### Fresh terror alert

Intelligence agencies on Friday sounded a fresh terror alert in Kolkata, Mumbai and Delhi, following reports that terrorists had sneaked into these cities. Security has been beefed up at key installations.

**Security beef-ups:** the heightened security measures are put in place in order to avert any terror strike by the terrorists. Such arrangements could cause delay & checking at various check points. It is advised to leave early for destinations in order to mitigate delays.

### Highway robbers' gang smashed, five nabbed

Five persons, allegedly involved in a spate of highway robberies in outer Delhi, were arrested here and looted goods seized from them.

The arrested persons have been identified as Ashok Kumar (48), Ekant Bansal (28), Sikander Kumar (27), Rafiq (29) and Irshad Ali (30), they said.

One foreign-make pistol, five live cartridges, a looted truck with 193 quintals of rice and a stolen motorcycle were recovered from their possession.

They were operating in Outer district of the capital. With their arrest, six cases of highway robbery and vehicle theft have been solved.

The five were arrested from Rohini Sector-3 yesterday after a trap was laid on a tip-off that they would come to the spot to dispose of a looted truck. However, their another accomplice managed to escape taking advantage of darkness.

### CBI arrests MD of software company for piracy

The CBI on Friday arrested the managing director of a software firm for allegedly carrying out piracy of Microsoft products. The accused, Kamlesh Jha, who heads a Dwarka-based firm, K K Solutions, was a gold certified partner of Microsoft, the complainant in the case.

It was alleged in the complaint that the accused along with his associates was involved in high-end counterfeiting and piracy of Microsoft software products by various means. It was also alleged in the complaint that the suspect was obtaining the counterfeited CDs, packaging material and fake Certification of Authenticity (COAs) from China and after obtaining the genuine product key number, by tempering the genuine products, was putting it on the fake COAs and selling it in the market.

### **Strike hits textile business in Karur**

The two-day shutters down strike by the handloom textile producers in Karur district has come at time that could hardly be termed the best or the worst.

Coming in the midst of the handloom week that is being celebrated between December 21 and 27, the strike has sought to highlight the difficulties the sector was facing and the need to redress the grievances.

However, the handloom weavers have a different story to tell and press for continued action against erring textile units that divert varieties meant for process under handloom to power loom to make some quick bucks.

Over 500 units owing allegiance to the Karur District Weaving and Knitting Factory Owners'

Association resorted to the strike on Tuesday and Wednesday that left handloom textiles worth Rs. 15 crore getting piled up for want of activity in the units. It is estimated that over 8,000 skilled workers would have lost jobs on the two days.

Former managing director (MD) of a sugar factory in Sangli was allegedly kidnapped by some unidentified people near Parvati on December 19 for ransom.

The Dattawadi police have identified the victim as Madhukar Narayan Khurjekar (67), a resident of Sahakarnagar. A complaint was lodged by his daughter Anupa Khurjekar (27) with the Dattawadi police station on Thursday (December 24).

On December 19, Khurjekar had gone to his sister's place at Maharashtra Housing colony in Parvati. In the afternoon, he left her house around 3 pm citing some work. He was missing since then. On Thursday he contacted his daughter and told her that some people have kidnapped him and are demanding Rs 5 lakh to release him.

### **42nd swine flu death in Chandigarh, 6 new cases**

With a middle-aged woman succumbing to the H1N1 virus, the number of deaths from swine flu in Chandigarh has risen to 42, officials said Friday. The city also reported six new cases. The woman died at the Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) here.

So far over 700 patients have been screened for swine flu in hospitals here, of which nearly 300 tested positive. In December alone, nearly 300 positive cases of swine flu and 32 deaths were reported here.

Panthers Party calls for Jammu bandh

Different political groups have stepped up campaign against the recommendations of the Working Group on Centre-State relations.

