### **All India Bandh to Protest Price Hike: Bharat Bandh on 27th April, 2010**

A Bharat Bandh, called by 13 non-UPA parties and non-NDA parties is going to be observed all over India. The parties, who have organized this All India Bandh include Lok Janshakti Party (LJP), Samajwadi Party (SP), Communist Party of India (CPI), Communist Party of India (M), Rashtriya Samajwadi Party (RSP), Biju Janata Dal, Indian National Lok Dal, JD(S), Revolutionary Socialist Party, AIADMK and the Forward Bloc.

The Bharat Bandh has been organized to voice against rocketing price of daily commodities and petroleum products.

Meanwhile, BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party) has taken an ambiguous stand regarding the bandh. On April 26, 2010 BJP has said that neither they will oppose nor will they support the Bharat Bandh.

### **Bomb-making material missing**

The missing 50 tonnes of deadly potassium chloride from Pilkhua was highlighted in an intelligence department report. The district administration is learnt to have ordered a probe into the matter. The material is used for making bombs and other explosives.

The missing dangerous material has caused concern in the local official circles here as the police, the administration and local intelligence agencies have no idea as to where the potassium chloride has gone. Ten traders in Hapur have the licence to sell the material used in explosives.

It is learnt that about three months ago the Bihar police had raided the establishments of Pilkhua chemical traders. At that time it was suspected that the deadly chemical had been supplied to Naxalites.

According to intelligence agencies, such traders have sold off 50 tonnes of potassium chloride to some people.

The sale of potassium chloride and sodium chloride has of late shown an increasing trend. The Bihar police had raided Pilkhua traders three months ago on the basis of information supplied by Naxalites, it is believed.

### **Cyber mafia out to steal your identity**

Phising, online fraud, and hacking are passe;. Internet users will soon face an identity theft.

People would have no idea that Trojans in their computers are sending confidential data to a host server that controls the virus. Bank account details or passwords that can enable a person to make banking transactions will be passed on to host servers. The same information can also be sold to criminals who can misuse it for online shopping where checks are minimal.

Once the cyber mafia gets hold of such information, they could carry out financial transactions in various countries. The victim would know of it only when the bank informs him/her about the transactions. The victim would be affected in other ways too. Despite filing a complaint, the bank would send his/her name to the credit information bureau if he/she fails to clear dues.

The mafia would not stop at this. They would sell the identity information for a mere five to ten dollars. A person may be forced to change his identity details in banks and other places to get rid of the cyber mafia.

### **Man robs employer on first day of work in Mumbai**

When the proprietor of a travel company placed a walk-in advertisement in a city tabloid, he did not realise that ad would prove detrimental to his business.

In need of an office assistant, Rudy D'Sa, owner of Travels and More, had placed an advertisement in a newspaper. Eight applicants appeared for the interview.

D'Sa then selected 35-year-old Nausir S Sanjaywala who joined the firm on April 25.

On the first day at work, a customer came to book airline tickets and paid him Rs13,401. At that time, all staff of the firm, except Nausir and another office assistant, was out for lunch.

When the office assistant also left for lunch, Nausir pocketed the cash and a mobile phone belonging to the owner. When the assistant returned, Nausir asked him for directions to the toilet (which was located outside the premises). He went out and never returned.

### **Virtual shutdown in Maoist-hit areas**

Another supporter of the CPI(M) was killed by suspected Maoists in Paschim Medinipur district even as a 48-hour bandh called by the Left-wing extremists resulted in a virtual shutdown in the Jangalmahal area of the State on Monday.

A CPI (M) supporter was abducted from his home late on Sunday night and his bullet-ridden body was found on the outskirts of the village in the Lalgarh thana area on Monday morning.

Meanwhile the 48-hour bandh in West Bengal, Bihar and Jharkhand, saw a virtual shutdown in the Maoist-affected areas in Paschim Medinipur, Bankura and Purulia districts. The bandh was called by Maoists demanding that four members of the CPI(Maoist) arrested recently be produced in court.

