**Cane farmers to intensify stir**

Farmers, simmering with anger against the proposed rise in sugarcane prices, have decided to stop trains, traffic and UP buses on the highways today.

They said they would stop the supply of 450 cusecs of water from Murad Nagar to Delhi. The sugarcane farmers have planned to block vehicles on roads and train in western UP to express their anger at the Centre, as it has not yet solved the problem of sugarcane prices that had hit them hard. **Delhi records 92 H1N1 flu cases**

As the influenza A (H1N1) grip is becoming stronger with winters fast nearing, the Delhi health department has decided to allow 200-bedded Sri Action Balaji Hospital in the city to treat patients suffering from H1N1 flu.

The decision has been taken to avert shortage of beds at the hospital, as the city yesterday reported 92 H1N1 cases, taking the cumulative tally to 4511, said Dr Debasis Bhattacharya,

the city nodal officer for H1N1 and dengue.

### Woman robbed in Salt Lake

A goon snatched a necklace from a middle-aged woman in Salt Lake early on Wednesday in full view of her neighbours, who were so afraid of an attack that they did not move an inch to help her.

Around 6.30 am, Usha Chaudhury (52) was out on her morning walk, along with around seven of her neighbours, in Salt Lake's CG Block. Suddenly, a youth blocked her way and snatched her gold necklace in a flash. He started shouting that he had a knife, warning Usha's companions of coming to her aid. It worked like a charm: the youth had no difficulty escaping. He simply jumped over the boundary wall of CG Park and was gone in a moment. Usha later lodged a complaint with Bidhannagar East police.

### Bomb scare at airport

Heightened alert on the eve of first anniversary of the 26/11 terror attacks led to a bomb scare at Kolkata airport on Wednesday evening.

A CISF jawan summoned the bomb squad without preliminary checks after spotting an unattended bag in the arrival area.

Santosh Ghosh, who had arrived on a Jet Airways flight from Bangkok, had stepped into the booth for the mandatory health check and had left the bag at the doorstep.

#### **Dial 1093 to report trouble on coast**

This day last year, ten young men with heavy ammunition got down at a fishing village in Mumbai in a dingy and held the city under seige for nearly 60 hours. Waking up to the reality of maritime terrorism, Tamil Nadu police was among the first to strengthen its public intelligence network along the state's 1,076 km-long coastline.

On Wednesday, the state added another service to its network, opening a toll-free number (1093) to encourage people to call up the Coastal Security Group to pass on information about any suspicious movement in the coastal area.

#### **Seven arrested for forging documents**

Seven persons, said to be experts in the use of computers and involved in forging land-related documents, were arrested by the police at their house in MGR Nagar on Wednesday. Over 80 government seals, 50 soverigns of jewellery and a bunch of documents were recovered from the house. The gang had some days ago assaulted a sub-inspector who went to investigate the case.

#### **A(H1N1) panic resurfaces**

After a two-month lull, panic over the spread of A(H1N1) resurfaced on Thursday. At least 46 persons, including 35 students from Oxford College of Nursing, queued up at the Rajiv

Gandhi Institute of Chest Diseases (RGICD) for screening when one of their classmates tested positive for the disease on Wednesday.

Although doctors screened all these people clinically, they drew throat and nasal swabs of only seven persons. “The rest have been put on Tamiflu. There is no need to panic now. We have sent the swabs for tests at NIMHANS and the reports are awaited on Thursday. It can be alarming if all the samples test positive. Otherwise, there is no need to worry,” said Shashidhar Buggi, RGICD Director. He said people were worried over the WHO warning of a second wave of A(H1N1) in a more virulent form.

#### **3 ICICI Bank staff held on fraud charge**

Three phone banking wing employees of the ICICI Bank landed behind the bars for allegedly embezzling nearly Rs. 39 lakh by fraudulently transferring reward points of the bank’s credit card customers to their credit cards.

An amount of Rs. 2.48 lakh was seized from the arrested persons, K. Phani Pavan Kumar, 23, M. Gurunath Babu, 28, and T. Krupa Rao, 30. The Cyber Crime Cell Inspector, T.S. Uma Maheswara Rao, investigating the case, said the trio had access to the bank’s online records and registers, including the reward points awarded to its credit card customers

#### **Email threat to blast Assembly**

An anonymous email has threatened to blast the State Assembly, JNTUH building apart from physically eliminating Technical Education Minister Mopidevi Venkataramana and JNTUH Vice-Chancellor D.N. Reddy, if students detained for want of attendance were not given relief immediately.

The mail was sent to the JNTUH V-C on his official email ID on Tuesday from a fictitious ID created using the JNTUH website. The sender stated that shortage of attendance was due to floods, swine flu and dengue that hit the State in the last two months and the university should immediately promote them. University officials feel that some disgruntled students not allowed to take examinations for shortage of attendance might have sent the mail.

### **Businessman shot at Sector 20 office**

Five unidentified persons shot a businessman at his office in Sector 20 here this evening and reportedly fled in a car parked at a busy market.

The police said the deceased had been identified as Harjinder Singh Dhillon (in his mid-30s), a resident of Phase VII, Mohali. He had been divorced and was living with his mother. His neighbour said he was also running a transport business, besides a telecom franchise in Sector 20.

The police suspected that a dispute over the finance of a car could be the reason behind the murder.

## 5 held for credit card fraud

The local police yesterday arrested five people, including a resident of Coimbatore, for fraudulently misusing credit cards of foreign tourists by imprinting their CVC numbers (card security codes) on forged cards. Officials investigating the matter said whenever a cardholder used his or her card at a store or a hotel the suspects, in connivance with shopkeepers and hotel staff, retrieved their CVC numbers and used them to make purchases on fake credit cards.

After copying down the security code of a credit card they imprinted it onto another credit card that they then used for conducting fraudulent transactions.

- Sign on the card immediately on receipt, always sign the card with a ballpoint pen. Unsigned cards are invitations for misuse.
- Please check your credit report very frequently
- For reasons of security, DO keep with you a photocopy of the front and reverse of your debit card.
- DO report your lost or stolen card immediately.
- Do not leave your card unattended

#### **Two held with hand grenade**

The police has arrested two overground workers of the Laskhar-e-Toiba and seized arms and ammunition.

Though the police is tight-lipped over the arrests, sources disclosed that following interception of messages between militant groups raids were conducted in a remote village of Thathri tehsil of Doda district and two persons were arrested.

Two persons were arrested and a hand grenade and 12 rounds of Ak-47 were seized. One of the arrested has been identified as Sajjad Ahmed and the case is being investigated. They disclosed the names of some youths who had been providing logistic support to militants.

**Dhaka begins mutiny trial of border guards**

Nine troopers of Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) were on Wednesday produced before a special court for their role in a bloody mutiny in February that left 74 people dead.

The nine are among those who took the cue from thousands of their colleagues who rebelled at the BDR headquarters here, drew weapons without permission and misbehaved with senior officers, the court was told.

The 74 killed included 67 Bangladesh Army officers on deputation to BDR, the country's border force. Also killed was BDR director general Major General Shakil Ahmed.
