Dengue crosses 1,000-mark in Delhi

Even as officials of the Delhi health department said that the spread of dengue would come down, with the temperatures in the season coming below 15 degrees Celsius, the number of people affected by the disease has touched the 1,000-mark.

Still the number of cases confirmed as of date has been less than last year's 1,200 at this time.

Yesterday, the national Capital reported 10 fresh cases of the vector-borne disease, and with this the cumulative tally of the disease has reached 1,009.

Circular bus service to start in Dwarka today

The much-awaited project of Dwarka circular bus service and smart card fare will start from tomorrow after the inauguration by the Delhi Chief Minister, Sheila Dikshit. She will also

inaugurate a bus depot in Sector 8 Dwarka subcity.

Sources said that in the beginning, eight air-conditioned buses will be on Dwarka roads, fitted with smart card reading and global positioning systems. Each bus is supposed to cover 25 km.

The sources said that passengers will pay Rs 2.5 for the first four kilometers and Rs 2 for each additional distance of two kilometers. The ticket will not be according to the DTC slab of Rs 5, Rs 10 and Rs 15. The buses will be equipped with the smart card reading system.

This is being introduced for the first time in Delhi. If it is successful, the smart card system will be implemented in Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) buses and later in private buses being plied for local transportation.

The same card will be used in Metro also. The transport department will have automatic system of counting that will separate the smart card used in DTC, private buses and metro rail and collection will be distributed accordingly.

The Bhayander police recently busted a gang, including three ICICI Bank employees and a courier boy, for withdrawing money from customers' accounts by forging their signatures on the cheques.

The gang's modus operandi was to target ICICI cheque books that are sent by courier to the customers. The delivery boy would unseal the packet containing the cheque book and tear a leaf or two from it. The cheque would then be repacked and delivered to the customer, who would be unaware of the missing leaves from the cheque book.

Builder critical after being shot at in office bldg

Pune-based builder Nikhil Rane (41) was shot in the back by an unidentified man on the

staircase of Anant Chambers on J M Road, where his office is situated, around 12.15 pm on Monday.

Rane, proprietor of Rane Constructions and son of prominent lawyer R G Rane, was admitted to the Sancheti hospital, where his condition was stated to be 'critical'.

Sancheti hospital chairman Dr Parag Sancheti said the bullet got lodged in Rane's neck through his back. The police would record Rane's statement later.

Posing as policemen, these thieves target senior citizens

Four citizens were robbed of their gold ornaments worth Rs 1.15 lakh in separate incidents in the city on Sunday morning. The suspects, posing as policemen, managed to flee with the jewellery.

The first incident took place at Kothrud around 7.15 am, when 63-year-old Usha Anil Gokhale of Erandwane was on her way home after her morning walk. Three men on a motorcycle stopped near her. One of them told her that they were policemen and had come to the neighbourhood to enquire about a murder. He asked her to remove her gold ornaments for safety. The men then fled with the jewellery, worth Rs 35,000.

The crime branch is also conducting a parallel investigation as such incidents are on the rise. So far this year, around 35 such incidents have been reported in the city. Investigations also reveal that the suspects usually target senior citizens on their morning walk. The crime branch of Pune has appealed to senior citizens to remain alert.

Power board cashier robbed of Rs 18 lakh

In a daring robbery, three miscreants took away Rs 18 lakh at gunpoint from the office of the electricity board in Industrial Area, Phase II, here yesterday.

According to Superintendent of Police Manish Chaudhary, the robbery took place around 5.45 pm when Anil Kumar, cashier of the electricity board, was going towards the office of SDO SK Bali with a bag containing the day's collection.

He was intercepted by two youths with muffled faces. One of them carrying a pistol snatched the bag and the two escaped in a white Maruti Zen driven by their third accomplice.

No security arrangements were made at the board office. Officials said cash was collected at the office and deposited with the SDO every day. The amount was taken to the bank the next morning.

Advisory:

- Make bank deposits on a routine basis utilizing an armored service from a premier service provider.
- If this is not possible, take a second person along.
- Vary your banking routine. Carry cash in a variety of ways - a lunch sack, attaché case, flight bag, picket, etc. Money bags are pretty obvious.
- Vary the times and routes you use to go to the bank.
- Make deposits as often as possible, never less than one a day.
- Avoid displaying large sums of money in public.
- If you notice someone following you when you're driving, head for the nearest busy, brightly lit area. Write down a description of the vehicle and call 100.

Total shutdown in Katra

The ever busy Katra town, the base camp of Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, yesterday observed a total shutdown against “arbitrary” decision of the state government to modify the Master Plan and shift the proposed bus stand to a new site.

According to locals, the town observed a complete shutdown for the first time in the history. Pilgrims of Mata Vaishno Devi bore the brunt because most of the dhabas and eating points were closed and devotees were seen roaming from one place to another in search of food.

In response to the strike call by the Katra Development Centric Committee (KDCC), all shops, business establishments remained closed in Katra. Locals joined by shopkeepers and traders held a protest in the town. The protest started from the main bazaar and passed through various areas before culminating at the main chowk near the bus stand.

The protesters were shouting slogans against Deputy Chief Minister Tara Chand, who is holding the charge of the Urban Development Department, and the Deputy Commissioner, Reasi. They also burnt an effigy of Tara Chand. The protest turned into a rally and was addressed by the KDCC leaders.

Pakistani forces attack Taliban in NW, kill 22

Pakistani security forces backed by tanks and artillery attacked Taliban positions in the northwest of the country, killing 22 militants.

The attack was part of a broader campaign against militants in Pakistan, a regional ally which Washington sees as key to defeating the Taliban in Afghanistan.

Fighting erupted on Sunday night after an assault on militants in the village of Shahukhel, which borders the Taliban stronghold of Orakzai tribal region.