### Steps taken to tackle general strike

District Collectors, Superintendents of Police and Police Commissioners in the cities have been directed to provide adequate security in view of the general strike called by the Opposition parties on Tuesday to protest against price rise.

Power plants, electrical sub stations, government buildings, information centres, flyovers, oil depots and railway bridges should be provided adequate security.

Similarly, security should be provided to educational institutions, State and Central Government offices for normal functioning.

In order to operate normal bus services in the State, the district administration and the police have been directed to take necessary action. Police patrolling should be taken up to ensure proper distribution of water and milk supply. Adequate protection should be provided to the High Court and Subordinate Courts in the State. Security should also be provided to all places of worship.

### Traffic restrictions-

In view of a protest convention being organised by various organisations headed by the former Prime Minister, H.D. Deve Gowda, on Tuesday at the Palace Grounds here, the traffic police have imposed traffic restrictions to facilitate smooth vehicular flow.

Over 10,000 to 15,000 persons — Janata Dal (S) workers and public — are expected arrive in BMTC buses and private transports for the convention to be held between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

VIP parking has been arranged at Gayatri Vihar parking lot (from Gayatri Vihar Gate); entrance for Gayatri Vihar will be through Gayatri Vihar Gate (only cars and two-wheelers); at Palace Grounds (Amanullah Gate Grounds) through Amanullah Gate (only for buses).

The police have asked the people to avoid using the main roads mainly Bellary Road, Jayamahal Road, Sir C.V. Raman Road from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Instead, they can take alternative routes. Additional police personnel will be deputed at the venue.

### Police intensify checks, patrolling

Hyderabad police have undertaken massive checking and patrolling and increased surveillance on suspects, gearing up for the third anniversary of bomb explosion inside Mecca Masjid.

Terrorists detonated Improvised Explosive Device inside Mecca Masjid on May 18, 2007 leaving nine persons dead. Five more died when police opened fire to contain the violence that erupted after the explosion.

Not willing to take any chances on the security front as the third anniversary of the bomb explosion was nearing, the city police top brass decided to enhance security measures at all strategic points. Security issue became crucial for the third anniversary of the terror attack as terrorists fired at a police constable and a home guard, both whom were posted as part of a police picket at Falaknuma, leaving the latter dead on May 18 last, the second anniversary of the terror attack on Mecca Masjid.

Police have intensified checking vehicles, lodges and possible hideouts of terror suspects. Based on the inputs of State and Central Intelligence wings, the city police have prepared a list of terror sleeper cells operating in Hyderabad and surrounding localities.

### Rs. 1.7 lakh stolen by attention diversion gang

A five-member gang took away Rs. 1.7 lakh from a private company employee by distracting his attention soon after he withdrew money from a bank at Shapurnagar in Jeedimetla on

Monday. Srisailam, 27, supervisor of Sri Joshila Enterprises, withdrew Rs. 1.8 lakh from Adarsh Bank at Shapurnagar and stepped out to start his bike around 1 p.m. He kept Rs. 10,000 in his trousers' pocket and the remaining amount inside the fuel tank cover of the two-wheeler.

As he was about to start the bike, a stranger approached him and asked if the four currency notes of Rs. 10 lying beside the vehicles were his. "Srisailam parked the vehicle, collected the notes and sat on the bike only to realise the amount in the fuel tank cover was stolen.

#### Thieves decamp with cash, jewellery

Jewellery and cash were stolen from the house of Army official at Hill View Enclave, Dhakoli, on Sunday when he was out of town.

The theft took place when he returned from his journey. The thieves decamped with 23 tola of gold, 12 tola of silver and cash Rs 10,000.

The owner of the house Bihari Lal, who works at Station Headquarter, Chandi Mandir, said they left around 4.30 am on April 24, along with family members to pay obeisance at Naina Devi and other religious places.