While the BJP has been devising a strategy to launch a mass movement on this issue, the Jammu and Kashmir National Panthers Party (JKNPP) has given a call for Jammu bandh on Monday to lodge protest against the recommendations.

JKNPP chief Bhim Singh, while addressing a meeting of party workers, exhorted the people to shun their political differences and oppose the report, which according to him, was prepared to fulfill the agenda of the ruling National Conference.

Terming the report as biased which deserved to be dumped without any further discussion, Bhim Singh appealed to the people, particularly the youth and students, to share the responsibilities for demonstrating the anger of the people of Jammu and Ladakh in particular by a peaceful bandh on Monday.

### Militant hideout busted in Poonch

The Army troops late last night busted a hideout of militants near the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district and recovered arms and ammunitions, police officials said. As per the details available, the troops of 52 Rashtriya Rifles last night conducted a search operation in Janta Morh-Sabzian area located near the LoC and busted a hideout.

An army official said it had recovered a UBG launcher, a rifle, a Rocket Projectile Grenade, ten magazines, 160 rounds of Pika gun, 203 rounds of AK rifle and two grenades from the place.

#### **Maoists warn village heads against police action, Jharkhand**

Maoists have started threatening gram pradhans or village heads and rural police (chowkidars) with dire consequences if any member of the CPI(Maoist) outfit is arrested or if police raid their hideouts.

CPI(Maoist) through posters put up at several villages under Shikaripara block of Dumka district, have threatened that village heads and chowkidars would be killed under the above-mentioned circumstances for being police informers.

On Friday morning, villagers woke up to see Maoist posters at various places in the three villages of Haripur, Maluti and Pinargarhia, which are considered to be Maoist strongholds. Although police removed these posters on being informed, it has sparked large-scale terror among the common people, especially village heads and chowkidars who have proved to be a soft target for the outfit.

#### **Rape bid on 2 Russian girls in Goa**

Two Russian girls have alleged that a taxi driver attempted to rape them last night at Anjuna beach while they were returning from a Christmas party.

Both girls in their complaint lodged at Anjuna police station said they had to jump out of the taxi to escape from his clutches and hide in the woods for almost five hours waiting for the dawn.

Olga Tyurina (29) and Irina Babayan (25) were returning from a discotheque at Saligao in

North Goa after attending Christmas party.

Both the girls, who know little English, have told police that an unidentified taxi driver, whom they had hired to drop them back to their hotel at Baga, took them to Anjuna beach.

The taxi driver who initially had agreed for Rs 300 took them by another road pretending to avoid police picketing at 2:20 am. He stopped at Anjuna beach and demanded Rs 1,000 instead, they said. When we protested, he tried to grab us. We were horrified and jumped out of the taxi and took shelter in the woods nearby.

The girls said they were in the jungle for almost five hours and left from there only in the morning. The police complaint was lodged this morning at 07.00.

**Advisory:** Crimes against woman in Goa especially against woman. Have increased over the past few months. It is advisable to visit beaches & Hotels in group and not to strike up conversation/ relationships with strangers.

### **Two more H1N1 positive cases reported in city, Surat**

The total number of swine flu positive cases till date in the city has risen to 106 with the detection of two more H1N1 cases in the past 36 hours, Twelve more suspected cases were reported till Friday and a dozen blood samples were sent to Ahmedabad, out of which four have tested positive. At present, 30 patients are under treatment at Rajkot Civil Hospital and other private hospitals.

**Man tries to bomb US plane in attempted terror attack**

A Nigerian man with reported links to al-Qaida tried to blow up a US airliner with a new type of explosive device Friday before being tackled by passengers in what officials said was an attempted Christmas Day terror attack.

Some travellers aboard Northwest Airlines Flight 253 from Amsterdam to Detroit panicked but others sprang into action, overwhelming the man as he lit the device, which reportedly made a popping sound and burst into flames.

The suspect's clothes caught fire and he suffered serious burn wounds. The incident could have been "catastrophic," US Representative Peter King told US media.
