### **Petrol pumps to stay shut today**

If motorists have not stocked petrol they may have to face trouble today (Monday). All service stations in the capital will remain shut on Mondays starting today, as dealers are protesting against the increase in VAT on diesel from 12.5% to 20%.

Dealers are saying that diesel sales have dipped by more than 40% in the capital because of the increase in VAT rate. On Sunday, huge banners that said "Monday closed" was put up at all outlets in the city.

Delhi government had in April this year increased the VAT on diesel.

### **Robbers try to loot cash from Timarpur ATM**

In yet another attempt to loot cash from an ATM, robbers made an abortive bid to break open an SBI ATM at Timarpur in north Delhi around 6.15am on Sunday. This is the second such incident in two weeks in Delhi and the seventh in NCR in the past six months.

A case of attempted theft was lodged at Timarpur police station. Since, there was no guard outside the ATM and the area was deserted, the robbers chose the early morning hours to strike. Police are trying to convince the bank authorities to install CCTV camera at the ATM.

### **Paragliders spark off 'terror' alarm in Thane**

Security agencies in the state went into overdrive after a 'terror' alert near Tarapur Atomic Power Station at Palghar in Thane on Saturday. However, after four hours of rigorous checks, the alert turned out to be a case of mistaken identity.

The drama started when a captain of a private helicopter informed the Air Traffic Control (ATC) that he had seen "suspected terrorists" land near the power station. No sooner than the ATC receive the call, it alerted the Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS), National Investigation Agency, the navy and air force.

The area around the power station was cordoned off. However, after a thorough investigation, the security agencies found that the six "terrorists" were, in fact, members of an adventure sports club who were paragliding in the area, said an officer.

## **Fake cops use 'nakabandi' to loot women in Mumbai**

A brazen gang of thieves posing as policemen are having the run of South Mumbai, looting gullible women of their valuables.

According to victims, the gang makes it seem like there is a nakabandi happening nearby, pretends to help elderly women, diverts their attention and then escapes with their jewellery.

Police say the gang operates only in the mornings. There have been at least five such cases in South Mumbai in recent times, two of which happened within the span of a few minutes on Thursday.

#### **Maoists attack CRPF patrol**

Maoists again attacked a CRPF patrol in Jangalmahal area of West Midnapore district in West Bengal on Saturday prior to the gunning down of two CPM cadres at nearby Jhargram town. One CRPF personnel was also injured.

The bodies were found lying on the main thoroughfare to Jamshedpur yesterday. Maoist posters and literature were also strewn around, with one poster carrying the warning of “more such attacks if the joint action force was not withdrawn and innocent villagers of Lalgarh-Jangalmahal area not released”.

The Maoists fired several rounds at the CRPF personnel who were escorting the Tata Steel express passing through Jangalmahal. In the firing, a CRPF jawan and a passenger received bullet injuries. The Maoists also blasted landmines at several places in Jhargra. They also burnt down the local CPM office.

### **2 men held for stealing lakhs via net banking**

The CB-CID's cyber crime wing on Saturday arrested two Mumbai men for withdrawing Rs 26.55 lakh and Rs 75,510 respectively through fraudulent means from two separate accounts of two Tamil Nadu-based persons using net banking. The arrested, S Vinayak Shivaji Khandare (20) and I Ibrahim Ansari (25), have been brought to Chennai and remanded in judicial custody at the Puzhal prison.

On November 5 2009, Tiruchi-based businessman S Salahudeen from Tiruchi noticed an illegal transaction from his account through net banking and alerted the police and bank officials, the police said. The transaction was found to be done by couriers. Cyber cell officials found involvement of eight couriers in Chennai, Mumbai, Kolkata, Bangalore and Sangli in Maharashtra.

The couriers would withdraw the amount and deposit it in accounts given by hackers after deducting their 8-10% commission.

#### **Maoists kill 5 in Sheohar**

Within 48 hours of triggering blasts that led to derailment and burning of 13 oil tanker wagons of a goods train near Pipra railway station in Bihar's East Champaran district, suspected Maoists numbering around 150 raided Ramban village, 25 km from the state's Sheohar district HQ, late on Friday night and killed five people.

While Siya Ram Rai (55), Bhagwan Rai (50), Bholu Rai (21) and Ma-nohar Thakur (20) were shot dead, 25-year-old Visheshwar Thakur's throat was slit. The marauders also set ablaze at least 25 houses and seven shops and escaped leaving behind Maoist literature in the village.

#### **Traders' leader shot dead in Sopore**

Militants on Sunday shot dead a prominent businessman in the north Kashmir town of Sopore. The Traders' Federation has called a protest strike against the killing on Monday.

Police sources told The Hindu that Federation's Sopore president Ghulam Nabi Khan was shot point blank while travelling in a horse-cart in the main chowk.

Mr. Khan was taken to a hospital, but declared dead on arrival. The militants, the sources said, managed to escape.

The killing resulted in panic in the town and the markets soon closed. Police rushed to the spot and cordoned off the area.

#### **IOC airlifts fuel to crisis-hit Manipur**

The Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) has resorted to airlifting of petrol, diesel and kerosene to Imphal (Manipur) from here to tide over the acute fuel crisis in the landlocked state due to indefinite blockade at the arterial National Highway 39.

Manipur government spokesman and Cabinet minister N Biren Singh today informed that it would take some more time for restoration of normal supply of petroleum fuels in the state. The IOC has requisitioned an IL76 aircraft of Indian Air Force (IAF) to airlift fuel to Imphal from Assam.

#### **State of emergency in Jamaican capital as cops fight armed gangs**

Jamaican authorities said they were putting Kingston and surrounding areas under a state of emergency as police fought armed gangs trying to block the arrest of a reputed gang leader

sought for possible extradition to the United States.

A police officer and a civilian were wounded by gunfire in street clashes and three police stations came under attack in the city, police said. One police station was set on fire after police abandoned it having run out of bullets.

Prime Minister Bruce Golding held an emergency meeting with his cabinet yesterday and issued a State of Emergency for Kingston and St. Andrew, took effect at 6:00 pm (local time) in this Caribbean nation of about 2.8 million. The government said the state of emergency will last for at least a month.

### **5.5-magnitude earthquake strikes western Pacific: USGS**

A moderate 5.5 magnitude quake struck deep under the sea near Vanuatu in the western Pacific today, the US Geological Survey said.

No tsunami warning was immediately issued. The USGS said the quake struck at 7:19 am (0149 IST) with an epicentre 56 kilometres from capital Port-Vila at a depth of 129 kilometres.

An 8.0-magnitude earthquake and huge tsunami crashed into Samoa, American Samoa and Tonga in September last year, wiping out villages and resorts and killing 184 people.
