Rs 9 lakh, Panaji

Two employees of a lifestyle showroom in Panaji have allegedly misappropriated Rs 9 lakh in the last four months by not accounting for antique items they sold.

Panaji police have registered a case of misappropriation and criminal breach of trust against Siddhi Amonkar and Caitan Fernandes.

While Amonkar was the manager of Fusion Access Lifestyle Design, Panaji, Fernandes was the accountant.

Police said the duo have been absconding from work since Thursday and efforts to trace them at their homes in Marcel and Mopa respectively have proved futile.

Rs 15 lakh looted in twin robberies, Ranchi

Armed dacoits looted property worth Rs 10-15 lakh from the houses of a Ranchi University professor and a senior officer of a public sector oil company.

Ten dacoits barged into the residence of Mangal Tigga, who is posted in Rajasthan as a deputy sales manager in an oil company, around 3 am after breaking the grille of the window on the first floor.

The dacoits, who were in their 20s, were armed with traditional weapons and firearms. They first tied the family members and then pasted surgical tapes on their mouth. The way they interacted with each other suggested that they were locals and aware of the area.

The colony is one of the posh localities in the city and situated at a distance of less than a km from the local police station. Many senior state government officials have their houses in the colony.

6.9-magnitude earthquake hits southern Philippines

A strong but deep 6.9-magnitude quake hit the southern Philippines early on Saturday, seismologists said, but there were no immediate reports of damage and no tsunami warning was issued.

The underwater quake struck at a depth of 603 kilometres (375 miles), 107 kilometres from Cotabato, in Mindanao, the US Geological Survey said.

The Hawaii-based Pacific Tsunami Warning Center said no destructive tsunami was generated by the quake, which hit at 6:08 am (2208 GMT Friday).
