Govt issues terror alert ahead of SAARC meeting

The nation has been put on high alert following intelligence inputs that Pakistan-based terrorists, who are against any thaw in Indo-Pak relations, may strike in a desperate bid to derail the SAARC meeting in Islamabad.

The advisory issued by Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) asked all states to increased vigil and take precautionary measures to ensure security as Pakistan-based outfits, who are opposed to any dialogue between India and Pakistan, may strike at public places.

The move came considering the fact that terrorists struck at a public place in Pune just days before the February 25 Foreign Secretary-level talks between India and Pakistan.

67% travellers find Delhi unsafe

Three months before the Commonwealth Games, Delhi's ratings continue to plummet as a city unsafe for women. An overwhelming number of Indian travellers have given Delhi the thumbs down in terms of safety.

Of the total number of travellers polled, 67% felt that Delhi was the most unsafe city in India followed by Goa (17%) and Mumbai (9%).

The Tripadvisor survey, that interviewed 5,000 respondents, said that Patna (5%) and Noida (4%) were the other unsafe cities.

The capital city has become notorious for some of the most heinous crimes in the past few years. Crimes against women, incidents of foreigners being cheated from transit points like airports and railway stations have only strengthened this reputation. Goa has earned the ignominy this year of being unsafe thanks to the increasing number of assault cases against foreign tourists.

Man loses Rs 10.7 lakh in online 'Nigerian fraud'

Cyber Crime investigators busted a 'Nigerian fraud' gang which duped a city-based retired bank employee to the tune of Rs 10.7 lakh in the name of providing a job to his son.

On March 6, Alok Raj Saxena, a retired bank employee from the city, lodged a complaint with the Cyber Crime cell of the CID, stating that on the pretext of providing a job to his son in Emirates Airlines, con men duped him to the tune of Rs 10.7 lakh.

Cops crack BHEL robbery case

Police cracked the BHEL robbery case and arrested a 32-year-old person belonging to an inter-state robbery gang from UP on Thursday. A country-made firearm was seized from his possession.

On May 31, miscreants opened fire at Ramesh, treasurer of Peddamma temple at BHEL, and snatched away his bag containing Rs 1.5 lakh cash.

At about 5.30 am, during a routine vehicle checking at LIC office in RC Puram, police nabbed a two-wheeler rider, Malik Riyaz Pasha, 32, of Uttar Pradesh, who was in possession of a country-made 12 bore weapon and three live rounds.

During interrogation, according to Medak SP Sunder Kumar Das, Pasha confessed that he along with Anirudh Kumar Verma, Sunil Chouhan, Mohammed Muqem Mallik and Mohammed Fahim, all from Uttar Pradesh, had committed the BHEL robbery.

He reportedly also told police that the gang had committed four such offences in UP and five similar ones in the city.

The gang used to observe the movements of people withdrawing huge amounts from banks and strike in case the victims left their vehicle unattended leaving the cash inside.

One more swine flu death

A 27-year-old woman, who had tested positive for swine flu on Wednesday, died in the early hours of Thursday at Gandhi Hospital. She had been sent here by doctors of a private hospital in Mahbubnagar from where she hailed. This is the third swine flu death in the last one week.

Earlier this week, a 20-year-old pregnant woman and a 30-year-old Vizag resident succumbed to the virus. The latest victim was brought to the city on June 21 night and was

admitted at Yashoda Hospital, Malakpet. She was shifted to Gandhi Hospital after she tested positive for swine flu and her condition deteriorated.

Inter-state gang of car thieves busted

The police on Thursday claimed to have busted an inter-state gang of vehicle lifters operating in the region with the arrest of two gang members and seized three vehicles, including two Alto cars and a Maruti 800, from their possession.

The police also recovered fake registration certificates, forged stamps of district transport officer (DTO), Yamunanagar, duplicate keys and other equipment like a sharp blade from the accused.

A senior police official stated that after stealing the cars, the gang members used to prepare fake registration certificates on their names and sell them to unsuspecting persons on cheap

prices.

State gears up to meet swine flu challenge

With monsoons round the corner in the state, Gujarat's health machinery has started gearing up for the third onslaught of swine flu cases across major cities and towns in the state. Maharashtra and the southern region, mainly Kerala, have already started witnessing swine flu cases owing to dipping temperatures and increasing humidity twin conditions that are most favourable for H1N1 virus to become active.

In Ahmedabad at both Civil Hospital, VS Hospital isolation wards have been set up. General hospitals, both government and private, have been asked to maintain special wards and beds for isolation purposes. A press note from the state health department claims that adequate number of masks and medicines have been stocked up to face the situation.

<p>Law & Order</p> <p>Parcel bomb kills head of security at Greek police HQ</p> <p>A parcel bomb on Thursday killed the head of security at the Greek ministry of citizen protection, which is in charge of the police and also houses its headquarters.</p> <p>The explosion, which police described as "very strong", occurred only metres away from the office of the minister, Michalis Chryssohoidis, who was unharmed despite being present at the time.</p> <p>The blast killed head of security Georges Vassilakis, 52, in his seventh-floor office. The bombing marks the first time in Greece that an attack has targeted the heart of the country's security apparatus, and was carried out despite the heavy police presence at the ministry's entrance.</p>