He returned at 4.30 pm on Sunday to find that the door was bolted from inside. When they entered the house through the terrace, they found that the house was ransacked.

The owner claimed that gold and silver jewellery and a few cloth pieces were missing. Cash worth Rs 10,000 was also missing from the almirah.

#### Man robbed off car

A man was looted of his car and belongings when he gave a lift to two unidentified persons in his car. After boarding his car, the miscreants offered him sweet lassi mixed with intoxicants, which made him unconscious. They then threw him in the bushes on the roadside and drove away with all his belongings.

Victim Parminder Singh, resident of nearby Mehmoodpur village, is carrying out sale purchase business of vehicles at Mohali. Last evening, when he was returning from Mohali in his Indica Car No. CH-04B-2595, two unidentified persons signaled him for a lift and he obliged them. He gave them lift near the SYL canal, Chuni.

They offered him "sweet lassi" containing intoxicants and after consuming he fell unconscious. They then threw him in the bushes near Duphera village on the Bassi Kharar road and drove away with his belongings.

**Militants kill CRPF jawan**

A CRPF jawan was shot dead by militants at a busy market place in Budgam district of central Kashmir yesterday evening, triggering panic among people.

Head constable Mohar Singh of the 176th Battalion of the CRPF was on patrol duty when the ultras shot him from point blank range at Magam market, about 25 km from here on the Srinagar-Gulmarg road, official sources said.

The incident occurred around 6.30 pm when there was heavy rush in the market, they said. Mohar Singh, who received a bullet in the head, died instantly in the attack, which sparked panic among the people, the sources said.

Meanwhile, at least two jawans were injured in an encounter with militants near the LoC in the Tangdhar area near the LoC in Kupwara district of north Kashmir.

## **British tourist robbed at Colva, GOA**

Colva police on Monday registered an offence against two unknown persons on charges of robbing a British national of foreign currency and her debit card.

## **Tight security for Bharat bandh in Krishnagiri, Dharmapuri- Tamil Nadu**

Security has been tightened in Krishnagiri and Dharmapuri districts during the Opposition-sponsored Bharat bandh on April 27 to condemn the Union Government's failure to contain the spiralling price rise and reduction of petroleum prices.

To ensure safety during the bandh, police picketing would be posted at all the vital installations such as major water bodies, railway stations, TV stations, power grid at Shoolagiri, five TNSSTC bus depots, bus stands, crowded places like markets and shopping malls.

Patrolling would be intensified along the rail line between Hosur and Dharmapuri and Jolarpettai to Morappur. In addition, police bandobust would be provided to the two private explosive godowns at Hosur and Arasampatti.

If anybody found blocking the road, obstructing the railway traffic and forcing the shops and offices to close would be arrested, Mr. Babu warned.

Besides this, there would be extra vigilance at all the check posts bordering Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka. The district police have been fully geared up to meet any eventuality during the bandh. Police picketings have been posted at all the vital installations, state and central government offices and banks.

**Maoists call indefinite Nepal bandh from May 2**

Four years after a "People's Movement" swept King Gyanendra off his throne and abolished monarchy in the world's only Hindu kingdom, yet another "People's Movement" will start from May Day, followed by an indefinite bandh, the former Maoist guerrillas announced on Monday. The public announcement of an indefinite strike is aimed at piling pressure on Prime Minister Madhav Kumar Nepal to quit.

**US drone strike kills 8 in Pakistan**

A US missile attack destroyed a suspected Taliban-linked hideout in Pakistan's northwest tribal belt on Monday and killed at least eight militants.

It was the second such strike in 48 hours, as the United States pursues Taliban fighters and other al-Qaida-linked groups that have carved out strongholds in the rugged North Waziristan district on the Afghan border.

Three missiles struck a compound mid-morning in the Khushali Toorkhel area, about 25 kilometres (15 miles) east of Miranshah, North Waziristan's main town.
